Recognizing our strengths and weaknesses, we turn to God. He has the remedy for everything. It is simple. If we just turn to Jesus, the bread of life, He will bring us this inner healing, this spiritual healing, so that we can live our lives in a way that makes God smile. GOD IS GOOD ALL THE TIME. ALL THE TIME GOD IS GOOD.


THE JOURNEY . . . A WAY TO DEEPEN YOUR EXPERIENCE OF JESUS

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



20th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Today's first reading from Proverbs is one of my favorite, plus it is the words to a few Eucharistic songs that I also love. It is a wonderful image of Wisdom, and Wisdom (a word and imagery for God) invites us to feed on God's food and drink of wine. Eating and drinking is essential to our everyday life and existence. We wouldn't say, "Oh, it's boring to eat breakfast, or I get tired of the same routine, or I don't get anything out of this meal." We eat and are grateful for what is given to us, for we are blessed and hopefully say a prayer before and after meals. I bring up these comments, for an

obvious reason. I think of our homebound people who long to be back at the "table of plenty," feeding off Wisdom, Sunday after Sunday here at church. They miss coming to church and being with the community. Thank God we have our Eucharistic ministers who keep them connected through the sharing of the meal through this special ministry and commissioning that happens at each Mass here at SPB.

God continues to invite us to eat of Wisdom! We do so, knowing that Wisdom will shape us, make us strong for the house of God and the house of the world. We advance in Wisdom together as the Body of Christ knowing that this "true bread and true drink" feed us into eternal life!

<u>Summer Routines:</u> This is our last Sunday before school begins again for so many, especially our own day school students. AC too Cold? It's difficult worshipping in a Light House, isn't it? Of course that's the design of the church, fulfilling the scripture passage, a city puts it lamp out for all to see! However, our church is more like a green house! For the last three years, we have turned the heat off in the summer to save energy and costs. This is one reason why at the early 8:00 a.m. Mass it may feel a little chilly for some. You are just feeling the natural, filtered (dehumidified) air circulating at that time of the day. The AC does not kick in until the middle of the 10:00 a.m. Mass, due to all the hot air! © Both warm bodies and sun, again think of the greenhouse, kick on the AC. And we love your singing and participation to warm up the building.

The church is also set at the industry standard – like at a store at the shopping center. But, like a grocery store, you shouldn't hang out in the open fridge places/frozen food section. Just a kind reminder I share each year: don't walk on the vents around the church when you come into Mass or leave and you won't "get" or "feel" cold. It's like walking in the frozen food freezers. Walk straight up the aisle, and then go into your pew this way and around. We only have a few weeks left until we do put the heat back on. I'm sure you do the same in your own home to save energy costs, and we appreciate that suggestion from some of our parishioners.

<u>Annual Parish Picnic:</u> Special thanks to the Knights of Columbus, Welcoming Committee and our Youth Group for leading the food and fun for our parish picnic. I also am grateful to the liturgical ministers, especially our musicians and ushers, for the change of venue is a LOT of work for them and we appreciate the time commitment that they make, led by Dick and John, our head ushers.

Preparing for Leadership Day: Each year we have new leaders in our ministry who join forces with our great teams of disciples, our current leaders, fulfilling our pastoral plan's dreams and goals.
