FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time: The liturgical year is rapidly coming to a close and a new one beginning. Jesus upholds the perseverance of our faith in this Gospel of Luke. God remains with us no matter what our struggles and difficulties – for this is a wonderful assurance. In a special way, I think it is important we keep in our thoughts those who are homebound reading the bulletin – so that they know we DO pray for them and hold them up in our hearts and minds. You are never far from us – and your struggles are our struggles. Our Communion Ministers at each Mass, who go out to bring the Eucharist, always remind us of the special "communion" and connection we have. We are

never isolated in our faith and we are blessed with this reminder in the Body of Christ.

Advent Preparation: Thinking of the end of this liturgical year reminds us to begin preparing for the coming new one. The other day I went in search of our Advent candles. Found some bargains! But it is quite difficult to get the colors we need for the Advent Season. The Book of Blessings does not mandate a color – but the traditional color has been a bluer violet. May I recommend that you use darker colors, if unable to find what you need, or even just 4 white candles. It's easier to then turn your Advent Wreath, at your home table, into a Christmas Wreath, with 3 candles for the 3 weeks of Christmas Time, with the reds, greens and whites candles that are readily available. Our bulletin will have a special insert for your family to pray and reflect upon. Advent is an important season of preparation and we will talk more about this in the future columns.

Interfaith Thanksgiving Service: Before we get to Advent, let's not forget our annual Thanksgiving celebrations, the first being our interfaith one with our Hillcrest neighbors and friends. This year it will be held at Saint Gregory Armenian Orthodox Church on Richmond Road (across from the Richmond Town Square). Please plan on joining us next Sunday, November 20, at 1:00 p.m. Who ever hosts designs the liturgical service. The pastor, Fr. Hratch assures us that it will be about an hour long, for their community will have already celebrated a Lord's Day Divine Liturgy that lasts 2 hours long.

MAKE IT A DOUBLE!

St. Paschal's next blood drive will be Sunday, Dec. 4th, from 8:30a.m. -1:30 p.m. in the Eymard Room. LifeShare will offer *two* Power Red machines at this drive, allowing us to accommodate more double-red blood cell (2RBC) donors. Please consider a 2RBC donation if you are eligible. This process safely extracts twice as many red cells (the most frequently-needed component of whole blood), and returns the rest to the donor. Among its many benefits are:

<u>Twice the progress in reaching goals</u>: A single 2RBC donation counts as two units in qualifying for our \$500 school grant and Loyal for Life rewards!

<u>Efficiency & comfort for the donor</u>: It may take a bit longer to make a 2RBC donation than whole blood, but you'll save time by making one trip instead of two. A smaller needle is used, and you'll lose less volume because the plasma, platelets, and a hydrating boost of saline is returned to you as you donate.

<u>Lower risk & cost for the recipient</u>: Whenever someone receives a transfusion, there's always some potential for a negative reaction. Patients receiving multiple units of blood benefit by being exposed to a fewer number of donors. Costs are also lower when two units of blood can be tested/processed only once.

Not everyone is eligible to be a 2RBC donor. Eligibility depends on your height, weight, iron level and blood type. In general, types O+, O-, and A+ blood are preferred for double-red donations, but this can vary with current blood supply inventories.
