REPEAT OF OUR STATISTICS: In case you missed our annual financial report and sacramental statistics that were in our August 14 bulletin for the finances and last week's bulletin for the numbers of our sacraments and parishioners. Tom Mohorcic thomasmohorcic@gmail.com or I are happy to address your questions and concerns. One question I received I now share the answer: The \$300K PPP loan/grant assisted us financially to get us back on our feet last year. These funds helped us to cover the deficit of the school that was almost \$225K. The revenue surplus was unusually high last year because of this PPP loan/grant. Sadly, we do not have any grants available like this for this year – unless you have a connection that we need to follow. We are grateful for your undying support of our awardwinning Catholic school and count on your support to assist with the \$250K budget deficit in this year's school budget.

TRIP TO THE HOLY LAND WITH FR. FICKEL: Speaking of Fr. Bill Fickel, presently pastor in Holiday, FL, he is opening up a 12-day pilgrimage to the Holy Land and Jordan for folks here to participate in. The days are March 6-17, 2023 and the cost starts at \$3,999.00 per person from Orlando, Florida airport. (The trip from here to Orlando would be extra.) You may contact him at wmfickel@aol.com.

OUR AWARD WINNING SPB SCHOOL NEWS




