FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT MARCH 26, 2023

A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT: Each time we hear of the raising of Lazarus from the dead we remember some pivotal things about our own life. This is the sixth and last great sign that Jesus shows in John's Gospel. When this narrative ends at chapter 12, John moves the Gospel forward to the "Book of Glory," leading to Jesus' own great resurrection.

Lazarus' name means, "God helps." Christ helped Lazarus along again from a profound

death from sickness. Many of us have had near death experiences from sickness where we were brought back and given another chance. Going through those times, like me, never fear death again due to the experience of God's great light and help. Like Lazarus, God loves us deeply – our Lenten theme. Jesus didn't just cry when Lazarus died, he wept! God weeps in the sadness of this world, and this is why and how we know we have a compassionate God who walks with us. God walks with us to Easter glory through passion and death. This preview Sunday helps us get ready for the great Paschal event next week. May we have some new life to restore us to health and readiness for these great celebrations and our renewed participation in them.

(OBH). We had fun highlighting our Catholic school and the many extracurriculars we have. This is because we have an incredibly dedicated faculty and staff. Take a tour and see the Paschal Pride and difference that occurs each day where we educate minds and nourish souls.

FINANCE & PASOTRAL COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES: It's that time of year when we begin to look for new leaders for our parish councils. You see elsewhere in the bulletin about joining the School Advisory Council. In Canon Law, two councils are required of every parish - the Finance Council (FC) and the Pastoral Council (PC). PC is charged with visioning, planning and implementing parish policies to guide the current and future needs of the parish. In the last several years, PC has been so helpful in forming a pastoral plan, sending out a survey to hear parishioners concerns, contacting parishioners during the pandemic, dreaming about capital campaigns and sharing with me comments, questions and concerns from parishioners. FC overseas all the parish finances and our different ministries as well. We do long range planning and make tough financial planning choices. Please consider becoming an advisor to me and joining the Pastoral Council. I'll send you the guidelines to give you more information through an email. One serves for a three-year term, renewable once.

HOSTING TETELESTAI IN 2024: Place on your calendar March 1-3 next year for these will be the dates we will host the performances of the musical Tetelestai. This is the Greek word for "it is finished," what Jesus says in his dying from the cross. In the past, we have even had a few families who were in the production. Why not plan on being part of this again by going to Cleveland Performing Arts Ministries website or info@tetelestai-cpam.org.

OUR PARISH AT 70: In less than six months we will be having a celebration for our 70th anniversary with Bishop Malesic joining us for a special Mass on Sunday, September 10 at 10:30 AM. Please place this on your calendar, and we hope to have more details about the celebrations for this day once we hear back from committee members!

BRAINSTORMING FOR OBH: Last week in the bulletin I had a detailed list of the many aspects of our four meetings in February about OBH. Please look online for those details. I will not repeat them due to limited space. Pictures of the past, present and future ideas are now on display in the Fickel Narthex (church) and Family Life Center narthex too.

PREPARING FOR PALM SUNDAY & THE SACRED TRIDUUM: Over the last thirteen years, I have given an extensive history and reflection on the celebrations of the special liturgies of the church and why our presence is necessary. I invite you again to participate, witness, experience and enjoy the highlights of liturgy and the church's worship from Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday. We are blessed to have Father John Keenan be a retreat/Triduum preacher this year. Here are a few highlights that you cannot miss on each of the days:

PALM SUNDAY:

- Procession with palms in the church. We gather around the baptismal font to receive our palms, bless them, hear a special Gospel.
- We proclaim another Gospel, the Passion of Christ according to Matthew (this cycle A year).



HOLY THURSDAY:

- Our special Morning Prayer starts the day and retreat for the Sacred Triduum.
- Agapé Meal joins the parish together to live what the Corinthian community did before celebrating the Lord's Supper. <u>Have you called in your order for chicken or eggplant dinner?</u>
- We wash feet! What an act of service from Christ to us living Christ today.
- We share our Paschal Bread and Blessing Cup to celebrate what Christ gave us, and we faithfully remember for thousands of years.
- We process and adore the Blessed Sacrament through our church into the Blessed Sacrament Chapel.
- We stay, keep watch, and pray from 8:30 PM until Midnight: come for a visit between these hours.

GOOD FRIDAY:

- Morning Prayer begins the starkness of the day; what a great way to spend time in the day.
- Our Youth Group shares the stations of the cross at Noon. Our youth make us proud about living out these last moments of Christ's life. The Rossi Family is so wonderful to provide a soup meal after.
- Bring your Rice Bowl back highlighting the hunger cross relieved for others as you leave your rice bowl in the baskets provided during your veneration of the cross.

EASTER VIGIL: (If you have never come – make this the year! The Super Bowl of Liturgies!)

- · We prepare the new Paschal Candle with an outdoor bonfire.
- We hear three of the most important Hebrew Scriptures and sing psalms to match them.
- IMAGES ARE UNCOVERED DURING THE SINGING OF THE GLORIA, bells rung, candles kindled, and church lit as we sing praises to God.
- We hear the Matthew Resurrection Gospel this year. Our maintenance staff creates the tomb that became the symbol of hope and new life.
- We welcome the following in the Initiation Sacraments:
 - Catechumens, Cameron Fuller, Keilani Honeycutt and Maxwell Selock
 - Candidates: Genevieve Carey, Joanne Formica, Dave Seline and Tasha Stanley

 We renew our baptismal promises and share in the blessed, new Holy Water, reminding ourselves how much "God deeply loves us," and we wish to recommit to our discipleship.

EASTER SUNDAY:

- We renew our baptismal promises and share in the blessed, new Holy Water, reminding ourselves how much "God deeply loves us," and we wish to recommit to our discipleship.
- We sing the solemn Sequence, the poem that summarizes the importance of the Easter mystery.

A lot will happen, with great singing, enthusiastic liturgical ministers and the joy of all of us being together. We also wish to note our Children's Choir (led by Michelle Kitko) will lead us at the 10:30 AM Easter Sunday Mass once again this year. In advance, I thank all who help celebrate Easter become a grand event of worship – one that you cannot miss.

Let's continue to pray for each other. Palm Sunday is next week, no fooling, April 2!

BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT GROUP

WHAT IS BEREAVEMENT? Someone you love very dearly has died and the pain, sadness and confusion seem too great for any words to mean anything. Even life itself can seem hollow and meaningless, and yet, the Bible tells us that everything works for good for those who love God. The one who suffers this loss is the mourner who must travel through the phases of grief. 
