The Sacraments - Confirmation (Part 1)



As noted a few weeks ago, Baptism, the Eucharist and the sacrament of Confirmation together constitute the "sacraments of Christian initiation," whose unity must be safeguarded. The reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. While Confirmation is a distinct and complete sacrament in its own right, its purpose is to perfect in us what was begun at Baptism. One might say - in a sense - we are baptized in order to be confirmed.

Roots of Confirmation: While we don't know from the Gospels, specifically when, during His public life, Jesus instituted the sacrament of Confirmation, we know that the Bible does tell us about Confirmation. Not under that name, of course. Aside from Baptism, our present names for the sacraments were developed by early theologians of the Church. **"Laying on of hands" was the earliest name for Confirmation.** This is the name that is used in the following passage taken from the Acts of the Apostles: *"Now when the Apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent, to them Peter and John. On their arrival they prayed for them, that they might receive the Holy Spirit; for as yet He had not yet come upon any of them, but they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit..."* (Act 8:14-19).

This passage confirms what we know about Confirmation, that while it is a compliment to Baptism, it is a sacrament distinct from Baptism:

- The Samaritans already had been baptized yet it was still necessary for them to receive the "laying on of hands."
- The passage also tells us the way in which Confirmation was to be given: by the placing of the hand of the one who confirms, upon the head of the one to be confirmed, with a prayer that he/she may receive the Holy Spirit.

History and Development of the Sacrament: Very early, to better signify the gift of the Holy Spirit, an anointing with perfumed oil (*chrism*) was added to the laying on of hands. This anointing highlights the name "Christian," which means "anointed" and derives from that of Christ himself whom God "anointed with the Holy Spirit." This rite of anointing has continued ever since, in both the East and the West. For this reason, the Eastern Churches call this sacrament *Chrismation*, anointing with chrism or *Myron* which means "chrism." In the Western Churches, the term *Confirmation* suggests that this sacrament both confirms baptism and strengthens baptismal grace.

Two traditions: East and West: In the first centuries, Confirmation generally comprised one single celebration with Baptism, forming with it a "double sacrament," according to St. Cyprian. Among other reasons, the multiplication of infant baptisms, all through the year, the increase of rural parishes, and the growth of dioceses often prevented the bishop from being present at all baptismal celebrations. In the West, the desire to reserve the *completion* of Baptism to the Bishop has caused the temporal separation of the two sacraments. The East has kept them united, so that Confirmation is conferred by the priest who baptizes. But he can do so only with the "myron" consecrated by the bishop.

A custom of the Roman Church facilitated the development of the Western practice: a double anointing with sacred chrism after Baptism. The first anointing after Baptism was performed by the priest; it was completed by a second anointing on the forehead of the newly baptized by the bishop. The first anointing has remained attached to the baptismal rite. If Baptism is conferred on an adult, there is only one post-baptismal anointing, that of Confirmation.

The practice of the Eastern Churches give greater emphasis to the unity of Christian initiation. That of the Latin Church more clearly expresses the communion of the new Christian with the bishop as guarantor and servant of the unity, catholicity and apostolicity of his Church, and hence the connection with the apostolic origins of Christ's Church.

Who May be Confirmed? Any baptized Christian who is in a state of grace (free from mortal sin) can be confirmed.

- When adults (Catechetical age of 7 or older) are received into the Catholic Church, they received the Sacraments of Initiation in the traditional order: Baptism, Confirmation and the Holy Eucharist.
- The practice of the Western Church (Latin Rite/Roman Catholic) is to baptize children (under the age of 7) as infants, to allow them to receive the Holy Eucharist for the first time at age 7 and to allow them to be confirmed between the ages of 12-17.
- In the Eastern Churches, infants receive Confirmation and Holy Eucharist along with their Baptism in order to preserve the traditional order of the Sacrament of Initiation.
- In danger of death, children of any age should be confirmed (unless they are not baptized), in which case they should be baptized and then immediately confirmed.




Are you Celebrating Your Marriage Anniversary in July?





Sacraments

Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism. To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This class is offered on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born.

Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting **at least 6 months prior to any requested marriage date**. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. **At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church.** Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.


