Commercial Loan on our school and gym roofs, outstanding balance as of August 26, 2016 is **\$211,215.46**, **down from the original note for \$420,202.05**. Way to go SPB! Slowly but surely we are lowering our debt! Thank you for your support of our monthly second collection, the first weekend, for the repayment of this loan. We average about \$4,000 a month toward the reduction of this loan, ending our parish debt.
