

#### To one and all in the Cathedral Parish and Sacred Heart Parish Communities:

Now that August is with us, schools are beginning again throughout the districts in the Coastal Bend, so the summer months are slowly beginning to come to a close. In a matter of weeks, it will be Labor Day and the unofficial end of the summer season will be upon us. Remarks like, "Are you ready for some football!" will once again become frequent, and the fall will be upon us. Those of us who can remember, probably recall the first line of a rather famous Jim Croce song: "If I could save time in a bottle..." Will we ever come to a point when we would want to save time in a bottle, or anywhere else, for that matter? Where does the time go?

On the morning of August 16th, following morning Mass at the Cathedral, I will be on my way to Oklahoma City for a brief meeting of the Masters of Ceremonies for the Southwestern Lieutenancy of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. I have been a Knight and Knight Commander in this papal order since 1995, and I have had duties with the Lieutenancy as, firstly, the Assistant Ecclesiastical Master of Ceremonies, and as, for many years, the Ecclesiastical Master of Ceremonies. Because of this responsibility, I will be away from the Diocese, hence the Cathedral and Sacred Heart, for an annual meeting in the fall of each year, a weekend Spring meeting each year, and a briefer meeting, usually in August, of each year. After that meeting, I will then be on my way to attend the National Council of Catholic Women Convention, which this year will be in Salt Lake City, Utah. I have duties at the Convention as I am a Spiritual Advisor for a group within the National Council. I am also the Spiritual Advisor for the Province of Galveston-Houston and for the Diocese of Corpus Christi. It is always my honor to be "blessed among women" at the Convention each year, and I look forward to being with the women in the Beehive State this year.

I will be away for two weeks in total and will return to the Cathedral and Sacred Heart on Wednesday evening, August 30th. You are in good hands while I am away and do be assured that you will be remembered in prayer. I take very seriously my responsibility to keep the two communities in prayer! The two meetings will last seven days, and the rest of the time will be vacation.

Also, a reminder that on Tuesday, August 15th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which is a holy day of obligation in the United States. The Mass schedule is as follows:
