OUR POPE & BISHOP'S REQUEST



PLEASE PRAY THIS ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY, BASILICA OF SAINT PETER – published for 25 MARCH 2022:

O Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, in this time of trial we turn to you. As our Mother, you love us and know us: no concern of our hearts is hidden from you. Mother of mercy, how often we have experienced your watchful care and your peaceful presence!

You never cease to guide us to Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

Yet we have strayed from that path of peace. We have forgotten the lesson learned from the tragedies of the last century, the sacrifice of the millions who fell in two world wars. We have disregarded the commitments we made as a community of nations. We have betrayed peoples' dreams of peace and the hopes of the young. We grew sick with greed, we thought only of our own nations and their interests, we grew indifferent and caught up in our selfish needs and concerns. We chose to ignore God, to be satisfied with our illusions, to grow arrogant and aggressive, to suppress innocent lives and to stockpile weapons. We stopped being our neighbor's keepers and stewards of our common home. We have ravaged the garden of the earth with war and by our sins we have broken the heart of our heavenly Father, who desires us to be brothers and sisters. We grew indifferent to everyone and everything except ourselves. Now with shame we cry out: Forgive us, Lord!

Holy Mother, amid the misery of our sinfulness, amid our struggles and weaknesses, amid the mystery of iniquity that is evil and war, you remind us that God never abandons us, but continues to look upon us with love, ever ready to forgive us and raise us up to new life. He has given you to us and made your Immaculate Heart a refuge for the Church and for all humanity. By God's gracious will, you are ever with us; even in the most troubled moments of our history, you are there to guide us with tender love.

We now turn to you and knock at the door of your heart. We are your beloved children. In every age you make yourself known to us, calling us to conversion. At this dark hour, help us and grant us your comfort. Say to us once more: "Am I not here, I who am your Mother?" You are able to untie the knots of our hearts and of our times. In you we place our trust. We are confident that, especially in moments of trial, you will not be deaf to our supplication and will come to our aid.

That is what you did at Cana in Galilee, when you interceded with Jesus, and he worked the first of his signs. To preserve the joy of the wedding feast, you said to him: "They have no wine" (*Jn* 2:3). Now, O Mother, repeat those words and that prayer, for in our own day we have run out of the wine of hope, joy has fled, fraternity has faded. We have forgotten our humanity and squandered the gift of peace. We opened our hearts to violence and destructiveness. How greatly we need your maternal help!

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT APRIL 3, 2022

Therefore, O Mother, hear our prayer.

- Star of the Sea, do not let us be shipwrecked in the tempest of war
- Ark of the New Covenant, inspire projects and paths of reconciliation.
- Queen of Heaven, restore God's peace to the world.
- Eliminate hatred and the thirst for revenge and teach us forgiveness.
- Free us from war, protect our world from the menace of nuclear weapons.
- Queen of the Rosary, make us realize our need to pray and to love.
- Queen of the Human Family, show people the path of fraternity.
- Queen of Peace, obtain peace for our world.

O Mother, may your sorrowful plea stir our hardened hearts. May the tears you shed for us make this valley parched by our hatred blossom anew. Amid the thunder of weapons, may your prayer turn our thoughts to peace. May your maternal touch soothe those who suffer and flee from the rain of bombs. May your motherly embrace comfort those forced to leave their homes and their native land. May your Sorrowful Heart move us to compassion and inspire us to open our doors and to care for our brothers and sisters who are injured and cast aside.

Holy Mother of God, as you stood beneath the cross, Jesus, seeing the disciple at your side, said: "Behold your son" (*Jn* 19:26). In this way he entrusted each of us to you. To the disciple, and to each of us, he said: "Behold, your Mother" (v. 27). Mother Mary, we now desire to welcome you into our lives and our history. At this hour, a weary and distraught humanity stands with you beneath the cross, needing to entrust itself to you and, through you, to consecrate itself to Christ. The people of Ukraine and Russia, who venerate you with great love, now turn to you, even as your heart beats with compassion for them and for all those peoples decimated by war, hunger, injustice, and poverty.

Therefore, Mother of God and our Mother, to your Immaculate Heart we solemnly entrust and consecrate ourselves, the Church, and all humanity, especially Russia and Ukraine. Accept this act that we carry out with confidence and love. Grant that war may end and peace spread throughout the world. The "Fiat" that arose from your heart opened the doors of history to the Prince of Peace. We trust that, through your heart, peace will dawn once more. To you we consecrate the future of the whole human family, the needs and expectations of every people, the anxieties and hopes of the world.

Through your intercession, may God's mercy be poured out on the earth and the gentle rhythm of peace return to mark our days. Our Lady of the "Fiat," on whom the Holy Spirit descended, restore among us the harmony that comes from God. May you, our "living fountain of hope," water the dryness of our hearts. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace. Amen.

OUR PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT: The dramatic scene of the woman caught in adultery reminds us of many things we are called to reflect upon. First of all, the mercy of Christ. Pope Francis reminds us often, especially during the Year of Mercy 2015-6, that Jesus Christ is the face of the Father of mercy. As Christ's followers, we have this same call to be the face of mercy. Christ had compassion for this woman. Speculation wonders what Jesus was writing in

the sand. Where was the man? How unjust were they to retrieve the woman? Why were they so quick to bring this woman to Jesus? Another trap? These questions, though, dodge the heart of the story! We live in a glass house – our award-winning church. As church members of SPB, we are not to throw stones.

Recently, I had the joy of installing new altar servers, who, with me, have had to train in creative ways. So proud of Ella, Brooklyn, Olivia, Mason, and Xavier. This photo, taken by George Zagar, shows two of the group.

Anyone who has received their First Communion (2nd grade and older) is eligible to serve God and the parish by becoming an Altar Server. Some may remember when there were tests and tryouts, memorization and drills that would forbid many from the experience of serving at the altar. I have never had any restrictions to becoming an altar server, welcoming those interested in beginning ASAP – or being able to hold a candle or cross. All grade and high school youth are encouraged to try being an altar server. It's time to revive this ministry and our family's participation in the Mass. Training will be:

- Tuesday, April 26, 2:30-3:15 p.m. in the church and the following Tuesdays in May: 3, 17, 24 & 31 if necessary. The installation will be on Sunday, June 5, at 10:30 a.m. Mass.

BECOME AN ALTAR SERVER FOR FUNERAL MASSES: Contact Andy Futey at 440-442-3410 to become a server for our funerals. Our excellent adult servers will train you; there is also a list of procedures that you may obtain from Father Lane in the sacristy.

NEXT SUNDAY – PALM SUNDAY: For the second year in a row, we will process within the church with our palms. Because we broadcast in the church to the masses, we will utilize all of our five cameras and share our liturgy with the world. Liturgical ministers and I will gather at the baptismal font to begin the liturgy. They will pass out the blessed palms to all of you at the beginning of Mass. Then, they with me, and if you so wish to join, will process from the font to the sanctuary. We thank in advance our Arts and Environment team that will set up the special scene for us at the font.

PART 3: GOOD FRIDAY – We continue our mystagogy about the Triduum and the importance of being part of each day of the Sacred Triduum. The three days are one liturgy, and after the evening liturgy, Good Friday morning begins with a very stark Morning Prayer (at 9:00 am in church). Our Youth Group presents the Stations of the Cross. (Due to copyright restrictions to two of the songs, THEY CANNOT be broadcast.) The heart of the day is the Liturgy of the LORD's Passion, either at 3:00 pm or 7:30 pm. During this liturgy (it's not a Mass), we recall the prophecy of the killing of the Christ through Isaiah, the first reading of the servant. We recall the Passion of Christ in the Gospel of John. We venerate the Holy Cross that brings us salvation. We may come forward to reverence the cross through a bow or genuflection. This ritual has been passed on since the 4th century, when pieces of the true cross were found

in Jerusalem. After our veneration, we share Holy Communion, consecrated from the night before. We stay nourished by the love of Christ, which flows from the altar of Calvary. We end in sacred silence, only to return the following morning for Holy Saturday Morning Prayer at 9:00 AM in church. It's one of our sacred days; it's one of our most important remembrances to thank God for giving His life for us.



SPECIAL TRIDUUM SPEAKER: One of my friends, who regularly preaches for Food for the Poor (and has been with us a few years back here at our church) will be with us for the Triduum. We welcome back guest preacher Dominican Father Scott Steinkerchner. Father Scott and I grew up here in Ohio and attended the University of Akron. We were called to

different religious orders. His family, especially his mom Arlene, still lives in Wadsworth, Ohio. We look forward to this special treat for the one liturgy over three days. Please come and enjoy listening to him.

OUR AWARD-WINNING SCHOOL

During the month of March, our fourth graders were immersed in learning about the Underground Railroad through unique experiences organized by their teachers, Miss Felice Ferrante, and Mrs. Moira Popelka. Both classes participated in an Underground Railroad Virtual Immersive Experience through the Ohio History Connection. Students were able to observe and speak to highly researched first-person interpreters who portrayed residents of Ohio Village to understand the Underground Railroad and the moral and social struggles surrounding the anti-slavery movement. Students asked each resident questions and took notes to help them identify the secret "conductor." In addition, students watched a dramatic performance of Harriet Tubman and the Underground Railroad streamed from Playhouse Square. Prior to the performance, students studied the Abolitionist Movement in social studies and read the book Who Was Harriet Tubman? by Yona Zeldis McDonough in language arts. The drama brought the Underground Railroad to life and paid tribute to this heroic American who freed herself from slavery and selflessly led hundreds of others to freedom. 
