




My sister and brother-in-law **Josephine & Israel Affia**, attended and left with great impressions about our parish. We wish them a safe journey back to Nigeria.

This Sunday, October 2nd, is Respect Life Sunday. **Please join me** and be a witness to life at the 29th Annual National Life Chain which will begin in front of St. Mary's at 2:30PM and will last for an hour. During his visit to the United States, Pope Francis talked about the "sacredness of each human person" and explained that "loving life means always taking care of the other...and respecting his transcendent dignity". This message is particularly relevant to us especially at the wake of immune disregards to life in the womb and or constant gun violence prevalent in our society today. I pray that the message of respect for human life, from womb to tomb may resonate with us regardless of the ideologies of the world.

In commemoration of St. Francis of Assisi, lover of animals, whose feast day is this Tuesday, October 4th we will have our annual blessing of animals this Sunday, October 2nd at 12:30PM.

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples that faith as tiny as a mustard seed can achieve great things. We measure faith by faithfulness and obedience to what God commands. The faithful disciple of Jesus never finishes serving. He/she never finishes looking for more opportunities to share God's love and be immersed in it. On that note, I thank you for being part of our Forward in Faith, Hope and Love: Serving God and Neighbor, our increased offertory program. With this commitment you demonstrate the response of a good disciple. May the Lord keep you and your families, and also increase your blessings.

I will be in Rockford from Monday to Friday this week for priests' annual canonical retreat. Please look into the bulletin for schedules of Masses and communion services.

For more spiritual insight on increase of faith, please read below, the commentary of St. Augustine, it is very insightful and to the point on how we increase our faith. Happy reading.

If you had faith! Commentary by St. Augustine of Hippo

Reading the Holy Gospel nourishes in us the habit of prayer, builds up our faith, and disposes us to trust in the Lord rather than in ourselves. What more powerful incentive to prayer could be proposed to us than the parable of the unjust judge?

An unprincipled man, without fear of God or regard for other people, that judge nevertheless ended by granting the widow's petition. No kindly sentiment moved him to do so; he was rather worn down by her pestering.

Now if a man can grant a request even when it is odious to him to be asked, how can we be refused by the one who urges us to ask?

We must believe, then, in order to pray

Having persuaded us, therefore, by a comparison of opposites that "we ought always to pray and never lose heart," the Lord goes on to put the question: "Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, do you think he will find faith on earth?"

Where there is no faith, there is no prayer. Who would pray for something he did not believe in? So when the blessed apostle exhorts us to pray he begins by declaring: "Whoever calls on the name of the Lord will be saved;" but to show that faith is the source of prayer and the stream will not flow if its springs are dried up, he continues: "But how can people call on him in whom they do not believe?"

We must believe, then, in order to pray; and we must ask God that the faith enabling us to pray may not fail. Faith gives rise to prayer, and this prayer obtains an increase of faith. Faith, I say, gives rise to prayer, and is in turn strengthened by prayer. It was to guard against their faith failing in times of temptation that the Lord told his disciples: "Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation."

"Watch," he says; "and pray that you may not enter into temptation." What does it mean to enter into temptation? It means to turn one's back on faith. Temptation grows stronger in proportion as faith weakens, and becomes weaker in proportion as faith grows strong.

To convince you, beloved, that he was speaking of the weakening and loss of faith when he told his disciples to watch and pray that they might not enter into temptation, the Lord said in this same passage of the Gospel: "This night Satan has demanded to sift you like wheat; but I have prayed for you, Peter, that your faith may not fail." Is the protector to pray, while the person in danger has no need to do so?

But in asking whether the Son of Man would find faith on earth at his coming, the Lord was speaking of perfect faith. That kind of faith is indeed hardly to be found on earth. Look at God's Church: it is full of people. Who would come here if faith were non-existent? But who would not move mountains if that faith were present in full measure?

Mark the apostles: they would never have left everything they possessed and spurned worldly ambition to follow the Lord unless their faith had been great; and yet that faith of theirs could not have been perfect, they would not have asked the Lord to increase it.

St. Patrick Rosary Ministry

Mission: Facilitate the opportunity for our parish family to pray the Rosary together before every weekend Mass



It's true. Families that pray together, stay together! The **Rosary** is a prayer of meditation, a prayer for peace and a prayer for the family. When members of a family pray together they regain the ability to communicate, to show solidarity, to forgive one another and to love.

Members of this ministry commit to come early once a month to lead the recitation of the Holy Rosary before the weekend Masses. Assignments are one time per month; the same week/Mass time each month. For example, if you regularly go to 9am Mass you would be assigned to that Mass either the 1st week of every month, the 2nd week of every month etc. On Saturdays the Rosary begins at 3:20PM and on Sunday 30 minutes before each Mass time.

Training is provided. If you can read, you can lead! We have a binder in the sacristy that makes it very easy. There are a few things you need to know about the lights and sound system but it is very simple. Be not afraid. We have a great group of ministry members and we ask that you consider joining them in this very important ministry. Here is what a few of them had to say as to why they lead the Rosary. "Saying the Rosary with Mary is like going through the family album with your mom." "We like to lead the rosary as a witness to praying as a married couple." "Community power of prayer and grace." "I get a full feeling when I hear our voices raised together." "Praying the Rosary in community. Praying in community helps me realize that our Catholic Faith is not just "my faith" but it becomes "our faith". Now that I have a grandson, when I see him, I like to pray the Rosary with him now." "Praying the Rosary or as some suggest praying "The Gospels" has brought me closer to Jesus through Our Blessed Mother. What a great feeling when I/we can meditate on the Gospels and can put us right in that space and time. We can get all our senses in tune. We can visualize the surrounding, hear the sounds, smell the area and the animals etc." "All of the promises of Mary to Christians who recite the Rosary."

Jubilee Year of Mercy Twenty-Seventh Sunday Ordinary Time

"How long, O LORD?" (Habakkuk 1:2). With Habakkuk's question echoing across twenty-six hundred years, Respect Life Sunday finds all life claiming sanctuary in our hearts: unborn infant, senior citizen, immigrant and refugee, imprisoned and addicted, people burdened with illness and disabilities of body, mind, or spirit. Even Mother Earth, Pope Francis notes in Laudato Si', bears scars of disrespect for the life she nurtures and sustains. Life is still threatened, as in Habakkuk's day, with ruin and misery, "destruction and violence, . . . strife and clamorous discord" (see 1:3). Since our efforts so often seem ineffective, we "unprofitable servants" cry with the apostles, "Increase our faith" (Luke 17:10, 5). But Jesus' reply might be paraphrased, "Not quantity--quality." Next weekend marks the Jubilee Year of Mercy's special devotion to Mary, whose willingness to shelter Jesus in her womb and stand at the foot of his cross bears witness to the qualities that Jesus expects our faith to manifest: the willingness to trust, to risk, and to dare to speak up for life. --Peter Scagnelli, Copyright (c) J. 

Sometimes is might taste sweet, other times is might be bitter, but God always gives us what is truly nourishing for our soul. So keep eating one bite at a time and know that God will never let you go hungry.

Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set.
