OUR PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT (C): Each year, on the Second Sunday of Lent, we hear a version of the Transfiguration of the LORD. With the other readings, we hear about how we are chosen by God and are beloved. God chose Abraham and all the generations since, like the multitude of stars. We are chosen for our citizenship in heaven. God has chosen us, and for this reason, we cannot help but give thanks and praise back to God. (That's why we worship together on Sundays at the Eucharist, in case you wanted to share the reason why we have to go to church on Sunday.)

Now Peter, like us, likes to stay put, or in one place. That's why

he wanted to savor the moment on Mount Tabor and be with the glory at that site. Instead, we take the glory, leave the mountain top experience, and bring that to others. We are called, as the chosen, to be just as dazzling: living our faith in all its glory. Who have you shared your faith with lately? It could be in an unexpected place, in line, at the restaurant, car wash or any number of other places. This is not the time to stay silent; bring folks to the glory of our Church, gather around the altar, and take in the glory of God through our Eucharistic meal. We will be transfigured by it!

I am grateful to our lead sacristans – for weekdays, Sue, and for weekends, George, who regularly keep us together. Sacristan Emeritus Joe Petre –ca continues his behind-the-scenes work ordering our supplies for Mass – and because of him, you love those “black” or “blue” or “white” books to prepare you each day for praying with God. We get more and more each year and love that you use them. Next year, we will purchase even more for the multitudes who enjoy.

A NEW GENERATION – ALTAR SERVER TRAINING

RESUMES: Anyone who has received their First Communion (2nd grade and older) is eligible to serve God and the parish by becoming an Altar Server. Some of them remember when there were tests and tryouts, memorization, drills, etc., that forbid many from the experience of serving at the altar. I have never had any restrictions to becoming an altar server, welcoming those interested to begin ASAP, only ability being to hold a candle or cross. All grade and high school youth are encouraged to try being an altar server. It's time to revive this ministry and our family's participation in the Mass. Training will be:

- **Tuesday, April 26, 2:30-3:15 p.m.** in church and the following Tuesdays in May: 3, 17, 24 & 31 if necessary. Installation will be on **Sunday, June 5, at the 10:30 a.m. Mass.**

And if unable to attend these training sessions, there is a video online to prepare and meet with Fr. Lane during our regular Sunday Masses to have “on-the-job training.” Please let Kathryn or Fr. Lane/me know!

DIOCESE STATISTICS: In my monthly meeting with the Presbyteral Council and Bishop Malesic, I review the trends of our population and sacramental celebrations. Our recent numbers share a story of demographic shifts; those who choose not to have the marriage celebrated in the Church, and much more. I know from the hospitals and this report that fewer children are born in our area. I highlight here many statistics, but please notice the Baptisms and the number of students in PSR:

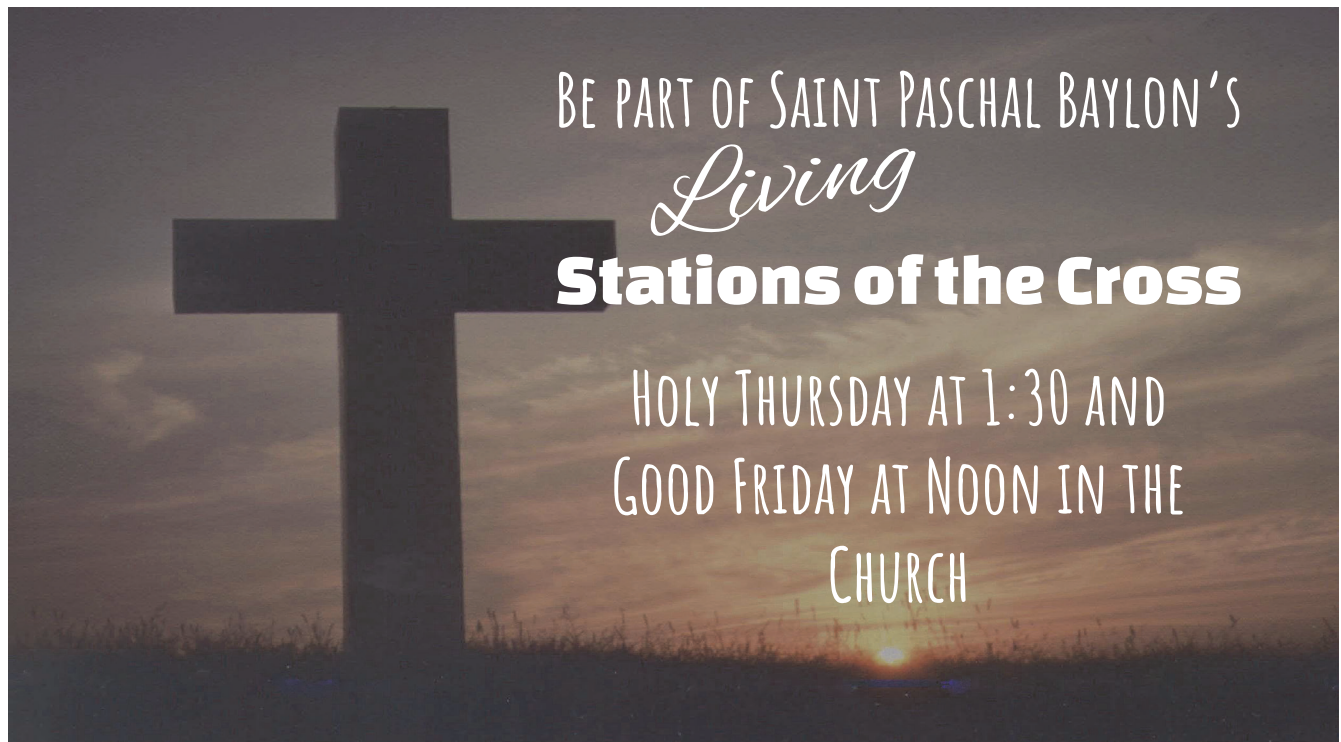

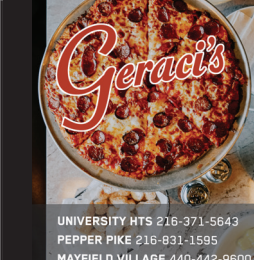
