

Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy Fourth of July, Independence Day, celebration this week.

With national and family reunions, fireworks, games, parades, picnics, food, etc. we shall once again commemorate our adoption of the Declaration of Independence and freedom from the British Empire in 1776 when Thirteen American colonies regarded themselves as a new nation, the United States of America.

Historically the legal separation took place on July 2nd with the voting on the resolution of independence proposed by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia about a month earlier. With the vote, the Continental Congress worked on the actual statements of the Declaration prepared by a *Committee of Five* headed by Thomas Jefferson. After debates and much deliberation they revised and ratified the statements on July 4th. Meanwhile John Adams had already put on paper to his wife, Abigail, these immortal words:

The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more.


Both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, signers to the Declaration, later became presidents of the United States and died on the same day, July 4, 1826, the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the declaration. Later James Monroe, our third president and one of the founding fathers, became the third in a row to die on the 4th of July in the year 1831.

Independence was won by numerous sacrifices of lives and providential intervention. More importantly it was, in the words of the founding fathers, "solemn acts of devotion to Almighty God." Again in the opening statements of the Declaration we read, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

Let us pray that as we celebrate our independence, America may always remain faithful to the intentions of the founding fathers, that is, the Solemn Act of Devotedness to Almighty God, the creator, who endows us with all that we have.

# The Sacraments

#### The Sacraments - Baptism (Part 3)

Who Can Perform a Catholic Baptism? The ordinary ministers of Baptism are the bishop and priest and deacon. In case of necessity (danger of death), anyone, even a non-baptized person, with the required intention, can baptize by using the Trinitarian baptismal formula. The intention required is to do what the Church does when she baptizes. How is this type of Baptism valid? Well, the Church believes in the universal saving will of God and the necessity of Baptism for salvation. (1 Timothy 2:4, John 3:5).

What does the Grace of Baptism accomplish? Catholic Baptism does five things specifically:

- 1. It forgives **ALL** sins that may have been committed prior to a person's baptism including original, venial and mortal sins. Additionally it relieves the punishment for those sins.
- 2. It makes the newly baptized "a new creature."
- 3. It turns the person into a newly adopted son of God and a member of Christ. Baptism incorporates one into the Church which is the body of Christ.
- 4. It brings someone into the flock of the faithful and brings them to share in the priesthood of Christ (1 Pet. 2:9-10). Catholic Baptism gives a share in the priesthood of all believers and it brings about the sacramental bond of the unity of Christians. Paragraph 1217 of the Catechism expresses this the best: Baptism constitutes the foundation of communion among all Christians, including those who are not yet in full communion with the Catholic Church: "For men who believe in Christ and have been properly baptized, are put in some, though imperfect, communion with the Catholic Church. Justified by faith in Baptism, [they] are incorporated into Christ; they therefore have a right to be called Christians, and with good reason are accepted as brothers by the children of the Catholic Church. 'Baptism therefore constitutes the sacramental bond of unity existing among all who through it are reporn'"
- 5. Last, but certainly not in the least, Baptism leaves an indelible spiritual mark (character) of belonging to Christ on the soul. Nothing you can do will take away this mark, even if you sin a million times.

Can someone receive the Grace of Baptism without being baptized? Yes, those who die for the faith, those who are catechumens, and all those who, without knowing of the Church but acting under the inspiration of grace, seek God sincerely and strive to fulfill his will, can be saved even if they have not been baptized.

What is the form and matter of Baptism? The form of a sacrament is the words that are said when performing or receiving the sacrament. In the case of Baptism this would be, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The matter of a sacrament is the physical signs that are present or used such as in the case of baptism, water and oil.

Symbols used in Baptism: Cross: The cross is a universal symbol of Christianity. The sign of the cross at the beginning of the Rite of Baptism, marks the one who is to belong to Christ with His imprint. It also signifies the grace of the redemption Christ won for us by His Cross. White Clothing: White is the color of purity, and wearing a white garment during baptism symbolizes that the person being baptized now has a clean slate in the eyes of God. The person has "put on Christ". Oil: The Oil of Catechumen is the first oil used in the sacrament. With this anointing the celebrant explicitly renounces Satan and thus prepared, the person is able to confess the faith of the Church to which he will be baptized. The second oil is the anointing with Sacred Chrism. This perfumed oil, consecrated by the bishop, signifies the gift of the Holy Spirit to the newly baptized, who has become a Christian, that is, one "anointed" by the Holy Spirit, incorporated into Christ who is anointed priest, prophet and king. Water: Water is the Christian symbol of life, as well as a sign of purity and cleansing. While a white garment symbolizes the purity of the person wearing it, the purifying or cleansing quality of water is considered to be something that can purify a person from the outside. Water is the baptism symbol that signifies that life is given to man by God. The water is consecrated by a prayer of epiclesis - that is - the Church asks God that through his Son the power of the Holy Spirit may be sent upon the water, so that those who will be baptized in it may be "born of water and the Spirit." Light/Candle: Light is the final baptism symbol and is seen in the candle that is lit from the Easter or Paschal Candle. This candle signifies that the newly baptized is now a child of the light, no longer of darkness and they are charged to keep their candle burning brightly.



St. **Maria Goretti** (October 16, 1890 – July 6, 1902) is an Italian virgin-martyr, and one of the youngest canonized saints. She was born to a farming family. Her father died when she was nine, and they had to share a house with another family, the Serenellis. Maria took over household duties

while her mother, brothers, and sister worked in the fields.

One afternoon, Alessandro, the Serenellis' son, made sexual advances to her. When she refused to submit to him, he stabbed her fourteen times. She was taken to the hospital but she died forgiving him. He was arrested, convicted, and jailed. During imprisonment he repented. After 27 years he was released from prison, and visited her mother to beg forgiveness, which she granted. He later became a lay brother in a monastery, dying peacefully in 1970. She was beatified in 1947, and canonized in 1950.

# Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism. To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This class is offered on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born.

#### **Sacrament of Marriage:**

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting <u>at least 6 months</u> <u>prior to any requested marriage date</u>. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church. Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.
