28th Sunday in Ordinary Time: On Monday, Canada celebrates Thanksgiving. This weekend's readings would be an ideal reflection as they focus on gratitude. A holiday always gives us a day to rest and be grateful. However, I do not think that God wishes for us to ever take a holiday from being grateful people. Each day, each Eucharist is an opportunity to have the great Thanksgiving feast with one another, united in prayer to God. Several authors, psychologists and other healing professionals say that one of the necessary steps

for healing is to be grateful. When one seeks gratitude and sees the blessings in **everything**, no matter the sorrow or challenge, our attitude changes us. One must be disciplined to see the blessings and be grateful. Wise folks say it is helpful to begin and end each day in prayer with God, focusing on three thankful things. Have you heard of the quilt of gratitude? It's 365 days of putting together a piece of cloth with something grateful on it, so that in a year you have this huge quilt that then you give away to someone. A nice visual reminder of the daily thrust that is ours as we weave together our blessings and recognize that they are God's daily gifts.

Silent Sorrow: Last year we had a special Mass and prayers during Respect Life month for those who have lost a child or who have not been able to have children. We will do this again this year on **Sunday, October 27 at Noon**. Bishop Perez, also having a Mass and prayers **for those suffering from Miscarriage, Infertility, and Neo-Natal Death** at the Cathedral of Saint John downtown, Sunday, October 20, 2019, at 5:30 p.m. These Silent Sorrow Masses are offered to assist parents in their grief and console them with the blessing of God.

Welcoming New Parishioners: Each parishioner has a Christian duty to be welcome and inviting of others to our parish – it's what disciples of Christ do! We appreciate when you take the time to introduce your family members and friends who are visiting, but also when you bring new people to our church. Keep inviting! In a special way, we will welcome those folks who have newly registered in the last year to a special reception on **Sunday, October 27, 10:00 a.m. Mass and following**. In the unfortunate event that a new parishioner fell through the cracks, for you are joining a "non-perfect parish," please call the office to let us know that you will be attending. You will enjoy a wonderful brunch by our Welcoming Committee.

Sunday/Weekday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest: We are blessed in this part of the country, especially the Diocese of Cleveland and with the Blessed Sacrament Community here at SPB, that the special ritual developed by the church is rarely celebrated. Each Sunday, however, mostly in rural areas, parishes celebrate a ritual to gather as a community of faith even though their priest is not present. This represents almost 20% of the country. The Eucharist is central to our faith and "thanksgiving" to God. To help with the absence of an ordained priest, deacons and other lay people who are designated by the bishop or pastor are trained to be leaders of the liturgy for such occasions.

We will have a workshop, practicing and preparing for the unlikely event of a priest being ill, or the time when you may go to a parish that does not have a priest (or some day when we do not have a priest for some important reason). Unfortunately, our two deacons are retired, for in many parishes, deacons are the next in leadership for the community's worship (in the church's structure). We have identified special leaders that you already see here in leadership roles in our parish. There are two structures or rituals, one when it is planned and not aware that a priest is not coming the community celebrates Morning or Evening Prayer with the distribution of Holy Communion (if enough for all present). The other is when it is sudden and the ritual, similar to a Mass, is celebrated without the Eucharistic Prayer.

- **Introductory Rites**

- There is an opening prayer and notice from the leader stating there is no priest available but that we are still united with Christ and other Christians to celebrate the LORD'S Day.
- The lay leader guides the prayer service from the pew and not from the presider's (priest) chair

- **Liturgy of the Word**

- Exactly like a Sunday or weekday Mass
- A reflection on God's Word may be said by the lay person another community leader, either reading a prepared text by the pastor or something available in the many homily services.
- We still dismiss catechumens and proclaim the Creed with the Universal Prayers

- **Communion Rite**

- The leader of prayer retrieves the ciborium with the Blessed Sacrament from the tabernacle. The other communion ministers gather around the altar as they would for Mass.
- After the ciborium is placed on the altar, the LORD'S Prayer is sung or recited.
- There is **no Sign of Peace at this point**
- There is the Invitation to Holy Communion: "Behold the Lamb of God..."
- Communion (with the congregation singing as usual)
- Act of Thanksgiving

- **Concluding Rite**

- Announcements
- Collection
- Prayer for Vocations
- A word of blessing by the lay leader
- Sign of Peace
- Closing Song

Reviewing this ritual, you see how the church developed it a little differently so that folks would be aware that this is different than a Mass, and of course, is not a Mass. If there are not enough hosts in the ciborium then the entire communion rite is omitted, **but there still is a collection!** ☺ (As some would say, it's not a Catholic service without a collection – but seriously, you know we need the financial support to keep our great parish going.) I hope you are able to participate in this workshop on Sunday, October 27. We will also have another chance **Sunday, January 12** .

Let's continue to pray for each other and the success of our capital campaign and pastoral planning process.
