FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



 32^{nd} Sunday in Ordinary Throughout Time: liturgical year and the prayers and readings of the Mass, we are reminded how we are "torchbearers." At baptism, we are given "a flame to be kept burning brightly," symbolized in the candle we hold/have, that reminds us of our faith. In our Gospel today, we are reminded that we carry our lamp of light and faith, to be prepared for the LORD's We are invited to return. reflect on this readiness and the wisdom of God that guides us while we wait.

Preparing for Advent: These readings today are repeated during Advent Time, for we recall today and during this liturgical season how we are in a "waiting game," or a waiting room here on earth, doing so much to manifest the reign of God until Christ returns in glory. Today's second reading helps us recall our preparedness, but also helps explain why we wait. Let us pray for patience and assistance in keeping our faith going, letting not the flame dim, but remembering that through our service and care of one another, we make present the LORD and "console one another" as we patiently wait.

<u>Did I Take All the Candles?</u> This paragraph is more about preparing for Advent. I always do my Advent Wreath Candle shopping early and I know that at the store I shopped, I got all the candles. (I hope that there will be more available.) It's getting more challenging to find Advent wreath candles, just as it is difficult to celebrate the season of Advent.
