Words of Faith: Letters from Father Fr. James

October is Respect Life Month in the Church within the United States. It provides us an opportunity to be mindful of the fact that all life is sacred because it comes from God. Although there has been much in the news lately about artificial intelligence and wasn't there a sheep once with the name of "Daisy" that made national headlines, etc. life is a creation of God. I had no control over what womb I was formed in, what mother and father conceived me, and where I was born. Many try to take control over life, but God is in charge. Because of that, all life is sacred, it is a gift, and therefore, should be treated with dignity and respect.

In our country, half a century of nationwide, legal abortion came to an end last year; however, that was not an end. There is still much to be done in our efforts to protect human life not only in its earliest of stages, but in all its stages. Respect Life is ongoing, because life continues until it takes its last breath. Human trafficking; physical and emotional abuse outside, and even within, families; any form of violence; racism; prejudice; etc.: there are many ways that can be found all around us in which Life that has been given by God is not respected, is mistreated, and not treated with the dignity that the teaching of the Roman Catholic Church makes very clear is proper to every creation of God.

The theme for this year's Respect Life Month as given to us from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops Committee on Pro-Life Activities is Radical Solidarity. The word "radical" means: relating to or affecting the fundamental nature of something; far-reaching or thorough. Therefore, a radical solidarity would be a thorough unity; a mutual, complete support. As Catholics, the Committee is reminding us that we need to be completely united as human persons in respecting each other. Whether it is a Mom who is in need, a person who has been abused, a person in the face of violence, prejudice, or in so many other ways, our faith calls us to stand in solidarity with God's gift of life and respect all life.

The Gospels put us in touch with Jesus who interacted with anyone and everyone. Jesus didn't seem to care what the person had done but saw before Him a creation of God who had a need. Jesus would address that need and help the individual. As His followers, we are called to live out the faith given to us in the same way.

As Paul's first letter to Timothy reminds us: Beloved: teach and urge these things. Whoever teaches something different and does not agree with the sound words of our Lord Jesus Christ and the religious teaching is conceited, understanding nothing, and has a morbid disposition for arguments and verbal disputes...Instead, pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Compete well for the faith. Lay hold of eternal life, to which you were called... see 1 Timothy 6: 2c-12.

So, let us enter this Respect Life Month with a radical solidarity with one another. We are a community who witness to the Kingdom of God, which is in our midst. Let us witness to that and nothing else. Blessings to each and every one of you as we enter this Respect Life Month.
