A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT: While you get to enjoy Dominican Father Scott preach this weekend and this week, I want to share a short reflection, too. Between our First Reading and Gospel today, we have some movement. Abram, before he was named Abraham, goes forth to a new land that God is showing. We also know how Peter, James and John are moving up and down the mountain, experiencing Christ's transfiguration. This reminds me of the movement in our own lives, spiritual, not

necessarily a physical moving, from here to there. In our relationship with God, we are called to "go." God never allows us to "sit still." We sometimes have to climb the mountains in our lives, but we know and trust that this is where we experience the closeness and care of God. How is your Lent going? God moving you a little bit more than you wish? Jesus tells the disciples not to say anything until they are ready and get the entire picture. That's what we may need to do in our lives: wait! God is walking up or down the mountain with us, and there is more come. Don't loose heart; be patient and keep moving to "the land" that God is showing us. God loves us deeply (our Lenten theme); we are always walking with God.

LENT PARISH PRACITCE - SINGING DURING COMMUNION: Since the USA has entered into this Eucharistic Revival, we have had a few things that we have done so far in our parish to highlight parts of the Mass or some of our practices. To highlight that our bread is truly the work of our hands and God blesses it and us to make it into the Body of Christ, we have had homemade "Paschal" bread from time to time to emphasis the importance and transformation. It has made us think and



appreciate this gift. No one has shared their homemade wine yet... but, like in the early church, we will not refuse that!

Another aspect I wish to highlight is the Communion Song. Can you imagine being at a sports event when folks are singing the national anthem but not participating in it? How about a birthday party and not singing "Happy Birthday?" Just as we stand to show reverence to the Body of Christ (kneeling or sitting comes after the priest sits down and the tabernacle is closed in the *Roman Rite* that we celebrate), so do we show reverence and devotion by singing the Communion Chant/Song/Antiphon together. Like many things Catholic, it receives three names! During Lent, we are focusing on the importance of singing this part of the Mass – the important part of the Mass where we become what we receive: the Body of Christ! How can we keep from singing? How/why did we develop a bad habit to **not** sing the Communion Song? I remember Sister Monica telling us how important it was after we received Christ in the Eucharist to go back to the pew and "sing out your thanksgiving." She was telling us what the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* says in paragraph 86 and 88:

While the priest is receiving the Sacrament, the Communion [song] is begun. Its purpose is to express the communicants' union in sprit by means of the unity of their voices, to show joy of heart, and to so highlight more clearly the "communitarian" nature of the procession to receive Communion. The singing is continued for as long as the Sacrament is being administered to the faith.

When the distribution of Communion is finished, as circumstances suggest, the priest and faithful spend some time praying privately.

So, you see, what many are doing is "praying privately," before the song is complete. They are missing out on singing together like you would miss out if you were in the bathroom at a stadium, not singing the national anthem.

Singing together is so important. So, let's all pick up the bulletin or the hymnal and practice this great ritual. Give back to God the voice He gave you, or at least pray along with the important words that are being used to help us be the Body of Christ.

UPDATE ON PLANTS/TREES IN CHURCH AND HEATING SYSTEM: Your generosity and kindness are wonderful as always! We are so grateful to so many families who are replacing all our plants and trees. Some have been replaced already, as you notice, around the perimeter of the church. The larger, taller ones are coming from Florida and hopefully will be here on March 16 or 17. For Easter, as usually set, we will return all the plants around the sanctuary. We are so grateful for these large donations, since several are at least \$300.00.

We replaced the damaged heating system for the church February 21-24. We are grateful to our maintenance team and parishioners, Bear and his company, for getting this project done so quickly – just two months from the big power outage and freeze. (This is what caused all the tropical plants to die due to 6 days of freezing temperatures.)

CHRISTMAS EVE MASS UPDATE: Based on the surveys returned from the parishioners, our discussions at the Pastoral Council and the Liturgy Commission meetings, we decided to "make it easy." Just as we usually have the most important liturgy of the year, the Easter Vigil, at 8:00 PM, we will have our second evening Mass on Christmas also be at 8:00 PM. This will support our liturgical ministers (so that many will not have to attend two Masses), especially having our music groups together for a grand celebration like we do at the Easter Vigil. So, our Christmas Mass schedule for 2023 is as follows:

- 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT:
 - Saturday, December 23 Vigil: 4:30 PM
 - Sunday, December 24: 8:30 AM & 10:30 AM
- NATIVITY OF THE LORD (CHRISTMAS) Carols and music ½ hour before the services:
 - Sunday, December 24: 4:00 PM (Vigil Mass & Children's Choir) &
 8:00 PM (Mass at Night readings & Adult Christmas Choir)
 - Monday, December 25: 8:30 AM (Mass at Dawn) & 10:30 AM (Mass during the Day)
 - ◆ There is no 6:30 PM Mass this day

Thank you for supporting these Masses with your Mass intentions. (The 2023 and 2024 books for offering Masses are now open at the parish office.) Thank you for participating in the survey and improving our celebrations as you always do.

penance service for our youth.




- We appreciate a different style of music during Lent and chant the parts of the Mass. There have been in past centuries, rubrics about banning (now reducing) instrumentation, as well. These are not enforced today as strictly as in previous centuries. CURRENTLY, WE ARE SINGING THE "MASS OF SPB" that our own accompanist, MATT PARROTTA, wrote for us!
- We begin Mass in the solemn prayer of the "monastic" style, with a simple entrance.
 - · The priest will be in the presider chair 5 minutes before Mass.
 - We are called to gather early to prepare to silence ourselves, listen more closely to God's Word, and be nourished by it. This is our spiritual retreat and renewal time to focus. (Please note this when Daylight Savings returns on NEXT SUNDAY, March 12.)
 - We are called to prayer by a simple ring of a bell.
- After making the "Sign of the Cross," we sing the Penitential Act to acknowledge our need for God's mercy. No "Gloria" is sung during the Lenten season, part of the penitential nature of the season.
- <u>Friday, March 17</u> we remember Saint Patrick Day! We are dispensed or allowed to eat meat on this Friday during Lent and do an act of penance on another day of this season.
- Stations of the Cross will be in the church at 6:30 PM each Friday of Lent except MARCH 24 due to the 8th grade musical: Frozen!
- JOIN US FOR OTHER PRAYER & WORSHIP times during Lent:
 - WEEKDAY MASSES: 9:00 AM in church or 11:30 AM in Saint Ann Shrine
 - MORNING PRAYER IN CHURCH: 8:00 AM (A 20-minute word service)




