A REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

In today's Gospel, Jesus ascended into Heaven. On Easter Sunday, he rose from the dead. He spent the next forty days appearing to his disciples, talking with them, and preparing them for the time when he would return to His Father, leaving them to do His great work on earth, spreading the Good News to every place where people are to be found. Today He returns to God, but promises that He will send His Holy Spirit to strengthen them for the great mission ahead of them. He tells the disciples that they are to be witnesses. Today, Jesus says to us, His modern-day disciples, "You, too, shall be my witnesses." What does a witness do? A witness testifies to the truth of what he or she has seen, what they know to be true. What have you seen? What do you know to be true? If you have seen people loving, acting with compassion, feeding the hungry, visiting the sick, you are a witness to Jesus at work in our world. If you have heard people speaking with kindness and comforting one another, you are a witness to Jesus being made known in our world. So long as you do this to one of the least of His sisters and brothers, you do it to Him.
