In the Gospel this weekend (Matthew 18:21-35), Jesus tells us the story of the king who decided to settle accounts with his servants in order to teach Peter and all of us how many times we are called to forgive. Eleanor Stump, Professor of Philosophy at St. Louis University, shares her thoughts on this teaching.

### Love and Forgiveness

*In the Gospel reading, Peter wants to know how many times he has to forgive someone who sins against him. . . . There is no limit on the number of times we have to forgive someone who has sinned against us.*

*What stands between us and God is only our willingness to receive the gift God is offering. We can understand the point of this Gospel story if we see the connection between love and forgiveness. Refusing to forgive is refusing to love, and it is never acceptable not to love. That is why it is never right to withhold forgiveness either.*

*The relation between love and forgiveness also helps us see the difference between forgiving a wrongdoer [on the one hand,] and enabling him to continue in his wrongdoing. Love wants the good for the beloved. A person who forgives a sinner loves that sinner; and because she loves him, she has a heart for his good. . . .*

*God's love is like this, too. God's forgiveness is always there and so is God's love. Because God loves every person, God is offering the good to every person too, no matter what his sins may be.*

*So God does not keep a careful distance from us even when we sin. What stands between us and God is only our willingness to receive the gift God is offering. If we will only not reject it, the gift of God's love and forgiveness will be given and received. (Copyright © 2017, Eleonore Stump. All Rights Reserved. ## Sacrament of Holy Orders (Part 2)

**Priests at Christ's own command:** In addition to the power of changing bread and wine into His Body and Blood, Jesus on Easter Sunday night added the power to forgive sins in His name. "Receive the Holy Spirit," He said, "whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them; and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained" (John 20:22-23). This power of the priesthood which Christ conferred upon His Apostles was not to die with them. Jesus came to save the souls of **all** people who ever would live, down to the end of the world. Consequently, the Apostles passed their priestly power on to other men in the ceremony which we now call the sacrament of Holy Orders. The Acts of the Apostles contains one of the first (if not the first) ordinations by the Apostles:

*"And the plan met the approval of the whole multitude, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and Philip and Prochorus and Nicanor and Timon and Parmenas and Nicholas, a proselyte from Antioch. These they set before the Apostles, and after they had prayed they laid their hands upon them." (Acts 6:5-6).*

It was as deacons that these men were ordained, not yet as priests. But it gives us the picture of the Apostles sharing, and **passing on** to others, the sacred power which Jesus had bestowed upon them. As time went on, more Bishops were consecrated by the Apostles to carry on their work. These bishops in turn ordained other bishops and priests, and these bishops in their turn, still others. So that the Catholic priest of today can truly say that the power of his priesthood has come down, in the Sacrament of Holy Orders, in an unbroken line from Christ Himself.

**Holy Orders - A Unique Sacrament:** This sacrament is unique from all others in two notable ways. (1) Holy Orders can only be administered by a **bishop**. Only the bishop has the power to ordain priests. An ordinary priest cannot pass his power on to another. (2) Holy Orders is not received all at once. When we are baptized, we are completely baptized by the single pouring of water, when confirmed, totally confirmed in a single ceremony. **Holy Orders, however, is given in degrees, by successive steps.**



The Sacraments

## Sacrament of Holy Orders (Continued)

**Three Successive Stages:** Holy Orders confers successively the powers of deacon, priest and bishop. These are the three stages in the sacrament as instituted by Christ. At each stage, as in every sacrament, there is an increase in

sanctifying grace. At each stage there is the imprinting of character upon the soul; each successive character, like a progressively brighter sun, enveloping and containing the one that has gone before. In that character is the right and the power that belong to the order which is being received:

- **Deacon:** The right to baptize, preach and administer Holy Communion
- **Priest:** The power to change bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ and to forgive sins.
- **Bishop:** Alone has the fullness of the priesthood. Power to confirm and to ordain—to pass the power of the priesthood on to others in the sacrament of Holy Orders.

Then, besides the increase in sanctifying grace and the priestly character with its accompanying power, there is the special sacramental grace which gives to the one ordained a claim upon God for whatever actual graces he may need in the faithful discharge of his office.

**Priest and the Sacrifice of the Mass:** For priests (and of course bishops), Holy Orders “configures them to Christ” in a special way so that they can act in the person of Christ the Head. Through the sacrament, the Holy Spirit imparts that tremendous and almost unbelievable power to call Jesus Christ himself down upon the altar. It is in the Sacrifice of the Mass that the priest exercises the supreme degree of his sacred office. This is the supreme Sacrifice, offered in divine worship in the person of Christ (*in persona Christi*), by which the priest acts as a true priest of the New Covenant. It is also only by this sacred, ordained power to act *in persona Christi*, that the priest has the power to forgive, in Christ’s name, the sins of men.

**Sustained by grace:** No priest would or could wish for more than this extraordinary privilege of acting *in persona Christi*. As he bends over the bread and wine, lending his lips to Christ as he speaks Christ’s words, “This is My Body... , This is My Blood, “ the priest time and again feels all but crushed by the sense of his own unworthiness, by his human weakness. It is of course, this power to offer sacrifice, this power to offer the Perfect Gift to God in the name of God’s people, that distinguishes a priest from a Protestant minister. The minister does **NOT** have the power to **offer sacrifice, which is precisely what makes a priest a priest.**

**Major difference between Catholics and Protestants:** Protestant ministers do not even believe in such a power to offer sacrifice. One notable exception to this belief is the clergy of the High Episcopalian Church, or the Anglican Church. These clergy do consider themselves priests and bishops, but the Catholic Church does **not** recognize them as such. The reason is simple: there is no one who can impart to them the power of the priesthood. Back in the sixteenth century, the leaders of the Anglican church eliminated all reference to the Mass and the power of sacrifice from their ordination ceremony. Without the **intention** of ordaining sacrificing priests, the sacrament of Holy Orders is invalid; it is not Holy Orders. That is *true of all the sacraments— whoever gives a sacrament must have the intention of doing what the sacrament is supposed to do, or the sacrament is invalid.* That is how true priests and bishops died out in the Anglican Church. The line of succession by which the power of the priesthood has come down to us, from Christ to the Apostles to bishop to bishop to bishop, was broken centuries ago when the Anglican Church rejected the whole idea of the Mass and a sacrificing priesthood. In later times, some Anglican High churchmen, revived the idea of the Mass, but they have no bishops who are true successors of the Apostles, no bishops who themselves have any power which the sacrament of Holy Orders gives.

**An essential link to Christ:** In the sacrament of Holy Orders, Christ has provided us with an essential link to himself. Above all else, Holy Orders makes possible the extraordinary gift of the Sacrifice of the Mass—a gift from Christ himself.





**Vocation Corner: Movie Trailers and Desires**

"Our desires are like movie trailers." When I watch the trailer for Star Wars: The Last Jedi, what is happening? First off, I am being told of something that is to come...in December. Secondly, I am given a glimpse, a hinting, at that something about to come. And lastly, it fills me with a new hope, or rather an expectation of that something. So when my Spiritual Director in seminary told me "Our desires are like movie trailers" I was rather confused. He was helping me see that our desires can lead us to know what God's will is for our life. Just as hunger is a natural desire leading one to seek food- so when we ask the BIG question "What should I do with my life?" we should take notice of our desires. You don't create the desire to be hungry- it just happens- but if food is available, it tells you of good things to come. Likewise we don't create the desire in our minds and hearts when we get excited about something in our future, rather it stems from the purpose for which God created us. When people tell me that they want to be a famous musician but have never learned an instrument, it seems that they aren't on the same page as reality. But I do ask- what is the desire? Because somewhere in that person there is a desire that leads them to say "famous musician" even without knowing any music. What is the root desire? Why did God create me? What is my purpose? For me, I loved to serve people and to talk to them about the goodness of God. That didn't seal the deal but recognizing it gives me a glimpse of the goodness that He has for me. - Fr. 


Apostle and Evangelist

In 1956 he opened the 'Home to Relieve Suffering' near his friary. He was canonised in 2002.

## Sacraments

### Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism. To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This class is offered on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born.

### Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting **at least 6 months prior to any requested marriage date**. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. **At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church.** Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.
