

#### **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**



#### **SAINT VALENTINE; Feast Day, February 14th**

Legend states that Valentine, along with St. Marius, aided the Christian martyrs during the Claudian persecution. In addition to his other edicts, Claudius, believing that single men made better soldiers than married men, had also issued a decree forbidding marriage.

Valentine defied this decree and urged young lovers to come to him in secret so that he could join them in the sacrament of matrimony. Eventually he was discovered by the Emperor who promptly had Valentine arrested and brought before him. After failing to convert him to Roman paganism, Claudius condemned St. Valentine to death.

#### ASH WEDNESDAY MASS SCHEDULE

On Ash Wednesday, February 14th, the distribution of ashes will take place within the celebration of the Holy Mass.

> Ash Wednesday Mass times are as follows: 12:00PM, 6:00PM

There will be NO 6:30am Mass on Ash Wednesday.

#### ASH WEDNESDAY is an OBLIGATORY day of **FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

~USCCB Pastoral Statement of Penance & Abstinence

Lent is the liturgical season that is ordered to preparing for the celebration of Easter. The faithful recall their Baptism and do penance.

The forty days of Lent run from Ash Wednesday up to but excluding the Mass of the Lord's Supper on the evening of Holy Thursday. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday make up the liturgical season of the Triduum, the final three days before Easter.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent (including Good Friday) are days of abstinence.




#### **WAY OF THE CROSS FRIDAY'S OF LENT**

#### **VIDEO: REST IN PEACE, BISHOP DORSONVILLE**

Bishop Mario Dorsonville of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, passed away on January 19, 2024. He had a deep love for the Eucharist and the priesthood, and he will be sorely missed. #### AMERICAN EUCHARISTIC WITNESSES: SERVANT OF GOD JULIA GREELEY, THE EUCHARISTIC ANGEL OF DENVER

Servant of God Julia Greeley was born into slavery on the farm of Samuel Brice Caldwell, twelve miles west of Hannibal, Missouri. The sole memory we have of Julia's life at Caldwell's farm is her shattered right eye, a violent reminder of the slave master's whip that blinded her as a young girl. After her emancipation, Julia performed domestic services for the Robinson family in St. Louis. She moved to Denver in mid-winter 1878 to work for the family of Mrs. Robinson's sister, Julia Gilpin. We know she developed a close friendship with Mrs. Gilpin, a devout Catholic credited by Julia herself as having "given me my faith"... Read the rest of Fr. 


