A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER: Happy Easter! Yes, it's still Easter in our liturgical calendar for the Roman Catholic Church. We celebrate for 50 days, and today we end the octave whereby these last 8 days are Easter, each day with the singing of the Gloria and other special parts to our liturgies (Mass, Morning & Evening Prayer). We are so grateful for your continued presence to celebrate these grand celebrations thru Pentecost Sunday.

For a change, I thought I would focus not on the Scriptures but on the Collect (or Opening Prayer) of the Mass. It is a very special prayer that sets the tone for God's Mercy Sunday and reminds us of the great mysteries and celebrations from Holy Thursday until now. Here it is again to read the powerful words:

God of everlasting mercy, who in the very recurrence of the paschal feast kindle the faith of the people you have made your own, increase, we pray, the grace you have bestowed, that all may grasp and rightfully understand in what font they have been washed, by whose Spirit that have been reborn, by whose Blood they have been redeemed.

This period of time from now until Pentecost is called: mystagoia—a time of unpacking the mysteries of our faith. It's a time for the newly initiated into the church to reflect on the Triduum, their newfound Catholic Christian life, and to see the importance of living the faith that Christ won for us through His Resurrection. The readings today embellish this by having us take the time to "touch" the mystery – the Risen Christ – and to realize that it is through the grand sacraments of our life that we experience God. The Second Vatican Council added two sacraments to the list of the seven, reminding us that the church is a sacrament whereby we receive the grace and witness of Christ. May we take time during this holy season to see in the church the gifts that come from our Baptism and the grace to grow together as a faith-filled community, witnessing the Risen Lord by our mercy, love and peace.

OTHER NEWS: While I am writing this bulletin column on Holy Wednesday due to production and travel schedules, I am grateful to all the folks in the catechetical ministry, music, and arts & environment ministries for their preparation and planning that they are implementing for our celebrations and experiences.



Someone once told me after seeing our YouTube channel, "Your people make it look so easy and fun! I love celebrating with you!" And we do, too! Whether in person or online, we are so grateful for your participation. In my one photo, we have two of our happiest Sunday participants take a photo op with me on Palm Sunday. More thanks next week when we have completely celebrated all the great mysteries. Meanwhile, other pictures






