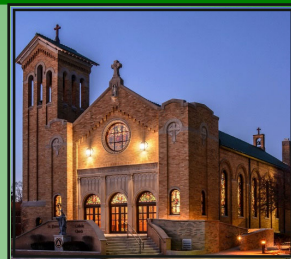

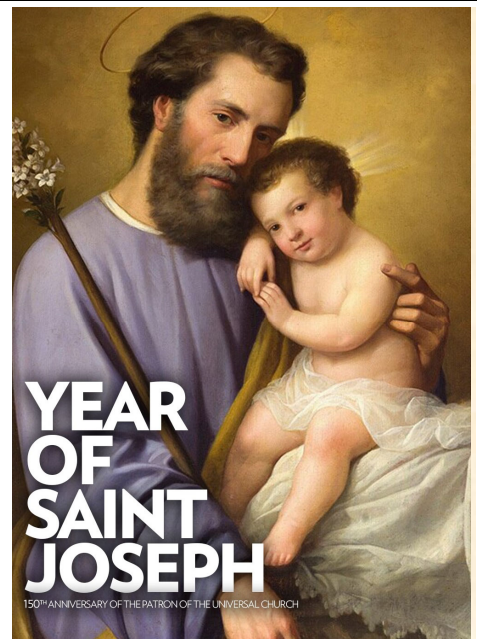

For the past thirty-eight years Anna Schweder has shared her time, talent and treasure with St. Patrick Parish. In gratitude, she has been chosen as our Woman of Inspiration for 2021.

The various ministries that Anna has chosen to devote her time to gives us an excellent example of her desire to be an evangelist. She has been a catechist at St. Patrick's for twenty years, helping to provide religious formation for our children. She has attended and worked Cursillo retreats and now is involved in their small groups and encourages others to attend a Cursillo weekend. Anna is the ministry leader of the St. Peregrine Cancer Support Group where she co-ordinates meetings twice a month between five different parishes for cancer patients, survivors, and care givers. She is a leader of a Small Christian Community Group; they meet once a week and discuss books from many different Catholic authors, such as Matthew Kelley, Scott Hahn, amongst others. She served as president of the Legion of Mary Ministry for three years; helping to bring more people to praying the rosary and growing closer to our Blessed Mother. Her daily attendance at Mass and weekly attendance at bible study classes for the past ten years have deepened her faith and helped to develop a deep trust in God. Summer 2021 Bulletin Series

Vatican II - History, Documents, Key Players & More

Principle Themes of the Council (Continued)

This week we continue our look at examples of how significant aspects of the Council, or themes, recur in the various documents.

(4) Liturgical Movement

The greater emphasis on scriptural foundations also had import in the liturgical movement which could be traced back to the beginning of the 20th century with St. Pius X's call for full, active, conscious participation of all the faithful in the liturgy (his *motu proprio* of 1903 on sacred music, *Tra le Sollecitudini*) and more frequent recourse to receiving communion (his 1905 decree *Sacra Tridentina Synodus*). As part of his promotion for frequent communion, Pius X, in 1910, enacted that children should receive communion on reaching the age of reason at around the age of seven. Underpinning Pius X's call was a resurgence in Benedictine monasticism which had started in 1833 in France (Solesmes) and followed later in the 19th century in Germany (Beuron, Maria Laach), Belgium (Maredsous, Mount Cesar) and the USA (St. Vincent's Latrobe Pennsylvania, St. Meinrad's Indiana, St. John's Collegeville Minnesota). Many of these communities became a resource for the liturgical renewal by restoring Gregorian chant and other lost liturgical treasures as well as publishing literature in the form of periodicals and new missals.

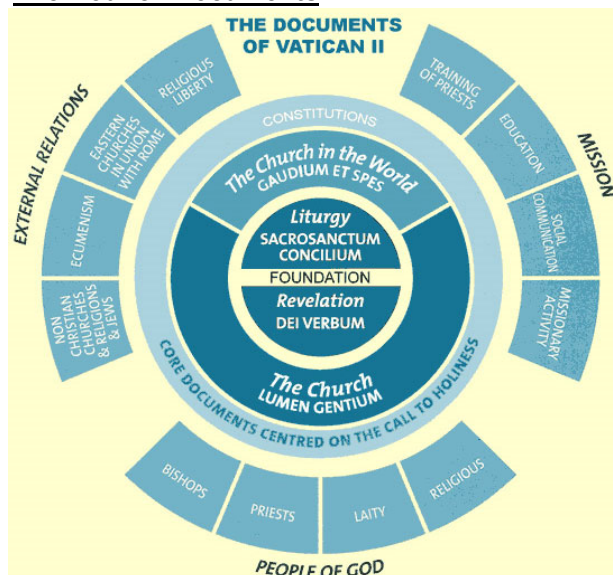
Pius XII's 1947 encyclical on the liturgy, *Mediator Dei*, gave official, if cautious, approval for liturgical renewal. In the decade that followed there was further liturgical reform. The 1956 Congress on Pastoral Liturgy at Assisi was an important event for the liturgical reform movement. It was at this gathering that Augustin (later cardinal) Bea gave a paper, *The Pastoral Value of the Word of God*, stressing the unity between 'the Word of God and the Bread of Life' where the priest 'is as much minister of the Word as minister of the sacraments' and 'in him the liturgical movement and the biblical movement should meet and blend'. This was a portent of changes to come.

All the elements of the liturgical movement provided the momentum for the formulation of the Constitution on the Liturgy, *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, at Vatican II. Not only was there a greater emphasis on proclaiming a greatly expanded repertoire of scripture in the liturgy, but increased participation, especially receiving communion, provided a liturgical expression of the renewed understanding of the Church as all of God's faithful people and all that this implied for the life of the Church in communion and mission.

(5) The Church's Relationship To The World

It was during the sessions of the Council that a document (*Gaudium et Spes*) was generated that saw the relationship of the Church to the world in a more positive light. There was recognition that there could be mutual enrichment and that the Church was no longer simply perceived as the good and a bulwark against an essentially evil world. It provided an opening for a dialogue which took account of human development and understanding of the world in which the Church was situated.

The Council Documents



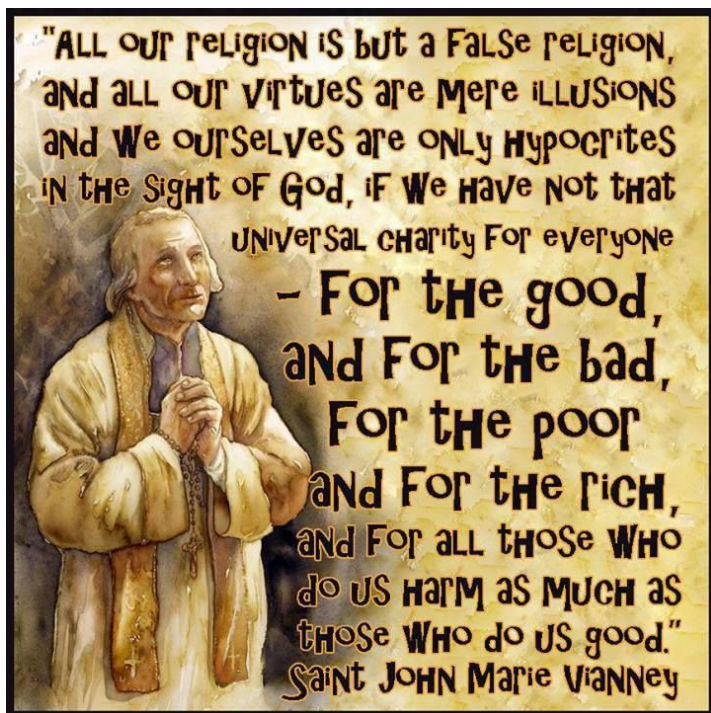
The diagram of Council documents show the four central constitutions and their approximate relationship with the nine decrees and three declarations. It is possible to offer examples of the interweaving nature of many subjects or themes: a prime example being the influence of scripture. God's Revelation, recorded in the Hebrew scriptures and the New Testament, is the foundational principle as without the Incarnation and all that followed there would be no Christianity. Scripture is vital in liturgy, which also needs to relate as far as possible to other traditions and Scripture must inform the study of the Church itself from earliest times until today - not least with the Orthodox Churches of the East. Two other examples must suffice here: the recovered recognition of the significance of a common baptism brought back into sharp focus the importance of *The People of God*. This led to the Decree on the Lay Apostolate, *Apostolicam Actuositatem*. In *Lumen Gentium*, the Council Fathers put the *People of God* before the hierarchy to emphasize the importance of the common baptism. And then in dealing with the hierarchy, it was clear that a separate document was needed; in turn this led to the Decree on the Bishops' Pastoral Office, *Christus Dominus*. Most of the other documents of the

Council depend on *De Ecclesia*, 'On the Church', becoming known by its opening words *Lumen Gentium*. From *De Ecclesia* depend the documents on Bishops, Priests, Lay Apostolate, Religious Life, Missionary Activity, Ecumenism, and Non-Christian Religions. It is easy, therefore, to understand that the spirit in which the Council documents were formed was vital and that it is necessary to treat the ongoing development of Council teachings as a whole.

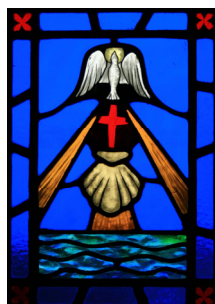

Sacraments

Baptism of Infants or children under 7 years of age:

To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Please consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. In addition, a Baptismal preparation class is required for the parents. This is a one session class that is held on the 1st Sunday of each month after the 9AM Mass. Sign-up is required and you may take the class before your child is born. *You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism.*

Sacrament of Marriage:

At St. Patrick, couples planning to marry need to meet with the Pastor before a wedding date can be set. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting **at least 6 months prior to any requested marriage date.** This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. **At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church.** Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.

Annulment Process - Information

If you or someone you know needs a previous marriage investigated for its validity or invalidity (the annulment process) so that you may fully participate in your Catholic faith or become Catholic please call the Tribunal Office at 815-399-4300.

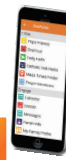
