A LETTER FROM FR. LANE



THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER: Can you see Christ walking with you each day? Recognize the "aha" moments when Christ is present? Today's Scriptures remind us to be sensitive to the blessings that come our way. Sometimes we can be so caught up in our agenda, our sorrow, our "whatever!" that we miss the moment – the footprints in the sand reality – that Christ is always walking with us in our journey. There are many barriers that blind us. Our theme song for this parish year has been "Open My Eyes" and has helped us to focus on seeing God in our

parish's life of listening (due to the international synod), liturgy and love. We have been called to see Christ in one another, to listen and be attentive to one another's needs. Then too, we must celebrate the Body of Christ together – to come back to church – and to be of service to one another. This past month, our Holy Week and Triduum events – worship and service – were excellent examples of our living our mission statement for the parish and "singing our song." May we keep walking – not to Emmaus – but to the place where God is leading us—trusting that the blessings, the "aha's" and other miracles are always going to be next to us with Christ on our journey.

Based on our recent parish survey and your reregistering, we are actually 1,430 families now as a parish, about 1,000 less families since COVID and the parish census request mailed to all homes previously on our register. We are grateful to the 154 families who have pledged/committed/paid \$110,560.00 for our diocesan agencies. A great start since February —

now let's make it so during this Easter Time, healing and strengthening so many in need. Our parish goal given to us is \$169,212.00.
