Palm Sunday of the LORD'S Passion: I'll never forget a dramatic class in the seminary that I had with a professor – whom you got to meet during our parish mission © - who said this is all that needs to be said for this special day in the church:

Christ's procession with the cross is our procession with the cross! Christ's suffering with the cross is our suffering with the cross! Christ's dying on the cross is our dying on the cross. Christ's rising from the cross is our rising from our cross!

"Were you there?" Heck! We are living it! And may this passion day and holy week, with the most beautiful liturgies of the year, be the place where we find Christ right with us in our own transformation and paschal mystery. I look forward to seeing you each day this week at our services! This Saturday is the "Super Bowl" of all liturgies: no regular confessions at 3:30 p.m. nor 4:30 p.m. Mass. The "Mother of all Vigils" is at <u>8:30 p.m.</u> What a night ahead!

Children's Liturgy of the Word at 2 Masses Starting June 1: We have had the rich enjoyment of more families attending the 4:30 p.m. Saturday Mass. Beginning on June 1, we will add Liturgy of the Word with children to this Mas. For those unfamiliar with seeing this celebration regularly at the 10:00 a.m. Mass since June 2010, here's how it goes:

- In the opening procession of the Mass, a child carries the candle and another child carries the *Lectionary for Masses with Children*, an approved liturgical translation to form young Catholic Christians. (It's the Sunday readings at their level.)
- After the Collect (Opening Prayer), the children are called up into the sanctuary and process to the Eymard Room.
- During their time in the Eymard Room (and parents, grandparents and other family members are welcome to also attend and walk over with the children), the children have an adult leader who helps them hear the scriptures, reflect on God's Word and complete an activity that brings out the theme or meaning of the readings for that Sunday.
- During the Preparation of the Gifts, the children and family members return to the church for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Tricia Slemc has led this for 9 wonderful years at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Even though her children have not been part of the "dismissal" and CLW for the last 2 years, she's continued to organize this ministry for us. We are so grateful and are so happy she will continue to assist as a catechist-leader and substitute. We have wonderful catechist leaders who assist at 10:00 a.m. Mass and now expanding this ministry this summer to assist families who go to either Mass.
