

### The Sacraments - The Eucharist (Part 2)

Did anything of the bread and wine remain after their substance had been changed into Our Lord's body and blood? After the substance of the bread and



the wine had been changed into our Lord's body and blood, there remained only the appearances of bread and wine. (a) Because the appearance of bread and wine remain in the Holy Eucharist, we cannot see Christ with our bodily eyes in this sacrament. We do see Him, however, with eyes of faith. Our bodily eyes, moreover, do not deceive us when they see the appearances of bread and wine for these appearances really remain after the Consecration of the Mass.

What do we mean by the appearances of bread and wine? By the appearances of bread and wine, we mean their color, taste, weight and shape and whatever else appears to the senses.

What is the change of the entire substance of the bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ called? The change of the entire substance of the bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ is called Transubstantiation.

Is Jesus Christ whole and entire both under the appearances of bread and under the appearances of wine? Yes. (a) We know that Christ is whole and entire under both appearances because, "Christ having risen from the dead, dies now no more. (Romans 6:9) Because Christ cannot die, His blood must remain united always to His body, and His soul to both. The divinity of Christ, moreover, always remains united to His body and blood because he is God made man. (b) The whole Christ is present under each part of the of the sacred appearances and remains present as long as the sacred appearances remain.

How was our Lord able to change body and wine into His body and blood? Our Lord was able to change bread and wine into His body and blood by His almighty power. (a) God, who created all things from nothing, who fed the five thousand with five loaves, who changed the water into wine instantaneously, who raised the dead to life, can change bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ. Although the Holy Eucharist is a great mystery, and consequently beyond human understanding, the principles of sound reason can show that this great gift is not impossible by the power of God.

Does this change of the bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ continue to be made in the Church? This change of bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ continues to be made in the Church by Jesus Christ, through the ministry of His priest. (a) Only ordained priests have the power of changing bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ. When they consecrate, they act in the person of Christ, through the power received in the sacrament of Holy Orders.

When did Christ give His priests the power to change bread and wine into His body and blood? Christ gave His priests the power to change brand and wine into His body and blood when He made the apostles priests at the Last Supper by saying to them: "Do this in remembrance of Me."

How do priests exercise their power to change bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ? Priests exercise their power to change bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ by repeating at the Consecration of the Mass the words of Christ: "This is My Body . . . This is the Cup of My Blood,"

Why does Christ give us His own body and blood in the Holy Eucharist? Christ give us His own body and blood in the Holy Eucharist: first, to be offered as a sacrifice commemorating and renewing for all time the sacrifice of the cross; second, to be received by the faithful in Holy Communion, third, to remain ever on our altars as the proof of His love for us, and to be worshipped by us.

What is necessary to receive the Blessed Sacrament worthily? (a) One needs to be a baptized Catholic. (b) Have no mortal sin on your soul. (c) Have fasted for at least one hour - no solid food and no liquids except water.

What kind of sin is it to receive the Blessed Sacrament unworthily? To do so knowingly and willingly is a mortal sin called sacrilege.

**How often can you receive the Eucharist in a day?** Up to 2 times, provided that the second time is at Mass. Canon No. 917 of the church's Code of Canon Law states: "A person who has received the most holy Eucharist may receive it again on the same day only during the celebration of the Eucharist in which the person participates."

**How often do you have to receive Communion?** At least once a year, between the First Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday. This is called your Easter Duty. The Church strongly encourages receipt of the Eucharist on every Sunday and feast day, or more often still, even daily.

We've now completed the Sacraments of Initiation. Next weekend we will begin the discussion of the two Sacraments of Healing: Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick.

Do you know about our Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW for short) program? With the assistance of many wonderful adults and teens, we are able to provide this program to our children Liturgy of the Word every Sunday at the 9:00AM Mass.

After the opening prayer, children (3 - 6 years of age) are invited to come forward to receive a blessing from the celebrant/deacon and then leave with their teacher. The children go to the library with their teacher and listen to the same readings that the everyone else is listening to but in words that are more appropriate to their age level. They then do a short reflection on these readings (which may include a simple craft). The children return to their parents after the Prayer of the Faithful; in time to place their gift of treasure envelope into the basket that Father holds. If you have a child between the ages of 3-6, they are invited to join at anytime. Parents are encouraged to accompany their child the first few times if this extra support is needed. The Two by Two Ministry reaches out to our homebound parishioners by visiting them in their homes, sending them cards and letting them know that our parish





#### **Sacraments**

#### Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism. To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This class is offered on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born.

#### Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting at least 6 months prior to any requested marriage date. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church. Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.


