A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



EASTER SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S RESURRECTION: Happy Easter! Blessings and prayers to you from the Blessed Sacrament Community, the Sisters of Notre Dame and the Pastoral Staff. May these next 50 days of Easter be equally as spirit-filled as our Lenten journey.

Today, we hear Matthew's account of the Resurrection of Christ. There are little details that are quite important, and we hear them anew. We start a new life after the sabbath – for Christ transformed the day of rest and worship of God to a new day – the

first day of the week, now called the Lord's Day, or in English, Sunday! We experience a new dawn on the first day of the week – that's why each Lord's Day – each Sunday – is such a holy day for us due to this Resurrection to new life. God hopes for new life for us each Sunday, and that's why the early church (for almost 400 years) only celebrated Easter each Sunday.

After the earthquake, there was much fear about for all present at the tomb. The angel reminds us again not to be afraid. Go to Galilee! They went fearful, but overjoyed, much like the emotions we have in our own life. However, Jesus meets us along the journey and takes away our fears.

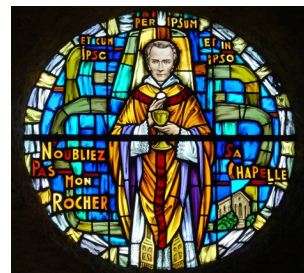
That's our Eucharistic life; each Mass is an opportunity for us to come and have the stones rolled away in our lives to experience new joy and less fear – to grow in courage and to be ready for the next adventure in our life. May we grow in that trust as we experience the great season of Easter Time – 50 Days for the Resurrection celebrations to lead to a new Pentecost in our lives.

LOOKING AHEAD TO A RENEWED O'BRIEN HALL (OBH): We really need your help! We were given a \$100,000.00 gift as seed money to renovate our beloved hall. From 1955-1971, this was our first church building. Since then, it has been our place of gathering for meals, socials, science fairs, band concerts, 8th grade plays, Craft Shows and much more! Many of us remember Bingo from 1974-2014! We had listening sessions throughout February to brainstorm on OBH's future, and it was clear that it needs a refresh. **Will you be with me on the committee** to do this with our principal, volunteer architect Todd Meyer (recently featured in the PD for his renovations for the Garfield Monument) and a few others? You may recall that we had to lay off staff and cut our budget by \$250,000.00 three years ago. We still do not have an Advancement Director: we need each other and the gifts and talents of our parishioners to assist, unless you feel that we should hire a company to do this. Let me know! We have one architect making proposals. Others? **Please contact me soon so that we may begin this plan.**

FATHER CHOY HELPING IN SAN ANTONIO: We are grateful for your prayers! Father Choy received his green card for 10 years of service here in the USA. He'll be able to go back to the Philippines and his family for the first time in 5 years this summer for vacation. He'll be away August 10-September 18. Meanwhile, he returns from San Antonio Wednesday from assisting there while Father Norman Pelletier has been recovering from heart surgery. Father Norman will be moving here this summer for his new assignment, assisting in the Center for Eucharistic Evangelizing (CEE) in the Blessed Sacrament (SSS) headquarters (on the campus next to SPB). Yes, it's complicated with our buildings: we have our parish office wing, rectory where the brothers and priests live (no parish meeting rooms there) and HQ which includes Saint Ann Shrine and a daily Mass at 11:30 AM. Also, Father Roger Bourgeois and Father John Keenan have been helping us out for many weeks now. We are grateful for their assistance. Father Keenan will

be going to San Antonio for a bit, too, filling in for Father Norman during his recovery and before his move here.

2024 PILGRIMAGE TO FRANCE: In my new role as provincial, we are bringing back a quadannual pilgrimage in the footsteps of our founder, Saint Peter Julian Eymard. This pilgrimage tour, to the important sites of Father Eymard across France, is November 5-15, 2024. **See flyer later in bulletin and ask me for a more in-depth brochure** which you can also find in your *Paschal Life* Issue on April 1. IN OUR BUSY LIVES: Let's not forget to make our pledge and/or payment to this year's Catholic Charities Appeal. The diocese lists us as 1,907 families. **Based on our recent parish survey and your reregistering, we are actually 1,430 families now as a parish**, about 1,000 less families since COVID. We are grateful to the 154 families who have pledge/committed/paid \$110,560.00 to heal and provide care for our diocese agencies. Our parish goal given to us is \$169,212.00. **A great start since February** – now let's make it so during this Easter Time, healing and strengthening so many in need.

We are also so grateful for our dedicated team, especially the members of the Society of the Little Flower, who care for our plants, trees and flowers each day. We are so blessed with their dedication. And, now as the 8th graders sang last weekend, "Let them grow, let them grow." I know, I know...these are the wrong words! ☺



8th GRADE TALENT: We are so grateful to our class of 2023 parents and our student for putting on an incredible production of *Frozen Jr.* They showed off what we already know: we've got talent in the parish! We are so #PaschalProud! Thank you for your hard work and the delightful ways you

entertained us and saw God's gifts in you! Due to our production schedule in advance of the liturgical holidays, we are typing this column in the midst of *Frozen!* It's been nice having the production in the church, but we try to limit one production a year – and next year *Tetelestai* already has dibs; waiting for two years to come back to us! 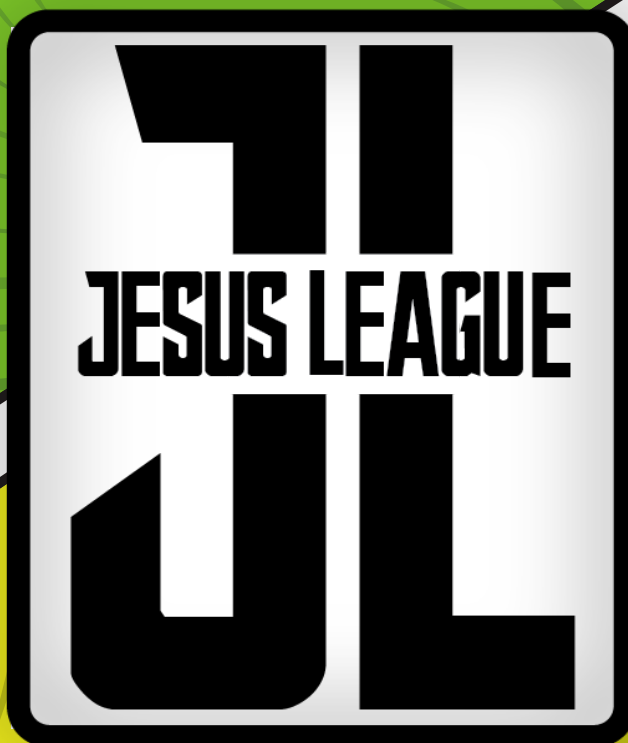

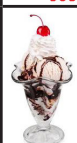
