FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT FEBRUARY 26, 2023

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT: We once again go into the desert with Jesus to prepare for Lent. After four days (from Ash Wednesday to Saturday – this vestibule of preparation for the season) we begin the special counting with Christ of the 40 days of fasting, prayer and abstinence. We, like Christ, continue to be challenged with our temptations and trials that test our faith, but also bring us closer to God through our prayer and dedication. Temptations are not sins but

gateways of choice. We pray to always choose God's ways for ourselves and be transformed. We know for what we truly hunger: the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation. Let us pray for one another and support each other, especially through the many parish activities that guide our Lenten journey to become more of who we are: the Body of Christ.

RITE OF SENDING/ELECTION: As of the typing of this column, we celebrate with the following of the Rite of Sending to the Cathedral: Catechumens – Keilani Honeycutt and Cameron Fuller and Candidate – Tasha Stanley. Our parish celebrates at the 10:30

AM Mass this special rite of prayer, and we are also joined with parishes throughout the dioceses. We will then all gather at the Cathedral for a tour of this magnificent worship space: the mother church of our diocese. This is followed by the special rite where Bishop Malesic, who is the ordinary minister of the sacraments, states that those present are candidates for the sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Since ancient times, he then commissions us pastors throughout the diocese to perform the rituals of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion. All are welcome to attend the 5:30 ceremony tonight at the Cathedral; we expect your hospitality at the Sacred Triduum, but especially the Easter Vigil, Saturday, April 8, 8:00 PM.

CHRISTMAS EVE MASS UPDATE: Based on the surveys returned from the parishioners and the Pastoral Council, the Liturgy Commission decided to "make it easy." As we usually have the most important liturgy of the year, the Easter Vigil, at 8:00 pm, we will have our second evening Mass on Christmas also be at 8:00 pm. This will support our liturgical ministers (so that many will not have to attend two Masses), especially having our music groups together for a grand celebration like we do at the Easter Vigil. So, our Christmas Mass schedule for 2023 is as follows:

- 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT:
 - Saturday, December 23 Vigil: 4:30 рм
 - Sunday, December 24: 8:30 AM & 10:30 AM
- NATIVITY OF THE LORD (CHRISTMAS) Carols and music ½ hour before the services:
 - Sunday, December 24: 4:00 PM (Vigil Mass & Children's Choir) &
 8:00 PM (Mass at Night readings & Adult Christmas Choir)
 - Monday, December 25: 8:30 AM (Mass at Dawn) & 10:30 AM (Mass during the Day)
 - ◆ There is no 6:30 PM Mass this day

Thank you for supporting these Masses with your Mass intentions. (The 2023 and 2024 books for offering Masses are now open at the parish office.) Thank you for participating in the survey and improving our celebrations as you always do.

PARISH MISSION: Next weekend we enjoy and begin our annual "retreat," our parish mission, with Dominican Father Scott Steinkerchner. Fr Scott and I are long-time friends. His family mother and family live in Wadsworth, Ohio. Fr. Scott suffers from a neurological disease of the throat and, through physical therapy, copes with this by using an Irish dialect, training the muscles to assist his speaking. CATHOLIC CHARITIES APPEAL - A TIME TO HEAL. A TIME TO HELP.

There are three important parts to Lent: fasting, prayer and almsgiving – each helping us be holy, kind, merciful, loving and helping others belong to Christ. We make our formal commitment to pledge/donate to our Annual Catholic Charities Appeal, if we have not done so already, in all parishes of the Diocese. (Like the Blessed Sacrament Community that made its pledge and payment at the end of January, I am grateful to parishioners who have already turned in their forms and/or payment.)

NEW ORDER OF PENANCE. Ash Wednesday implements the updated *Order of Penance*. There are several "orders" or ways to celebrate this sacrament and the church has a new ritual book. Not only that, but the church has also updated the prayers again for your Act of Contrition and the priests' prayers, too. We have printed the new parts for you in the bulletin and in the reconciliation chapel in church to guide you and make you feel comfortable with the amendments. Since Pope John Paul II and Pope Benedict, they mandated revised translations of our rituals: we now participate in the fruits of their labors and our U.S. Bishops' and their translation teams.

HELP WITH CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD at 10:30 AM: We need some adult leaders to assist our children with their Liturgy of the Word; read the Scriptures, share reflection in the guide book and lead a craft. (This is the picture to the right.) Contact George Peko to be trained at psr@saintpaschal.com and shadow at a Mass or two on Sundays.



LET'S REMEMBER OUR LENTEN PRACTICES:

- The church has a rubric about no flowers during Lent until the "Gloria" of the Easter Vigil. The exceptions are March 19 and March 25 for these two solemnities (Saint Joseph and Annunciation). Lent is about uncluttering our lives and focusing. We cover statues to not focus on the saints, but ourselves, too: no ornamentation.
- While we normally move the plants/trees away from the sanctuary to highlight the starkness of Lent, the Christmas freeze and broken heating season injured or killed most of our greenery. THANKS TO OUR GENEROUS PARISHIONERS, THEY WILL RETURN BETTER THAN EVER FOR EASTER! WE ARE SO GRATEFUL!!!
- Our theme is "God Deeply Loves
 Us," and the song this year is "Deep
 Within." The song will be sung for
 us as our prayer on our YouTube
 channel and liturgies. We will dig
 deeper into the well of God's love,
 and you will see this in the art and
 penance service for our youth.



We appreciate a different style of music during Lent and chant the parts of the Mass. There have been in past centuries, rubrics about banning (now reducing) instrumentation, as well. These are not enforced today as strictly as in previous centuries. CURRENTLY, WE ARE SINGING THE "MASS OF SPB" that our own accompanist, MATT PARROTTA, wrote for us!

- · Lighting is dimmed for our sanctuary and nave to help with the spirit of the liturgy, too.
- We begin Mass in the solemn prayer of the "monastic" style, with a simple entrance.
 - The priest will be in the presider chair **5 minutes before Mass**.
 - We are called to gather early to prepare to silence ourselves, listen more closely to God's Word, and be nourished by it. This is our spiritual retreat and renewal time to focus. (Please note this when Daylight Savings returns on March 12.)
 - We are called to prayer by a simple ring of a bell.
- · After making the "Sign of the Cross," we sing the Penitential Act to acknowledge our need for God's mercy. No "Gloria" is sung during the Lenten season, part of the penitential nature of the season.
- · We also have an Agape Bible Study Tuesday morning, Women's Only on Wednesday evening and Men's Only Bible Study on Tuesday night. Contact the office for the Zoom links or in-person gathering information.
- Stations of the Cross will be in the church at 6:30 PM each Friday of Lent except MARCH 24 due to the 8th grade musical: Frozen!

- FRIDAY, MARCH 3, 6:30 PM OUR LECTORS HOST STATIONS OF THE CROSS WITH A SOUP MEAL FOLLOWING THE LITURGY IN THE EYMARD ROOM - THANK YOU, LECTORS.
- JOIN US FOR OTHER PRAYER & WORSHIP times during Lent:
 - WEEKDAY MASSES: 9:00 AM in church or 11:30 AM in Saint Ann
 - MORNING PRAYER IN CHURCH: 8:00 AM (A 20-minute word service)
 - EVENING PRAYER IN CHAPEL: 4:45 PM (A 20-minute word service)
 - ROSARY: 8:30 AM MONDAY-SATURDAY IN CHURCH (A 20-minute devotional service)
 - PRAY FOR PEACE at 2:30 PM each day with "Let There Be Peace on Earth" bells
 - MAKE A VISIT: Before or after school as you drop off or pick up your student from the Day School or PSR - even 5 minutes!
 - CHURCH IS OPEN from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM, ask me for the code to make a visit with the rest of us. For the other hours of the night, use the door by the SSS Kitchen Parking Lot and the brown hallway to enter the church.





THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

WHAT?

The way we embrace Christ's call to conversion.

The step we take to express true repentance for our offenses.

The confession of our sins.

The reception of God's pardon and peace.

The restoration of our relationship with God and with the Church.

After Jesus declared that Peter would be the rock upon which he would build his Church, he said to Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."
(Mt 16:13-20)



Jesus appeared to his disciples, extended his peace, breathed the holy Spirit on them, and sent them out saying, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." (Jn 20:19-23)

WHY?

We were born with the effects of original sin: disobedience toward God and a lack of trust in his goodness (Gen 3:1-11).

God the Father sent his Son, Jesus Christ, to save us from our sins (In 3:16).

Jesus accomplished his saving mission by establishing the Kingdom of God and by suffering, dying on the cross, rising from the dead, and ascending into heaven (Mt 5:17).

Jesus established the Church to continue his saving mission by the power of the Holy Spirit through the celebration of the sacraments (Mk 1:15, Jn 19:34, Acts 2: 1-4, 2 Cor 5:18).

> Through faith in the Gospel and Baptism, we are first washed clean of all sin (Acts 2:38).

Through the Sacrament of Penance, we continue to experience the forgiveness of our sins (Mt 16:13-20, Jn 20:19-23).

How?

THE ORDER OF PENANCE

The Church celebrates the Sacrament of Penance using the Order of Penance.

The revised rites and formulas of the Order of Penance of the Second Vatican Council were promulgated in 1973. A new translation was provided in 2023.

Celebrating the Sacrament of Penance or "going to confession" is a liturgical action that consists of:

- The Reception of the Penitent
- The Reading of the Word of God (Optional)
- 3. The Confession of Sins and The Acceptance of Satisfaction
- 4. The Prayer of the Penitent and The Absolution
- 5. The Proclamation of Praise of God and The Dismissal of the Penitent

THE ACTS OF THE PENITENT

- 1. Contrition (sorrow for sin)
- 2. Confession (inward examination, outward accusation)
- 3. Satisfaction (an act of penance)

"Penance requires the sinner to endure all things willingly, be contrite of heart. confess with the lips, and practice complete humility and fruitful satisfaction."



Going to Confession in Twelve Easy Steps

- 1. Examine your conscience, call to mind your sins, and then enter the confessional
- 2. The priest will welcome and receive you.
- 3. Make the sign of the cross and say: "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen."
- 4. The priest will invite you to trust in God. He may also read a text of Sacred Scripture.
- 5. Say these or similar words:
- "Bless me Father for I have sinned. It has been ____long since my last confession. These are my sins..."
- 6. Tell the priest your sins. Then say these or similar words: "For these and all of my sins, I am sorry."
- 7. Accept your work of penance (prayers, act of kindness, etc.) to help make satisfaction and amend your life.
- 8. Express your sorrow for your sins (Act of Contrition) in these or similar words

"O my God, I am sorry and repent with all my heart for all the wrong I have done and for the good I have failed to do,

because by sinning I have offended you who are all good and worthy to be loved above all things I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid the occasions of sin.

Through the merits of the Passion of our Savior Jesus Christ, Lord, have mercy.'

- 9. Receive God's forgiveness as the priest prays the Prayer of Absolution.
- 10. At the end of the Prayer of Absolution, reply: "Amen."
- 11. Give praise to God. When the priest says: "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good," conclude: "For his mercy endures forever."
- 12. Go in peace and remember to say or do your penance.
