



The Eucharist "Source & Summit of the Catholic Faith"

Last weekend's article explained Benediction. One of the questions that comes up often when talking about this beautiful Catholic devotion is: Why does the priest veil his hands during Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament? This weekend, the articles on the Eucharist will conclude with the answer to this question.

The Latin word benedictio is formed by two words: bene (well) and diction (speaking). In English we translate benedictio as "blessing". In the Catholic Church there is tradition that Christ made the blessing of the sign of the cross over the Immaculate Mary and the Holy Apostles just before He ascended into Heaven. After the Ascension, the apostles, as priests, would also make the sign of the cross over the faithful in imitation of Jesus. The hands of the Apostles, and thus the hands of all bishops, priests and deacons are consecrated so that they might bless and sanctify people and things. At the end of every Mass, the priest makes the sign of the cross with his hand over the people to bless them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit—the Triune God. He does the same when sinners are absolved in the confessional.

Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is different from a normal priestly blessing. The priest does NOT bless the people. Rather, the priest holds the Blessed Sacrament Who is the Lord Jesus Christ, and Christ himself directly blesses the people. Again it is not the priest who blesses in the name of Christ, but Christ Himself blesses. In order to signify that he is not blessing the people, the priest covers his hands with a humeral veil. Clearly the hands of the priest are not unworthy to touch the Body of Christ or the monstrance which bears Him. In fact he touches the Body of Christ as He is exposed into the monstrance. The humeral veil has its origins in the Jewish prayer veil used by Jewish men and worn by Christ, our High Priest, and His Holy Apostles. So, on Saturday afternoon at the end of Holy Hour, we are blessed by Jesus Christ Himself. What a way to enter into Mass. Come and try it!

Saint(s) of the Week



St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta
August 26, 1910 - September 5, 1997
Memorial: September 5
Patron of Calcutta

Born to Albanian parents in what is now Skopje, Macedonia, Gonxha (Agnes) Bojaxhiu

was the youngest of the three children who survived. For a time, the family lived comfortably, and her father's construction business thrived. But life changed overnight following his unexpected death.

During her years in public school, Agnes participated in a Catholic sodality and showed a strong interest in the foreign missions. At age 18, she entered the Loreto Sisters of Dublin. It was 1928 when she said goodbye to her mother for the final time and made her way to a new land and life. The following year she was sent to the Loreto novitiate in Darjeeling, India. There she chose the name Teresa. She was assigned to a high school for girls in Calcutta, where she taught history and geography to the daughters of the wealthy. But she could not escape the realities around her—the poverty, the suffering, the overwhelming numbers of destitute people.

In 1946, while riding a train to Darjeeling to make a retreat, Sister Teresa heard what she later explained as "a call within a call. The message was clear. I was to leave the convent and help the poor while living among them." She also heard a call to give up her life with the Sisters of Loreto, and to "follow Christ into the slums to serve him among the poorest of the poor."

After receiving permission to leave Loreto, establish a new religious community, and undertake her new work, Sister Teresa took a nursing course for several months. She returned to Calcutta, where she lived in the slums and opened a school for poor children. Dressed in a white sari and sandals—the ordinary dress of an Indian woman—she soon began getting to know her neighbors—especially the poor and sick—and getting to know their needs through visits.

For the next four decades, Mother Teresa worked tirelessly on behalf of the poor. Her love knew no bounds. She crisscrossed the globe pleading for support and inviting others to see the face of Jesus in the poorest of the poor. In 1979, she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. On September 5, 1997, God called her home. Blessed Teresa was canonized by Pope Francis on September 4, 2016.

Attention Families with Children enrolled in Kindergarten to 8th grade in public school:

1st grade & 7th grade parents: please note that in order for your child to receive either the Sacrament of First Communion (2nd grade) or Confirmation (8th grade), they must be enrolled in RE this year. The Diocese of Rockford requires two years of preparation for receipt of the Sacraments. Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This is a one session class that is held on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born. You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism.

Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting <u>at least 6 months</u> <u>prior to any requested marriage date</u>. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church. Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.

Annulment Process - Information

If you or someone you know needs a previous marriage investigated for its validity or invalidity (the annulment process) so that you may fully participate in your Catholic faith or become Catholic please call the Tribunal Office at 815-399-4300.
