

### Catholic Marriage: A Union Sealed by the Sacrament of Matrimony



Catholic Annulment: Was a marriage valid? Many people misunderstand Catholic Annulment. Many think of it as a "Catholic divorce." But in actuality annulment comes from the great value the Catholic Church places on marriage. Annulment upholds, rather than undercuts, the Catholic teaching on the sanctity and permanence of marriage. Divorce says that you were once married, now you aren't - a matter of civil law. Annulment says that you were never truly married in the first place. Something necessary for a valid Sacramental marriage was miss-

ing. Annulment is a matter of Church law.

**Value and Permanence of Marriage:** As discussed over the last weeks, marriage between a man and woman in the Catholic Church is a **sacrament**. It's both a *sign* of the love between Christ and His Church and a *participation* in that love. Catholics believe that a marriage is permanent, "till death do us part." This teaching comes from Christ (Mt 5:31-32 and 19:3-9, Mk 10:2-12, Lk 16:18). Our marriage vows reflect this. We promise our spouse: 1 - Fidelity, 2 - Indissolubility and 3 - Openness to children. This is a description of what marriage is as God intended. That's why we say that the sacrament of marriage is **indissoluble**. Even a Catholic annulment cannot dissolve a valid marriage! Annulment simply says that a true, sacramental marriage was never created in the first place—it was never valid.

What makes a valid marriage? For a marriage to be valid—for it to be something "God has joined together" - a couple needs to: 1 - Be able to exchange consent, and do so freely and unconditionally; 2 - Consent to fidelity, indissolubility, and openness to children; 3 - Not have any **impediments** to marriage; 4 - Follow the sacrament properly. Church law recognizes twelve specific **impediments** to marriage. They include things like coercion, being too young, already being married, blood or in-law relations, having received holy orders, being under vows of chastity or being impotent. Besides these specific impediments, all four requirements have to be met. If they are met, then the marriage itself is valid. If not, it's invalid.


What if a marriage fails? Sometimes things happen in marriage—even valid marriages. The Catholic Church does NOT say that a couple should always stay in a failed marriage. Yes, it strongly encourages people to try to reconcile, especially if children are involved. Sometimes, though, it is necessary to separate for serious reasons, and even seek civil divorce. This is especially true in cases of spousal abuse. That does not change the fact that the couple is STILL married. God has joined them together—that bond cannot be broken. Catholic annulment does NOT affect the bond of a valid marriage! Nothing can break that bond "as long as you both shall live." This means in practice that a separated or divorced person should live in a way that reflects that fact that they are still married. They shouldn't marry, live with, or even date someone else. To do so would be adulterous. Someone who is divorced or separated should be celibate.

To many this sounds cold and unfeeling, but when we marry, we **promise not to just "move on**." We promise to stay together through thick & thin, and to remain faithful. This is also important because we've promised to be a sign to the world of **God's** fidelity to us. Our marriage is a visible sign of the love between Christ and His Church. You know...where He remains faithful to us, even when we fail. But **marriage is more than just a sign** - marriage is also the sacramental channel through which God gives the grace of fidelity and love to a broken world. Remaining faithful, even in a difficult or broken marriage, keeps that channel open. This can be very hard to understand in a culture that doesn't value promise, fidelity or permanence.

**Annulment for an invalid marriage:** Catholic annulment means that the couple was **never married** in the sacramental sense. God did not create the unbreakable bond, as the sacrament of marriage was not actually fulfilled. The proper term for Catholic annulment is "declaration of nullity." The Church declares the marriage was never valid in the first place.

What makes a marriage invalid? Some common reasons: 1 - At least one partner didn't fully & freely consent; 2 - Someone wasn't mature enough to understand the full extant of what they were doing, 3 - There was never intent to be faithful, 4 - One or both partners did not intend to be open to children. Obviously, the Church places a tremendous value on marriage. That is why couples seeking marriage are required to attend pre-marriage education sessions (Pre-Cana) so they be fully informed about what they are committing to. It's important to distinguish between what the couple intends when they marry and deviations later in the marriage.

#### WHAT IS IT?

- \*RCIA is the normal way for unbaptized persons and those who have been baptized in another Christian tradition to become a Catholic
- \*RCIA is for Baptized Catholics who have received no other faith formation and have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist
- \*RCIA is for children age 7-17 who have not been baptized. Parents should register for their child.

#### WHEN IS IT AND WHERE?

- ♦ Our 2018-19 parish RCIA for adults and children process will begin in September (After Labor Day).
- ♦ Participants meet each Sunday after the 9:00AM Mass in the Parish Library.
- ◊Together with their catechists, they explore the elements of the Catholic faith and prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil (April 20, 2019)

Attention: Parents Raising Families in Faith! The Religious Education Office is currently accepting registrations for the 2018-2019 school year.

Any St. Patrick family who has children enrolled in the public school system is **en**-

couraged to register for formal Religion classes.

(First Grade/Seventh Grade Parents): If your child is in the first grade and you want them to receive 1st Communion next year, they need to register for 1st grade now. This is also true for any 7th grader hoping to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation next year. They need to register for 7th grade now. The diocese requires 2 continuous years of Religious Education prior to the receipt of a sacrament.

Classes will be offered on *Sunday Morning* (10:00AM - 11:00AM) **OR** *Wednesday Evening* (5:45PM - 7:00PM). All classes are held in the Montini Primary school building. Religious Education **Sunday classes begin on September 9th**, while **Wednesday classes begin on September 12th**. For planning purposes (book ordering, etc.), please ensure that your children are enrolled as soon as possible.
