

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Due to the holiday schedule, parts of this bulletin were prepared Saturday, February 10.

2nd Sunday of Lent: We walk with Abraham, Isaac, Peter, James and John this weekend up a mountain with God. As Sister Verna Holyhead SGS writes in Give Us This Day, page 259 for February 2018: Every disciple in every age has to learn what Peter, James, and John learned on the Mountain of the Transfiguration: Following Jesus [Christ] is not about comfort and security but about daring to hammer the tent pegs of our lives into the mystery of Christ, with a readiness to strike camp and move on when He calls.

When we listen to God, we hear how He calls Jesus, his beloved Son – and that we are called to be God's beloved children. We listen and pay attention to what matters most in our journeys. We may not know the whole story of our lives yet. But we do know that our journey of going up and down mountains is happening, and through our trials, suffering, joys and listening, we become more of what God wants us to be. We always have to be ready for the next thing, knowing that God will be there with us.

Through our Art & Environment Committee, Jeff Loerch has assisted us again with a beautiful banner that I hope you will watch week to week and notice how it transforms. Like the scriptures, we are rooted in Christ, but this season "uproots us" and changes us and even "transfigures" us.

<u>Catholic Charities Appeal:</u> Have you made your commitment and pledge to Catholic Charities? Our diocese can be so proud of what we do in this outreaching ministry serving at least 400,000 people a year with 150 services at 60 locations across 8 counties. Our parish goal this year is \$152,307. I am confident that we will make this goal, with each parishioner participating in some way – through prayer, sacrificing a cup of coffee or a meal to send in a donation to support our important ministry of the church of Cleveland. Help us meet our goal, but more importantly, help us be merciful and transform other lives as ours have been transformed in Christ's love. YOU BRING MERCY and God to others by your support of these valuable ministries.

Rite of Sending Communion Ministers to the Homebound and Sick: Back in 2009, Bishop Lennon and the Diocese of Cleveland enacted a ritual at the end of the Communion Rite that you see some parishes in the diocese follow, as we do at SPB. Nancy Rufo < Nrufol@gmail.com coordinates this ministry for us, so that even when family members who come forward are not able to minister, others may assist in bringing the Eucharist. This is a special ritual. If you do not already have a copy of it, we invite you to request one after Mass, from one of the priests in the sacristy. Other folks may carry out this ministry, and we are always looking for assistance for people who do not have family to minister. Here is the outline of the ritual for those who are homebound or in a nursing home:

- Optional use of holy water from the baptismal font
- Share at least one of the readings from Mass (usually the Gospel and there are missalettes to borrow)
- Share the homily you heard at Mass
- Ask if there are prayers or prayer requests
- The LORD'S Prayer
- The Invitation to Communion: Showing the host and saying, "Behold the Lamb of God"

- Distribute Holy Communion
- Silence
- Prayer after Holy Communion
- Blessing

If you do not have a pyx, you may purchase one at one of the religious good stores or borrow one from the sacristy. This is an important outreach and healing ministry of our parish. You keep our parishioners in communion with us! And, of course, you bring bulletins, the parish newsletter *Paschal Life*, and other handouts so that they may continue to share in the life of the parish. You may also teach them how to use the parish website and "e-giving!" \odot Thank you for this special ministry of service, continuing the Communion Rite of Mass to those who are in communion in their homes.

<u>Parish Mission</u>: I know you are looking forward to being with me this week for our parish mission. You can't miss the great picture of my friend, Fr. Tom on the cover of the bulletin. Fr. Tom was just appointed by Pope Francis to serve on a commission for evangelization. So he is that good – and joyful – and funny! Hopefully he will not reveal too many secrets from our seminary days. Fr. Tom will be at all the Sunday Masses. Please plan on being present each evening, 7:00 p.m. Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday as we deepen our love and understanding of the sacraments of the church. We thank in advance the Welcome Committee for providing a reception after Mass.

Question & Answer: Recently someone asked me: Does the "Confiteor" of Mass count as going to confession and have the same weight as going to the sacrament? The answer is no. However, we have plenty of times to receive the sacrament of reconciliation, like this Wednesday from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. here or around the diocese; by an appointment with one of the priests; by dropping in during office hours to the special celebration of the sacrament in the Reconciliation Room in the parish offices; Saturday afternoon at 3:30 p.m.; or through the communal celebrations that are coming up in a few weeks and mentioned elsewhere in the bulletin.

Happy Lent and let's continue to pray for each other!
