A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION: Today we begin the grand holy week with Matthew's gospels: the entry into Jerusalem and the passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. What struck me about the first Gospel – unique to Matthew – is a detail that I've read but didn't really notice: there were two animals that brought Jesus into the city! An image

of the Trinity? An image of us together on our journey with the Lord, for God always sends us two by two into the world to bring the Good News? And for this day, we focus on Hosannas, salvation, passion, crucifixion and death. Something we do TOGETHER with Christ always leading us on and ahead; Christ is always with us through our Paschal Mystery. May we never feel alone and know that we have strong companions, young (like a colt) and old that will always be with us on the journey.

TRANSITION IN OUR MAINTENANCE STAFF: With so much mixed emotion, we announce that our Maintenance Supervisor, Jon Detzel took a new position with Seal Tech, a position created just for him! After almost 14 years, with Saint Paschal Baylon, he has this great new opportunity for himself and his family. WE WILL MISS HIM GREATLY! He will begin his new position later in April. His last day officially on staff will be Friday, April 14. I have offered Scott Rutti, current Assistant Maintenance Supervisor, to be our interim Maintenance Supervisor, Scott has worked "from the ground up" here at Saint Paschal Baylon since he began here 7 years ago. He has learned every aspect of our campus through his work with us. During the next few months, we are assessing our maintenance needs, what we are able to do, and what we may hire out for our other services (such as we did with snow removal). Scott is grateful for this opportunity to lead, and we will be looking for someone to replace this position. We will finalize our staff by September 1 due to the many upcoming major projects that we have from May 1 through September 1. Jon did a great job of putting together a team to support the mission of Saint Paschal Baylon. We are forever grateful to him for his outstanding gifts of service to us. I know you will join me in expressing your thankfulness during the next month and during his visits to his home parish. PS: While the airport got 27 inches of snow this winter, second mildest winter ever, we here at SPB got 31 inches according to our snow plowers—our lightest since we have been keeping track.

A gratitude plaque will be installed behind the center of the sanctuary wall for our eternal gratefulness for the many donors to the project. We are also so grateful for our dedicated team, especially the members of the Society of the Little Flower, who care for our plants, trees and flowers. We are so blessed with their dedication. And, now as the 8th graders sang last weekend, "Let them grow, let them grow." I know, I know...these are the wrong words ©.

8th GRADE TALENT: We are so grateful to our class of 2023 parents and our students for putting on an incredible production of *Frozen Jr.* They showed off what we already know: We've got talent in the parish! We are so #PaschalProud! Thank you for your hard work and the delightful ways you entertained us and saw God's gifts in you!

PRAYERS FOR FATHER NORMAN PELLETIER: Many of you remember and know our former General Superior and Provincial Superior Fr. Norman Pelletier, SSS. If you are on our SSS Grapevine, you know that he had to have an emergency triple bypass surgery a few Fridays ago. He has been pastoring in San Antonio at our parish on the riverwalk, Saint Joseph Downtown. He is recovering very well! In the meantime, Fr. Choy generously volunteered to assist through April 12 with our other priest there, Fr. Joseph Thai Tran, SSS. You have also been seeing Fr. John Keenan presiding at our Masses too. After his primary ministry work, clinical psychology (working through mid-April), he too will go to San Antonio to assist during Fr. Norman's recovery. - We share our Paschal Bread and Blessing Cup to celebrate what Christ gave us which we faithfully remember for thousands of years
- We process and adore the Blessed Sacrament through our church into the Blessed Sacrament Chapel
- We stay, keep watch, and pray from 8:30 PM until Midnight: come for a visit between these hours.

GOOD FRIDAY:Morning Prayer begins the starkness of the day; what great way to spend time in the day.

- Our Youth Group shares the Stations of the Cross at Noon. Our youth make us proud about living out these last moments of Christ's life. The Rossi Family is so wonderful to provide a soup meal after.
- Bring your Rice Bowl back highlighting the hunger cross relieved for others as you leave your rice bowl in the baskets provided during your veneration of the cross.

EASTER VIGIL: (If you have never come – make this the year! The Super Bowl of Liturgies!)

- We prepare the new Paschal Candle with an outdoor bonfire.
- We hear 3 of the most important Hebrew Scriptures and sing psalms to match them.
- IMAGES ARE UNCOVERED DURING THE SINGING OF THE GLORIA, bells rung, candles and church lit as we sing praises to God.
- We hear the Matthew Resurrection Gospel this year. Our maintenance staff creates the tomb that became the symbol of hope and new life.


