A welcoming parish called in FAITH to know, LOVE and serve God and neighbor in the HOPE of heaven.



Dear Friends in Christ.

The **Solemnity of Christ the King**, this weekend, ends this liturgical year (C – Gospel of St. Luke). Next weekend begins Advent, the New Liturgical Year A (Gospel of St. Matthew). Our liturgical years A, B, and C celebrate Jesus's Kingdom of **Truth, Peace and Love as eternal**, "His dominion is an everlasting one that shall not be taken away" Dan 7:14. He "loves us and has freed us from our sins by His blood, ...and has made us into a kingdom...for His God and Father." As members of His Kingdom, we must act in Truth, Love and Peace in

service of God and neighbor.

The stain glass window of Christ the King over our Altar is the most prominent in our church. We can see Christ enthroned (Kingly office) as King of the universe. Next to Him are two angels with incense (symbols of priestly office). He has an opened book in His hand (Prophetic symbol, Old and New Testament) marked with the Greek symbols of Alpha (α) and Omega (α), that is, the Beginning and the End.

The Trinitarian formula (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) at baptism inaugurated us into a kingdom of Priest, Prophet, and King. Then the minister said, "God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into His holy people. He now anoints you with the chrism of salvation as Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so you may live always as a member of His body, sharing everlasting life." I pray that the celebration of Christ the King will remind us of our identity and the need for us to live as members of His Kingdom of Truth, Peace, and Love.

This Thursday, November 24th, we will celebrate **Thanksgiving**. Please join us at 9:00AM for the Eucharist (Eucharistia- [Latin] for Thanksgiving). As one-year ends and another begins, it is good that we pause in *Thanksgiving* to God. This is a good time when we, in gratitude to the giver, remind ourselves to look after and share His love, peace, and forgiveness with our families and friends as well as all those that God has put in our lives. A good spiritual gift for Thanksgiving will be to share the mercy of God with all.

Here at St. Patrick Church, we are grateful to all who have donated Time, Talents and Treasures in order to support our parish. On behalf of our parish, I am very thankful to all those who serve in our office and ministries- liturgical, service, and social. Thank you to all those who make numerous sacrifices that keep our parish in good spiritual and financial health. May God bless and keep you. I wish you and your families a very blessed Thanksgiving and a faith filled season of Advent.

Dear Parishioners,

On November 8th we held the quarterly meetings of both the Finance and Pastoral Councils and reviewed the activities, both past, and present, of our parish family.

Notably, we discussed the recently completed repairs of the pipes that provide heat to the

Montini Primary Center. This project had been anticipated for many years and after much consideration, the Finance Council determined it was time for its completion. In gratitude to our parishioners' generosity and fiscal responsibility of our staff, we had some savings with the DIAL (savings account in Rockford), over the past few years so we were able to fund the repairs (\$275,000).

During the meeting, one of our new council members asked if we had a list of future projects. We did not. For the most part, we seem to be reactionary when it comes to repairs. As you may have noticed there are some issues currently with the lighting of the church sanctuary. Several bulbs burned out in the past few months having just been replaced this past spring. It has now been determined that the best course of action would be to replace these fixtures with newer LED technology. Replacing the bulbs on the ceiling fixtures is no easy task as it requires the rental of scaffolding. But when completed the LED solution should give us several years on the bulbs and eliminate the need for replacements on a yearly basis.

Our budget is like most households facing the pressures of inflation. Although we do budget for repairs annually, the replacement of the lights, as well as other repairs this Fall, like getting the boilers turned on for the season are stretching the limits. The lighting repairs are estimated at \$12,000 and boiler repairs are approximately \$6,500.

As a parish, we have been blessed with your generosity. As we begin to prepare for the season of Christmas, please keep the parish in your prayers and consider a year-end gift to help us make these needed repairs and begin to build back our reserves for future unknown needs that may arise.

Again, I am deeply grateful to you for all your sacrificial support for our parish.

Blessed Thanksgiving and Advent Season ahead.

Students can complete their posters in either color or black & white.


Similar to past years, there will be three grade groups:


- Grades K-2

- All submitted posters will be put on display for all parishioners to enjoy (location TBD)







Sacraments

Baptism: To schedule a Baptism, please begin by calling the parish office. Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month immediately after the 11AM Mass. Consider scheduling your child's Baptism before your child is born to ensure an opening in the month of your choice. A Baptism preparation class, held on the 3rd Sunday of the month at 10:00AM, is required for the parents. You may take the class before your child is born. You must be a registered parishioner of St. Patrick prior to scheduling a Baptism.

<u>Matrimony:</u> Couples planning to marry need to meet with the Liturgy Director to begin the process before a wedding date can be finalized. Please contact the parish office to setup an initial meeting <u>at least 6 months prior to any requested marriage date</u>. This initial meeting will give you an overview of the requirements for marriage and the preparation required. At least one of the couple, or their parents, must be registered parishioners for at least 6 months and be active participating members of St. Patrick Church in order to be married at the church. Both individuals must be at least 19 years of age.
