For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission is the North American (USA and Canada) Final Document for the 2021-2024 Synod. The first part of the worldwide Synod talks will be held in Rome throughout the month of October, 2023. This Document, which was prepared by the Most Reverend Raymond Poisson, the President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, and a former Rector of Corpus Christi Cathedral, the Most Reverend Daniel E. Flores, the Chair of the USCCB Committee on Doctrine, is the response of the Church in Canada and the United States to the request of the Holy Father, Pope Francis, to embrace synodality as the way forward of the Church in the modern world. It is a testament to the work of the Holy Spirit within the communion of the baptized. In the Introduction of this document, it is noted that through the discussions leading up to this document, it was shared and heard that by our common baptism, we are each called by God and gifted by God with dignity. There are stresses evident within our communion, but as we become more and more missionary disciples, the more we will address these challenges in an appropriate manner. Our baptismal dignity is inseparable from our baptismal responsibility, which sends us forth on mission. As one attendee noted, Many times, we focus on the negative and forget the joy; the Spirit we experience in our core is to be a missionary.

In brief, the document indicates that the delegates expressed a desire for formation that is life-long and offered to all members of the communion of the baptized, whatever their vocation. Not only formation in the fundamental teachings of our faith, but also formation for synodality, co-responsibility, welcoming, and going to the peripheries. This enables us to present the beauty of our faith, rather than a list of rules. Deeper formation is central to our ability to live out our baptismal dignity and strengthen communion with Christ and with each other.

The document also notes that synodality is a great source of hope for renewing and strengthening communion. In becoming more synodal, the Church, would create safe places where people can ask their real questions about Church teaching without judgement or punishment. This formation would not only help the development of deeper bonds of communion within the Church, but also would be a stimulus for evangelization and mission. Proper formation is the key to embracing our baptismal call to go out on mission. This responsibility is not just for clergy, but it is for each baptized person. The responsibility to know and live the teachings of our Catholic faith, including the Church's social teaching, flows from our baptism, but it is not always easy and requires intentional formation. It's not so much about the "what" as it is about the "how."

In conclusion, as was pointed out in the process, the Synodal process has not been perfect, but it has been good. Being able to share was good, rather than just being talked to us all we continue to be the Church that God is calling us to be. God bless us everyone...
