



Dear Friends in Christ.

We had a great turn out at our First Sunday free pancake breakfast last weekend, the first for 2017. You may see a few photos on the page to the right and many more on our parish website. We are very grateful to the Evangelization Committee (along with help from the Knights of Columbus) who hosted this month. We look forward to having you join us next month – Sunday, March 5th – when the Music Ministry will host.

Next Saturday, February 18th at 10:00AM our chief shepherd Bishop David Malloy will celebrate the Eucharist and confer the Sacrament of Confirmation on 60 candidates from St. Patrick, St Mary and St.

Joseph. Their names will appear in next weekend's bulletin. Please pray for them that this sacrament should fill them with the <u>special gifts of the Holy Spirit</u>: **Counsel** (Right Judgment), **Courage** (Fortitude), **Fear of the Lord** (Wonder and Awe), **Knowledge**, **Piety** (Reverence), **Understanding and Wisdom**. We pray that they may bear <u>the fruits of the Holy Spirit</u>: **Love**, **joy**, **peace**, **patience**, **kindness**, **goodness**, **faithfulness**, **gentleness and self-control**, and to remain faithful members of God's family in the Church.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church #1285, "Baptism, the Eucharist, and the sacrament of Confirmation together constitute the "sacraments of Christian initiation," whose unity must be safeguarded. It must be explained to the faithful that the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. For "by the sacrament of Confirmation, [the baptized] are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed."

We welcome Bishop Malloy as we pray for our candidates and our parish family. Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your Divine love. Send forth your spirit and they shall be created. And you will renew the face of the earth, Amen.

Homily from St. John Chrysostom on this Weekend's Gospel

Such was said to your ancestors, but I am speaking to you. Christ gave his life for you, and do you hold a grudge against your fellow servant? How then can you approach the table of peace? Your Master did not refuse to undergo every kind of suffering for you, and will you not even forgo your anger? Why is this, when love is the root, the wellspring and the mother of every blessing? He has offered me an outrageous insult, you say. He has wronged me times without number, he has endangered my life. Well, what is that? He has not yet crucified you as the Jewish elders crucified the Lord. If you refuse to forgive your neighbor's offense, your heavenly Father will not forgive your sins either. What does your conscience say when you repeat the words: "Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name," and the rest?

Christ went so far as to offer his blood for the salvation of those who shed it. What could you do that would equal that? If you refuse to forgive your enemy you harm not him but yourself. You have indeed harmed him frequently in this present life, but you have earned for yourself eternal punishment on the day of judgment. There is no one God detests and repudiates more than the person who bears a grudge, whose heart is filled with anger, whose soul is seething with rage.

Listen to the Lord's words: "If you are bringing your gift to the altar, and there remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and first go and be reconciled. Then come and offer your gift." What do you mean? Am I really to leave my gift, my offering there? Yes, he says, because this sacrifice is offered in order that you may live in peace with your neighbor. If then the attainment of peace with your neighbor is the object of the sacrifice and you fail to make peace, even if you share in the sacrifice your lack of peace will make this sharing fruitless. Before all else therefore make peace, for the sake of which the sacrifice is offered. Then you will really benefit from it.

The reason the Son of God came into the world was to reconcile the human race with the Father. As Paul says: "Now he has reconciled all things to himself, destroying enmity in himself by the cross." Consequently, as well as coming himself to make peace he also calls us blessed if we do the same, and shares his title with us. "Blessed are the peacemakers, he says, for they shall be called children of God."

So as far as a human being can, you must do what Christ the Son of God did, and become a promoter of peace both for yourself and for your neighbor. Christ calls the peacemaker a child of God. The only good deed he mentions as essential at the time of sacrifice is reconciliation with one's brother or sister. This shows that of all the virtues the most important is love. St. Patrick Catholic Church Parish Registration - Do You Need to Register?

ARE YOU: (1) New to the parish; (2) Moving back; (3) Just Married; (4) Attending mass but never officially registered? (4) Even if you grew up in St. Patrick, you (as an adult) need to register independent from your parents.

Please do not take your church registration for granted. Attending Mass is not enough; there must be an official record of your membership in the Parish. Parish registration is essential for many reasons. It becomes important when you or your family members are receiving the Sacraments - First Communion, Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage. Registration is also required for those wishing to become a Baptism or Confirmation sponsor. In addition, becoming a member of a parish gives one the identity of belonging to a family—the parish family of St. Patrick Catholic Church.

If you are not officially registered with the parish, please do so as soon as possible. All you have to do is contact the parish office at 815-385-0025 or stop in during office hours and request a registration packet. Registration packets are also available on the parish website at www.stpatrickmchenry.org—just click on Registration/Moving at the top of the screen.

Sacraments

Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism. To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This class is offered on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born.

Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting <u>at least 6 months</u> <u>prior to any requested marriage date</u>. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church. Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.
