
ALL SOULS PRAYER

DEDICATION OF THE BASILICAS OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL [Parish Feast Day – November 18th]



The Feast of the Dedication of the Basilicas of Saints Peter and Paul is a spiritual journey to two holy tombs, that of St. Peter and that of St. Paul in Rome. These two basilicas, marking the place of each apostle's martyrdom, are the common heritage and glory of Christendom.

The ancient basilica of Saint Peter stood, like the present one, on the hill of Rome called in Latin, Mons Vaticanus, at the northwestern extremity of the city, on the right bank of the Tiber.

The tomb of Saint Paul is on the Ostian Way, at the southern extremity of the city.

Thus, the city is laid out between the two pillars of the Church, the two Apostles who from Rome made the Word of God resound throughout the entire world.



STANDING AT THE ALTAR

As a priest and a chaplain, I see a lot of wild things, some tragic and some beautiful. I can stand on my own talents, on my own loves, on the Army creed-but if I do, I will misunderstand. But if I take my stand at the altar of love, I see all things through Christ. Because of the Eucharist, we can always stand with Jesus, especially in the most exceptional and unexpected circumstances. I recently experienced this lesson in a poignant fashion during an important and dangerous nighttime training operation, packed with unanticipated and life-threatening moments. Read the rest of Fr. Mike's testimony, a perfect reflection as we celebrate Veteran's Day in the United States.

"The early Church understood the mystery of the Eucharist as underlying the expression 'peace'. And by leading us to himself, introducing us into the communion of his Body, by introducing us into the same sphere of his love, by feeding us with the same Bread, he also gives us to one another as brothers and sisters.
