Grow in Faith - Preschool and Elementary

"Each one of us, as a disciple of Christ, has a heart that beats in anticipation of knowing Christ with every prayer, small group session, retreat, and gathering."



We kicked off the year with a Mass Transit challenge. The children were encouraged to have conversations with their families about the Sunday Gospel and then complete Mass Transit cards to share what they learned or noticed at Mass. In October, we hosted a Saint Parade and the kids made shrines about their favorite saints that donned the hallways. Next, they used their creativity and worked hard holding bake sales, holiday pie sales, lemonade/hot chocolate stands, raking leaves, doing extra chores, selling outgrown toys and clothes and more to earn money to purchase mittens, hats and gloves for children in Appalachia. For the 5th year, the children donated over 500 items to our Mitten & Hat Tree Drive.



During Advent, the fifth graders put on our Prayer Service and Play based upon the Huron Indian Tale of Jesus' birth and 50 families ioined us for our annual Breakfast with St. Nicholas! In the Spring, families participated in our Family Faith Event and learned about the 7 sacraments of our Church during our open house. Lent was kicked off in our classroom program with an Ash Wednesday prayer service and they participated in another challenge to participate in our "Jesus, our way through Lent" program. This Lenten challenge encouraged the children to make a Lenten sacrifice and use the money saved from that sacrifice to donate alms for our sponsorship of a child through Child Fund and two children through our Haiti Twinning relationship.



The Families finished off the year with three summer family events and the most exciting week at St. Mike, Vacation Bible School which featured a Shipwrecked theme this year (Rescued by Jesus).

This has been a transition year for EDGE as we said farewell to Laura Stapleton and welcomed our new Assoc. Youth Advocate, Peyton Thomasson. Peyton comes to us from the deep south of Mobile. Alabama. As a recent graduate of Auburn University, where she majored in communications, Peyton has felt called by the Lord to pursue a vocation in youth ministry. In college, she spent time as a FOCUS Student Leader, working with small groups of college Catholics, as well as leading bible studies. She also just recently completed a pilgrimage to Medjugorie, which she has described as life-changing, and has attributed to her call and desire to work in ministry. She comes to us with a great fire and hunger for her faith and the desire to pass that faith on to our youth!



Two standout events in 2018 included the EDGE Fall retreat with the theme "Awake O Sleeper." We specifically addressed how God spoke to Joseph of the Old Testament and Joseph of the New Testament through dreams. We were also very excited to receive lots of donations at our Christmas party. There were numerous gift bags decorated and filled with socks, gloves, and scarves for the homeless of Richmond. We gave out over 80 bags at Saint Peter's along with a warm meal. Our EDGE group also continues to collaborate and support other events like the St. Nicholas Breakfast and Give a Parent a Hand Babysitting Night.

IT'S OFFICIAL!! We moved into our new Home, the Lake House!



The teens love having their own space and are putting it to great use. Here is a recap of our year filled with activity:

In February, we officially moved into the Lake House as both the youth center and youth office finished construction. That very same weekend, our high school and middle school ministries raised a combined \$7,000 to help serve our chosen ministry this year, the Backpack Program in the Appalachian Twinning Ministry. Coupled with high energy events like our participation in the Diocesan Youth Conference and our annual Spring Retreat, our Sunday Life Night series consisted of looking at the Person of Christ and who He truly is, as well as a series on the Paschal Mystery and its importance for the salvation of humankind.



The summer months engaged us in our annual opportunities to serve the less fortunate at Diocesan Work Camp and to grow deeper in faith at a Steubenville Conference, while allowing plenty of opportunity to build new faith-based friendships at the White Water Rafting Retreat, Teen Discipleship Team Retreat, and annual Life Teen campfire social. Teens also spent time raising awareness of how our youth movement has been such an influence in their lives through our annual Youth 365 fundraiser, Teens had messages to share and pictures to show from their Life Teen experiences throughout that weekend. Through the generosity of our parish, nearly \$25,000 was raised to help 'fill the tank' in keeping our youth ministries and their vital outreach to our youth moving forward.



Fall and winter brought a new group of teens to the fold, while others began to carry the mantle of teen discipleship. Our kickoff at Camp Hanover had us on a 'relentless' search for treasure and we engaged in a series called 'The Fake News' as we sought to separate fact from fiction when it comes to overarching misconceptions about the Catholic faith and Jesus Christ. We even helped welcome a special guest, Fr. Dave Dwyer, to our parish during the fall mission- taking up the call to serve as greeters and ushers to help make the mission run smoothly and effectively.
