

OUR PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

25TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today's readings offer us stark moments that call our stewardship into reflection. These readings, in a sense, are helpful to us during this Stewardship Month where we are focusing on our own time, talent and treasure. The readings give us pause to listen to the prophet Amos and see where our heart is in whom we serve, if we are people of thanksgiving and prayer, praising the Lord in all we do and how we serve God. Is our whole life focused on our possessions or wealth (mammon)? What is the wealth we should be building within our lives? Our Gospel will give us a parable that Jesus shows is a creative way of making things work for the betterment of all. Our lives are called to serve the common good and build our mammon for the good of all. True stewardship reminds us that we are here but to serve the gifts, talents and wealth God has blessed us with. May we always see our steward role as a gentle way of caring for ourselves, but more importantly, serving God and others.

REMINDERS ON THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL: At some of our Masses, we will be using our homemade "Paschal Bread." This is being made by a parishioner in conjunction with other parish ministries. When the gifts of bread and wine come forth in the presentation song, we say that these are works of our hands, to be transformed and become the Body of Christ. We

are better symbolizing the "work of our hands," us, as we bring forth the bread and wine that we have made for God to make holy and His real presence - His Body and Blood. Where I share Holy Communion, I will alert you to having the Paschal Bread. Other Communion stations will have Poor Clare Bread, made by the nuns on Euclid Avenue in downtown Cleveland and their manufacturing plant there. Other reminders as we ALL engage in our Eucharistic Revival:

- We will CONTINUE THE SINGLE LINE for receiving Holy Communion. We have many vulnerable adults who choose to be here because they know we are being cautious. Until after the cold and flu season (beginning of 2023?), we will continue this practice of one side of a section receiving in a single-file line.
- Please sing the Communion Song! Like what we do at birthday parties or sporting events, we sing those songs to unify and celebrate. That's the point of the Communion Song. Aren't we so blessed and joyous to be receiving the Real Body and Blood of Christ? Let's show it! Please do not keep from singing, as the song goes! This is part of our Eucharistic Revival - to participate in the Mass. Remember in school when we used to sing with gusto? Let's continue with the heart of a child!

GREEN KNIGHT TO REMEMBER: Our annual Gala planning is coming along! We are so grateful for all the gift cards, baskets and other items being donated for the auction to be held at La-Vera Party Center, Willoughby Hills, Friday, November 11, 6:30 PM. THANKS FOR CONTINUING TO ASK FOR DONATIONS!!! All donations and money raised goes to our award-winning Catholic school. Soon you'll be getting raffle tickets in the mail for this event. OUR AWARD WINNING SPB SCHOOL NEWS

It is with great pride that I share that Saint Paschal Baylon Catholic School was selected by The Ohio Academy of Science to receive the 2021-2022 Governor's Thomas Edison Award for Excellence in STEM Education and Student Research for the TENTH YEAR! 
