## A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

### LITURGICAL CHANGES

You may have noticed a few different changes during the Liturgy of the Word during Mass. The Church asks that in between readings there be a sacred pause "by means of these, under the action of the Holy Spirit, the Word of God may be grasped by the heart and a response through prayer may be prepared." (GIRM 56). Thus, you may notice pauses between all the readings. Furthermore, the responsorial psalm is now sung all the way through when we have a cantor. Paragraph 36 in the GIRM states: "The psalmist or cantor of the psalm sings the verses of the psalm." I believe this is to highlight the fact that traditionally the psalms were written to music and sung even during the time of our Lord.

## THE "O ANTIPHONS" OF ADVENT

The Roman Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the *Magnificat* canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17th - 23rd. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah.

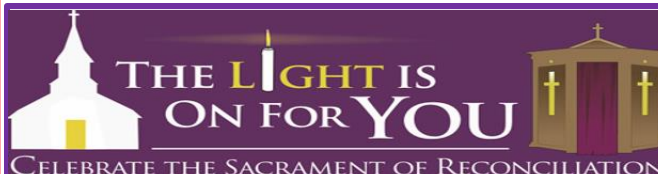
