24th Sunday in Ordinary Time: The parable "of the prodigal" is a familiar reminder of how generous our God is with all of us. While the adjective of "prodigal" has been used to describe the son who spends recklessly, there is also another use for this adjective: generous. And don't we have a very generous God? Our questions for ourselves this week are: Are we being reckless or generous? And in what way? – for we can be, as one put it to me recently, to be reckless with "just loving everyone."

Put another way, being generous with time for watching video games, but not in spending time with the family. So you see, these words can be used for their intent, but also how we may be called to truly be. The parable reminds us that God give us everything: "everything I have is yours." The question is will we celebrate and rejoice with this, act much alive, or still be resentful, lost and prodigal in holding on to anger and more negative attributes? Let's be like the "prodigal" Father!

Reminder – Still in the Midst of the Capital Campaign: Together, "forward in faith, and hope, and love," we have been slowly making progress with our plan to replace all of the paved surfaces of the campus. The other day, a parishioner asked me, "What will it take to get this done, and can we get it done in time for winter?" My response, in seriousness, "We are hoping for a special angel who would love to underwrite the project and get it done – or at least win the lottery and share the profits." We are almost at 40% of our goal. As we have the funds, we have completed projects, as you have seen. And we are sure enjoying the results! The rest of the driveway and the west parking lot/playground for school is next on our agenda. Let's work at this 200K (the cost for both of these areas) to get it completed! Thank you for your support!

<u>Parish Debt:</u> Meanwhile, thanks for your support of the second collection each month! Your support of this second collection on the first Sunday of the month continues to regularly chip away at our debt. As I mention quite frequently to folks in person: our parish has no savings. This is why the diocesan finance council and Bishop Perez wished for us to raise our funds in advance of projects to be cost effective, frugal and not incur additional debt. Our ministry organizations, like Helping Hands, PTO, Ladies Guild have a lot of funds in their savings accounts that are sufficient for their ministries and needs. So, thanks for keeping that in mind as we build our parish legacy for the future and support the parish ministries in general that do not benefit from their own collections or fund raising.

<u>2020 Pilgrimage to Hungary & Poland:</u> Next September 11 – 23 in Budapest, the quad annual International Eucharistic Congress will take place. It's a week-long retreat held in a special city, with special talks, Masses, Eucharistic processions and more. For a few days after this event, I would like to see some of the other shrines and special sites in Poland, and specifically, some of those that are special to Saint John Paul II. Please let me know if you would like to be part of this 13-day adventure. (I need 12 people to make this possible!)
