





A welcoming parish called in FAITH to know, LOVE and serve God and neighbor in the HOPE of heaven.



Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy Solemnity of Pentecost. With it we come to the end of the Easter Season and enter Ordinary Time when we put all the graces of Easter into practice.

At the first Pentecost, fifty days after Easter Sunday, the Holy Spirit, that is, the third person of the Blessed Trinity, came upon the Church. With His seven-fold *gifts (Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety and Fear of the Lord)*, He empowered the apostles to bear witness to God's merciful love in the world. As we celebrate this solemnity, and get ready for that of the Blessed Trinity next Sunday, I pray for the fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit with His gifts so that bearing the Holy Spirit's **fruits of love; joy; peace; patience; kindness; goodness; generosity; gentleness; faithfulness; modesty; self-control and chastity** we too, united in faith, like the apostles, may be invigorated in being witness to God's love and mercy.

At the Tower of Babel in Genesis, sin led to confusion of human language and division. But Pentecost unites the divided humanity by bringing together people of all tongues, languages, colors, and nationalities so that reunited in accord with God's original purpose, they, as a family, may bear witness to God's love. Pentecost is the birthday of Catholicism (Universal) as a Church. It is a continuation of the holy pilgrimage where saints and sinners from everywhere can have access to God's merciful love, with a profound sense of belonging regardless of their differences. With that experience they can in turn witness to God's love. At Pentecost the New Covenant inaugurated by the Paschal Mystery (suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus) takes full effect in the Church. Pentecost emboldened the first pope, Peter to become a spokesman for the apostolic conclave and the universal church (Acts 2:14), a tradition that would follow in the Church's 2,000+ years as one of the signs of its catholicity (universality), Holiness, Oneness and Apostolicity (traceable to the Apostles).

I pray that our parish in St. Patrick, McHenry, united with the universal Catholic Church will continue to be a beacon of hope and a strong family that witnesses God's love in our community.

We have now come to the end of the Easter Season and have started our summer season of activities. During the summer, as in the past, the space for this weekly column will be used for brief moments of Church/Faith teachings. This year we will look at the USCCB's document "*The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church*" as the 2022-2024 Eucharistic Revival is launched on the Feast of Corpus Christi – June 19th. Enjoy your summer.

Sacraments

Baptism: To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. A Baptism preparation class, held on the 3rd Sunday of the month at 10:00AM, is required for the parents. You may take the class before your child is born. *You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism.*

Matrimony: Couples planning to marry need to meet with the Liturgy Director to begin the process before a wedding date can be finalized. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting **at least 6 months prior to any requested marriage date**. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. **At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church.** Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.


