

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend we celebrate the **Solemnity of Corpus Christi** (*Body of Christ*). It is the solemn celebration of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, the expression of our unique Catholic belief that Jesus is truly present in His Body and Blood, and I would add, with His Soul and Divinity, in the Eucharist. In Exodus, the Old Covenant, Moses sprinkled the blood of animals/Passover on the altar and on the people in remembrance of the Covenant. They felt God's presence symbolically through these gestures. That Old Covenant was fulfilled in the New Testament when Jesus, the real Passover Lamb, offered himself in the Eucharist as a prelude to the sacrifice of the cross (MK 14). He asked us to keep this memorial.


We celebrate this mystery daily in the liturgy with solemn emphasis on Sunday, but this solemnity is a day that is set aside so we contemplate and celebrate in a unique manner what we believe about the Eucharist. Fittingly on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi the Church urges us to demonstrate publicly (in procession), our faith and belief in the Real Presence. Although the realities of the COVID pandemic will once again prohibit us from taking Jesus throughout the neighborhood, we will end the 11:00AM Mass this Sunday with a procession inside of the church concluding in Benediction. I pray that this celebration may continue to foster in us a deeper sense of belief in the real presence of Jesus. Amen. I hope that next year we will be able to return to our tradition of both processing with Jesus throughout our neighborhood and celebrating our Parish Picnic on Corpus Christi.

As indicated in last weekend's bulletin, now that we are operating on a summer schedule, the space for this weekly column will be used for brief moments of Church/Faith teachings. This week we begin our series on the 2nd Vatican Council (please see page 5).

From tomorrow I will be on my annual retreat as I indicated in my article last week. The rest of the time until the beginning of July I will be with my family preparing for my Mom's funeral. RE Registration - 2021/2022

Registration for Religious Education for the 2021-2022 school year is OPEN. We have planned to go back to a more traditional program with multi-aged classrooms and monthly family gatherings for the upcoming year. If mitigations change, we will reevaluate at that time. Registration materials are available at: <https://stpatrickmchenry.org/religious-education> and in the church narthex. At this time, we are only looking for registration, so we can properly prepare for the number of students that will be attending in the fall. **Please register as soon as possible!** If you are prepared at this time to make payment, payments can be turned into the parish office or made online via GiveCentral at <https://www.givecentral.org/location/355/event/7842>.

Important: If you have a 1st grader or 7th grader, our program requires two years of religious education prior to the receipt of Sacraments. This means, that if you want your child to be prepared to receive their Sacrament with their age level in 2nd (First Communion) or 8th (Confirmation) grade, they **MUST** be enrolled in the fall.

Summer 2021 Bulletin Series

Vatican II - History, Documents, Key Players & More

Historical Background

Pope John XXIII provoked general surprise in the world on January 25, 1959. He announced his intention to convoke a council for the Universal Church. Without having very concrete ideas about the content of the council, St. Pope John XXIII identified **two objectives: an adaptation (aggiornamento) of the Church and of apostolate to a world undergoing great transformation, and a return to unity among Christians, which seems to be what the Pope thought would happen shortly.** The council did not speak so much of the Church fighting against adversaries as it did of finding a way of expression in the world in which she lived and seemed to ignore.

Vatican II was an **ecumenical council** that took place in Vatican City from October 11, 1962, until December 8, 1965. This council represents a major event in the life of the Church of the 20th century, and for this reason it constitutes a fundamental era in universal history. It came to be the conclusion of the Tridentine period and the beginning of a new phase in the history of the Church. This is due to the prophetic action of St. John XXIII who perceived the need for a council that would positively mark the new phase of the Church's evangelizing mission and to the undisputed personality of St. Pope Paul VI who had the courage to have brought it to its conclusion and to have forged the first steps of reform.

From January 25, 1959, in the Basilica of St. Paul's Outside the Walls, a double movement was initiated: on one hand direct preparation for the council began, accomplished above all by the Roman Curia; on the other, the separation of diverse ecclesial experiences that tended toward a strong renewal of the life of the Church. A look at preconiliar history clearly reveals the existence of a strong conservative block; different factors testify to it; we can recall in particular: the concentration of the Curia and the vacant office of the Secretary of State that Pius XII always held; the different condemnations of several theological renovations; the prohibition against teaching what was held by different valuable professors, like H. de Lubac, Y. Congar, Teilhard de Chardin..., after the publication of *Humani Generis*. Different factors already suggested the change that soon become reality; the socio-cultural context already showed the signs of an irreversible industrialization: the countries of the Third World assumed an identity that they had never before had and colonialism was reaching its end; in a word: society was fearful and something was being conceived that would modify more than just civil life.

There were also signs within the Church that signaled change: the ecumenical movement continued to grow with a strong consciousness of creating authentic spaces for encounter and dialogue; the laity assumed an appearance of authentic ecclesial maturity; the theological context seemed to be sustained by an investigation that returned to the genuine sources of Scripture and the Fathers. The preparatory commission was presided over by Cardinal Tardini; the Secretary General of the council was Bishop Pericles Felici; the material for discussion was prepared by ten commissions composed of various theologians from the Curia and was set out in 70 schema. The majority of the people involved in the preparation of the Council began with the assurance that it would conclude in a few months; unfortunately, these presentiments were inaccurate. In three years of intense work, the council rejected a great part of the preparatory material and formulated some documents that restored an authentically Evangelical horizon to the Church. There were 2,540 bishops present at the Council, coming from every continent, as were at least 480 theologians - "peritos" and auditors -, thus as representatives of reform and orthodoxy. This representation manifested the new expressions of dialogue that had been codified in the documents themselves. Vatican II, a point of change for the pontificate of St. John XXIII revolutionized the position of the Catholic Church regarding the ecumenical movement. **The ecumenical concern was, in the mind of Pope John XXIII, one of the principle stimuli that had brought him to announce his intention to call a council "to manifest, to a greater degree, our love and benevolence toward those who call themselves Christians but are separated from the Apostolic See, so that they also can closely follow the works of the council and thus more easily find the way to achieve unity for which Jesus directs to the Heavenly Father such an ardent plea."**

The celebration of the council constituted a great event for all Christianity. The presence of non-Catholic observers and their collaboration through questions and observations contributed by introducing an ecumenical dimension to the conciliar documents. **As such, the occurrence of the council was for all churches, during those years, a sign of hope.** It made manifest the possibility that a Church would begin and bring to a good conclusion, in a certain sense, a general updating and reform. It also made for an admirable example of the conciliar character of the Church. The concept of "council" was actualized, again, as much in the Orthodox churches as in the whole ecumenical movement.





St. Joseph's Apparition - Knock Ireland

On the evening of Aug. 21, 1879, St. Joseph appeared with Our Lady and St. John the Evangelist in Knock, Ireland, at the parish church. Joseph stood to Mary's right side. The Lamb of God also appeared on an altar. As recorded in official Knock archives, Patrick Hill, among the 15 villagers who saw the apparition, reported that "St. Joseph appeared "to the Blessed Virgin's right hand; his head was bent from the shoulders, forward; he appeared to be paying his respects. ... His hands were joined like a person at prayer."

Witness Mary Byrne described how "St. Joseph's head was slightly bent and inclined towards the Blessed Virgin, as if paying her respect." Mariologist Msgr. Arthur Calkins explained in his article "The Apparition of St. Joseph at Knock" that, "in these latter times by means of apparitions and the deepening awareness of the Church, God is drawing our attention to the greatness of St. Joseph in terms of his role in salvation history and the power of his intercession."

He quoted Irish Mariologist Father Michael O'Carroll, who perceived St. Joseph's appearance as convincing us to "seek help in prayer towards an understanding of his role in the life of the Church and in our own personal lives."

The Corpus Christi Procession

In the thirteenth century, a Belgian nun by the name of Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's feast of Corpus Christi—the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—grew from Juliana's vision.

On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional Corpus Christi procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The Corpus Christi procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day, among those who know him but yearn to know him better, and among those who do not know him. The Eucharist is a mystery to be believed, to be celebrated—and to be lived.





Sacraments

Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This is a one session class that is held on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born. *You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism.*

Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting **at least 6 months prior to any requested marriage date.** This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. **At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church.** Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.

Annulment Process - Information

If you or someone you know needs a previous marriage investigated for its validity or invalidity (the annulment process) so that you may fully participate in your Catholic faith or become Catholic please call the Tribunal Office at 815-399-4300.
