The Intention of this Devotion is to console the Immaculate Heart of Mary by offering reparation for the blasphemies and ingratitude of unrepentant sinners, and for peace in the world.

The promise of our Blessed Mother Mary is to assist at the hour of death all those who complete the following requirements on the **First Saturday of five consecutive months**. On each of the first Saturdays the following is necessary:

- 1.Go to confession. Available at St. Patrick beginning at 7:30AM. (Confession can be completed eight days before or after the First Saturday provided the communicant is in a state of grace when receiving The Lord.)
- 2.Receive Holy Communion Mass will begin at 8:00AM
  3.Say five decades of the Holy Rosary Recited after Mass
  4 Meditate for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Holy
- 4.Meditate for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary After Mass

**All** the requirements can be fulfilled at St. Patrick if you chose to stay after Mass for the Rosary and Meditation. You may complete the 3rd/4th requirements at a later time, but it **must** be completed on that Saturday.

### SOLEMNITY OF MARY MOTHER OF GO

1<sup>ST</sup> JANUARY



On New Year's Day, the octave day of Christmas, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Holy Mother of God, the divine and virginal motherhood of the Blessed Virgin.

It is the highest title of the Blessed Virgin Mary: Theotokos, Mother of God. This title was given to Mary at the Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D. The council taught, however, that the humanity and divinity of Jesus could not be separated and that they exist in one person, with the momentous implication that we can rightly give Mary the title of Mother of God. Mothers bring life, a gift from God, into the world. That's why you sometimes hear the Church referred to as "Mother". The Evangelist, Luke, describes her as the silent Virgin who listens constantly to the Eternal Word, who lives in the Word of God.

This feast is the celebration of Mary's motherhood of Jesus and is the oldest feast of Mary celebrated by the Catholic Church. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel (Luke 1:26-38).

Elizabeth proclaims: "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." And Mary said: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God, my Savior.


#### St. Patrick Catholic Church Parish Registration - Do You Need to Register?

**ARE YOU:** (1) New to the parish; (2) Moving back; (3) Just Married; (4) Attending mass but never officially registered? (4) Even if you grew up in St. Patrick, you (as an adult—18+) need to register independent from your parents.

Please do not take your church registration for granted. Attending Mass is not enough; there must be an official record of your membership in the Parish. Parish registration is essential for many reasons. It becomes important when you or your family members are receiving the Sacraments - First Communion, Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage. Registration is also required for those wishing to become a Baptism or Confirmation sponsor. In addition, becoming a member of a parish gives one the identity of belonging to a family—the parish family of St. Patrick Catholic Church.

If you are not officially registered with the parish, please do so as soon as possible. All you have to do is contact the parish office at 815-385-0025 or stop in during office hours and request a registration packet. Registration packets are also available on the parish website at www.stpatrickmchenry.org—just click on Registration at the top of the home page.

#### A Gift of Stock — Provides Tax Advantages

A gift of appreciated stocks or mutual fund shares can provide you with the best tax advantages. You will get a charitable deduction for the full amount of the gift, just as you would if your gift was made with cash, and you don't incur capital gains tax on the appreciation. If you can't use all of the income tax charitable deduction resulting from the gift, you can carry it forward for up to 5 years!

#### How to Transfer a Gift of Stock

Gifts of stock or mutual fund shares can be given to benefit your parish, favorite Catholic school, or the Diocese of Rockford. The proceeds can be restricted according to your wishes, or directed to a building fund, Diocesan Annual Appeal or an endowed fund in *The Catholic Foundation*. For transfer instructions, please call the Office of Charitable Giving at 815-399-4300.

#### **Deduct Now—Gift Later**

Donor Advised Funds allow you to establish an account in *The Catholic Foundation* in your (or a loved one's) name that may be distributed later. You can choose to establish either an endowed or a provisional Donor Advised Fund. The endowed fund type is designed to retain the principal (or corpus) at all times with only the earnings and market gains available for distribution. The provisional fund type, on the other hand, allows for the distribution of both the earnings and principal.

#### Gift of Real Estate

Avoid capital gains tax on the sale of a home or undeveloped land. Call the Office of Charitable Giving at 815-399-4300 for additional information.

#### **Charitable Gift Annuities**

Charitable Gift Annuities provide for your own and your family's financial future with a dependable, secure, and unchanging life income. You write a check or give securities to *The Catholic Foundation* for the benefit of your parish, Catholic school or the diocese, and we agree to pay you a fixed payment for as long as you live.

#### Benefits of a Charitable Gift Annuity include:

- Lifetime income for you and/or a secondary beneficiary.
- A charitable income tax deduction (if you itemize).
- A portion of your payments not subject to federal income tax.
- Favorable treatment of capital gains taxes on gifts using appreciated stocks.
- Deferred gift annuities allow you to establish your gift now and defer your payments to a future date at an even higher rate.
- The satisfaction of knowing that you are supporting your Catholic faith.

On a gift of \$50,000, a person 75 years old could expect to receive an annual payment of \$2,900 (5.8%) and an initial tax deduction of \$22,886. The minimum amount required to establish a Charitable Gift Annuity is \$5,000.





#### **Vocation Corner**

Fear makes us see things that don't exist. I remember when I was little every time I went into a dark room I began to see things that were not there. I was afraid of darkness, my mind worked so fast that I started seeing ghosts everywhere. In the present, sometimes when I go to an old empty building, and it is dark I am scared, fear makes me see things that do not exist. What I want to say is that the lack of knowledge leads to fear, so if there is fear and lack of knowledge, love is absent.

Some passages of the Gospel talk about how the disciples don't always understand the things Jesus does. Others say that the disciples at the beginning did not recognize the risen Lord. That is why when they saw Him walking on the water they thought it was a ghost. Fear, lack of knowledge, and therefore lack of love, make them blind to see reality. They believed Jesus was a ghost. Sometimes in our relationships with other people we may be afraid, we may see things that don't exist, we may imagine situations that don't even happen. Jesus is always inviting us to love, and to allow ourselves to be loved. So, we won't see things that don't exist.


This likewise happens when trying to find our vocation. Am I called for priesthood? Is marriage my call? If we don't recognize the risen Lord, if we don't accept His call, fear will take over us blocking any possibility of love. Let us open our mind to the knowledge of Jesus, so we can love Him and answer His call.



Eating three meals a day and having extra food in the pantry and refrigerator at the end of the week is something many of us take for granted. However, for others in our community, skipping meals and going to be

hungry due to a lack of food is a reality. St. Vincent de Paul often receives calls for food only assistance; your donations to SVdP and your parish Poor Box help us to feed our neighbors in need. #### **Sacraments**

### Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism. To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This is a two session class that is begun on the 1st Sunday and completed on the 3rd Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born.

#### Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting <u>at least 6 months</u> <u>prior to any requested marriage date</u>. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church. Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.


