OUR PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...

31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today, we reflect on the basic commands to living our Christian faith and not being far from the "Kingdom of God." To love God, love ourselves, and love our neighbor as we love ourselves. It's the practice of loving that is so challenging. God's reign is in our midst, our life when we do love. How often have we seen one of the saints do this, or we read their writings and how they struggled into loving and in their relationship with God? It's a process of becoming more and more God's gift of love. We are called into this perfect communion of love from the Eucharist each time we participate. That's why we are "obliged," or "hinged" (another root word from the tradition of the obligation language) to come to Sunday Mass, receive Holy Communion and live the Mass in the world. We do this to stay in communion with the true love, the Godhead who calls us to practice this loving. Let us be patient with loving. Let us learn from God who is all-loving, creates the all-loving, and creates all

things to be loved. We must be growing to love others as we have the difficult task of first even loving ourselves!

CATHOLIC TRADITION OF OFFERING MASSES FOR THE DEAD: Each year at this time, we remember those who have died and our tradition of sharing a stipend as a gift to the priest for remembering or offering a Mass for our deceased loved one. Here's a bit of Catholic trivia that I would like to share. One of our special Catholic traditions that we faithful do at this time of the year is to remember those who have died with a special Mass – an intention that is a special remembrance – which can be part of every Mass. This Mass and remembrance of the person may be on the person's birthday, wedding anniversary, the anniversary of a death, or some other special occasion in your family's life to mark our remembrance of the deceased's life on earth.

Through the Mass, where we believe our prayers at our altar unite ourselves with "those who have gone before us in faith." We celebrate the great gift the person was on the earth and the communion of the saints in heaven. Each Mass unites heaven and earth through the special prayers of the Eucharistic Prayer. Therefore, we go as often as we can to Mass (especially for our Sunday obligation) – to keep in touch with those who have lived their faithful Christian life on earth.

I am sure you have viewed the animated movie "Coco." (If you haven't – please make sure you do with a box of facial tissue!) Through this movie, we were able to see the great history of the "day of the dead," November 2, when we take the time on this day to commemorate the dead. It's also a day we schedule our Masses for the people we have lost and loved for the coming year. (Or, if not on this day, when available to come to the parish office.)

This tradition comes from the Bible, when the Jewish people, in the Book of Second Maccabees 12:43-46, acknowledged those who died in God's grace and offered special prayers back to God in gratitude. We, as Christians, have kept this tradition and built upon it over the centuries. Saints (like Saint Monica to her son Saint Augustine) said to their family members, "Remember me at the altar of the LORD." Relics of the saints were placed in altars to unite the sacrifice or prayers of the Mass with the holy person who had gone before them. (Our church altar has three saints' relics: Saints Paul, Peter Julian Eymard, Paschal Baylon, and Rose of Lima.

As we come to November, it's a chance for us to remember in a special way, through an "All Souls" envelope, spiritual bouquet, and intention for a Mass stipend this "holy soul" that has gone to God. Throughout the year, we keep this person holy in our lives. This is another reason why there is no such belief in "last rites," because, as discussed in the movie "Coco," these folks' lives last forever as we remember them here on earth, especially with a Holy Mass.

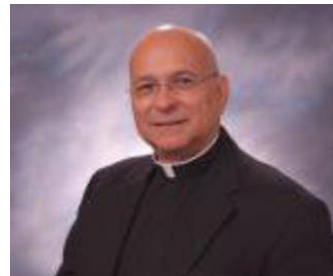
