FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...



SOLEMNITY OF SAINT PETER JULIAN EYMARD:

Because of the Blessed Sacrament Community (SSS) administering this parish, we have a special solemnity that is part of our liturgical calendar and may be celebrated on Sunday. The readings for this Sunday are:

- + Acts: 4:32-35: They were of one mind and heart
- + Psalm 33: Taste and see the goodness of the LORD
- + Romans 8:35, 37-39: What will separate us from the LOVE of Christ?
- + Gospel: John 15:1-8 The one who remains in me will bear much

These readings were chosen by church leaders to exemplify the life of Saint Peter Julian Eymard and an aspect of Eucharistic living. The Eucharist keeps the vine together, bring us unity, helps us remain committed to one another and bear fruit. The Acts reading reminds that living the Eucharist makes us want to be of "one mind and one heart" and to not claim anything as one's own. A great stewardship message in a time when it's hard for us as American, who want our "own rights" and individual liberties, but also are challenged by the Christian, Gospel culture of these readings: we are the Body of Christ. As Paul says, and we know well, what effects one part of the Body of Christ, effects us all. This pandemic brings this home, with one infection going a long way to harm others. The Eucharist – the living of the Mass, should always help strengthen our body but also the whole Body of Christ. Our Eucharist is with Christ, the head of the Body, but also with the rest of the Body of Christ, our brothers and sisters, here and there. We, together, will only bear fruit, and grow as a body when we remain in Christ's message, life and witness. This is the challenge of Eucharistic living. It's the challenge that Saint Peter Julian reminded us of in the 19th century and a message that rings true today as we "remain in [the LORD] and bear much fruit."

ASSUMPTION CELEBRATIONS: We love Mary! As usual we will have special celebrations to honor the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven. While this is not a day of obligation this year, because it is on a Saturday, and for that matter the obligation to attend Sunday Mass has been dispensed, or relaxed until COVID is over, we still will have our regular Holy Day of Celebration.

- Friday, August 14: 4:30 p.m. (Vigil, with the vigil readings)
- Saturday, August 15: 9:00 a.m. or 12:15 p.m. (with the day readings)

Thanks for planning on attending if healthy and able. We will be looking into livestreaming it through our Facebook page.

LIVESTREAMING: We appreciate the anonymous donation and regular special donations to the efforts to have a new camera system to improve our regular broadcasts of our liturgies and talks in the church. It's ordered and the cameras ready. However, due to the tremendous backlog of schools that are also installing cameras in their schools for simultaneous learning, we are on a list and pray that we will have the system up and running soon. Our Masses and other celebrations (Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours) and future talks (parish missions and band concerts, etc.) will be able to be shared now, thanks to people not only here physically in our parish, but also across the country who have sent in a little donation. We appreciate everyone's effort.

PRAYERS FOR OUR NEW BISHOP: We look forward to getting to know our new bishop, the Most Reverend Edward Malesic. He will be installed as our new bishop on Monday, September 14 at a special Mass at the Cathedral of Saint John the Evangelist. The event, due to COVID restrictions, will be Livestreamed so that all may participate in this way.

CANCELLED PARISH PICNIC - STILL HONORING FR. ROGER:

Due to city and diocesan restrictions that have been extended to outdoor gatherings with food and the health and safety of our parishioners, we will not have a parish picnic at Highland Heights City Park, nor on Green Knight Field. You have probably read about the other festivals and parish picnics in the state and diocese that are not allowed this year. This is extended to us. While it's sad we cannot truly honor Fr. Roger and his 90th birthday in this special way, we will still have a special 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass for him, on his actual birthday, Sunday, August 16. If you are unable to attend, please do mail him a card or well wish through email (rbourgeois41@gmail.com) to share your greeting and wish him good health and well wishes for the next 90 years.

BANNERS & LAWN MESSAGES: We are grateful to Jeffrey Loerch, our artist, and the printing company for being finally able to complete our banners for the 7 Corporal Works of Mercy. (This company has been printing materials for the COVID emergency - banners across NE Ohio that were a priority.) What was meant to be a Lenten exercise in our faith, became an elongated project. We are not just supposed to practice the works of mercy in Lent, but all year. This is why they are remaining up in the church at this time. I am grateful to the 12 parish groups that made their banners; we look forward to the rest of them, with the materials in the parish front office if you still need this. For Easter, we wanted to highlight our call to service and especially our different parish ministries that need our gifts and talents to grow and serve the Body of Christ. Thanks for inquiring into these ministries and the others that are located on the parish website. Lastly, you hopefully got to see the video from the Hillcrest Interfaith Ministerial Association in which all the ministers in our area participated as we stand together to support one another and end racism in our country. The Social Action Commission followed up with signs that are on our Wilson Mills lawn, reminding us that racism has no home here and we are all welcome here at SPB.

OUR NEW THEME: Each year, we have a special theme to highlight our pastoral plan and vision for the coming year. We have enjoyed "Forward in Faith, Hope & Love," especially as we continue to complete our driveways and parking lots and make them safer. The suggestion for our new theme comes from Principal Diane Raguz and also the fact that our church building is 50 years old in 2021. We want to celebrate the vison of Richard Fleishman and Fr. John O'Brien, SSS that, with the song and prayer Principal Raguz proposed helps us to "go forth and light our world." Our church is a lighthouse design to remind us that we are to be the light for the world. You will hear the song from time to time throughout the coming year, but especially with our PSR and school students as we learn to follow our baptismal, discipleship commitment to be the light of Christ in the darkness of our world.

OUR STAFF: As you know, this has been a challenging year for us. Beginning last September, I alerted the parish to the financial struggles we have had since August 2018. That was a significant time in the US church, for when the Pennsylvania Report, recounting 75 years of child abuse cases and settlements, a new generation, stopped coming to church and donating, and even in our parish family. The major sins and crimes of a few have effected the Body of Christ - and we all suffer in so many ways. Since that report, parishes across the nation, like ourselves have struggled with affordable expectations. In February, we saw the "writing on the wall," with the unknown virus taking over our country, fear swept families from coming to church and donating to our parish's life. We had to immediately lay off staff on March 19, due to this financial crisis. I am happy that we have made huge strides to turn around our budget and reduce our expenses by almost \$250,000.00 to cope. Plus - YOU HAVE COME THRU, YOU FAITHFUL PARISHIONERS - to support our parish once again and our ministries and expenses. I cannot thank you enough. Our cost cutting measures were challenging and not easy; we have had to permanently lay off so many we loved to continue with the new realities of parish life and at the same time try and keep our goals and vision strong.

More importantly, I cannot thank our Pastoral Staff enough. You regularly read their names in the bulletin. These are tremendously hard workers, caring for all of us to make sure we have the best parish in NE Ohio. Each aspect of our parish's life is in good hands due to their loving sacrifices and care they show. We have all lost a lot of sleep during this anxious and uncertain time. We appreciate your prayers and stewardship to work together to build the kingdom of God here at SPB. You have been so kind to me to share your gratitude and appreciation. However, our pastoral staff has been extremely dedicated too. I hope you will join with me in sharing a thank you by calling or writing a message of gratitude to THEM. They are our true heroes and great responders to living God's love and showing it all they do for us in their ministry and work. Let's continue to pray for them and for one another.

A lot to catch up with as we start another parish life year together! Saint Peter Julian Eymard, pray for us! Saint Paschal Baylon, pray for us!




