THE GOSPEL FOR TODAY-- Luke 15:1-3,11-32

Jesus said, 'There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me." So he divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, "How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands.' "So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son." But the father said to his slaves, "Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!" And they began to celebrate.


'Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, "Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound." Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, "Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!" Then the father said to him, "Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found."


TALKING WITH FAMILY AND FRIENDS

LOST AND FOUND

WHO ARE THE LOST PEOPLE IN OUR SOCIETY?
WHO ACTS LIKE THE LOVING FATHER OF THE GOSPEL?

Today, there are more people on the move than at any other point in history. Many cannot return to their homeland because of war, or famine or persecution. In the past few weeks, our hearts and minds have been moved by the people of Ukraine. The unjust war waged by Russia on Ukraine has put millions of refugees on the move

It is in solidarity with the 68.5 million displaced children, women, and men throughout the world that we invite you to embark on a journey of faith, love, and hope. "Hope is the force that drives us to 'share the journey,' because the journey is made jointly: by those who come to our land, and by us, who go towards their heart, to understand them, to understand their culture, their language," stated Pope Francis during a general audience on September 27, 2017.



Through this journey, rooted in the inherent dignity of each human person, Pope Francis invites us to meet the other and to see the humanity of each migrant. In following the teachings of the Beatitudes, we should recall the message given to us in the Letter to the Hebrews (13:1-3): "Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves are being tortured."

At a time when division seems to be at the forefront, when fear blinds minds and the culture of indifference stifles hearts, let's take advantage of this moment of encounter to share the journey with the 68.5 million children, women, and men who are displaced around the world. It can sometimes be difficult to grasp the extent of the impact that forced migration has on the lives of those who face it. However, the simple fact of being interested in what our sisters and brothers are experiencing is already a step toward the other, a first step on the way to a true encounter.



PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION THAT YOU CAN PRAY AT HOME OR WITH A COMMUNITY

Introduction: Pope Francis wants this Jubilee Year, whose main theme, Pilgrims of Hope, emphasizes hope as the driving force of faith, to be a time that combines the spiritual dimension with social life, as well as a time for acts of charity towards the most vulnerable. After listening to the Word of God and professing our faith, united in prayer with our sisters and brothers around the world, let us entrust God our Father with our requests for the world and the Church. After each intention, let us say with confidence: Lord, may your reign of love, justice and peace come!

For the Earth, our common home, so that its resources are not plundered, but shared responsibly and equitably among the peoples of all countries, let us pray to the Lord.

TUSH DABT HODE

For political and civil leaders, that they may promote and protect the dignity of their fellow citizens, especially the most disadvantaged, let us pray to the Lord.

For the great economic decision-makers, that concern for the common good, justice and peace may guide their decisions and actions, let us pray to the Lord.

For the Church, that she may never cease to proclaim the Good News of the Gospel to the world, and to promote the preferential option for the poor which is rooted in faith in Jesus Christ our Saviour and Redeemer, let us pray to the Lord.

For the members of our Christian community, that the grace of the Jubilee Year may rekindle in each and every one the flame of solidarity and the commitment to bring about God's reign, let us pray to the Lord.

Let us pray to the Lord for our sisters and brothers in the world's poorest countries, that our support will enable them to live in dignity.

Concluding prayer: God our Father, receive the prayers we address to you, so that together we may participate in the advent of your reign of love, justice and peace. Help us to act in solidarity to fulfill the mission you have entrusted to us. We ask this through your Son Jesus, the Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever and ever. Amen.
