A LETTER FROM FATHER LANE



PENTECOST: Each year on this sacred solemnity, we end Easter Time and the great 50 days. The name "Pentecost" comes from that number 50 as well as from the celebration of the first fruits and their harvest from our Jewish friends' calendar. We know it to be the great day of the Holy Spirit in which our readings record accurately.

The wonder of the readings for this year is the fact that we hear the Easter Gospel again, wishing us peace, reminding us to reconcile and be bridgebuilders of God's spirit. This main task of Easter then, from the beginning until this day, is to focus our efforts on renewing God's peace in our lives, speaking the language of God to our world and inspiring others to work toward goals of forgiveness and reconciliation. You see, this is hard, but it is why we need to pray and work at allowing the Holy Spirit to guide us and speak the "tongues" of fire that will inspire others to be just as faithful in peacemaking, too.

BULLETIN NOTES: Due to the Memorial Day holiday, this bulletin is readied earlier than our usual schedule. At present, Spring Fling rides and tents are being assembled. It is so exciting! We just had our sausage makers finish their goal, and we look forward to the great meatballs. We are grateful for the many who have volunteered to make this event so successful. **PLEASE SAY THANK YOU TO OUR ADVERTISERS (FOUND IN OUR FREE BOOKLET) AND VISIT THEIR BUSINESSES!** Also, note that the pictures you see in the bulletin are part of my visit as provincial superior, wearing that hat of "a visitation," a canonical process to access the parish and the relationship of the Blessed Sacrament Community (SSS) to the parish. More on that in a moment, but for now, enjoy a picture of part of our Pastoral Staff and a moment I had meeting Bishop Malesic at the Catholic Center downtown across from the Cathedral. **MORE ON SPRING FLING IN A JUNE BULLETIN** after the holiday production schedule is over.

WHAT IS AN SSS PARISH? As part of my visitation, wearing my other ministry hat as provincial superior, I have been visiting our other SSS parishes across the country. This month it has been the turn of our parish. As a result, I have been meeting with Bishop Malesic, diocese leaders, our Pastoral Council, our Pastoral Staff, SSS members here at SPB and our other SSS residing at the Regina Health Center in Richfield. Bishop Malesic appreciates the administration of the Blessed Sacrament Community who founded this parish in 1953. He appreciates that we share our charism of Eucharistic and a deep spirituality that revolves around this sacrament. Being an SSS parish, we host conferences and retreats, such as the Eucharistic Congress this summer you are all invited to participate. We have a Saint Ann and Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum to extend our devotions and relationship with the saints and the sacraments too. As the Pastoral's Council and Staff reflected, if the SSS were not here, what would we miss? Definitely the priests and brothers we have come to know! Definitely the way the Mass is celebrated and highlighted thru the Eucharist, preaching and music! Definitely the Liturgy of the Hours, the hospitality and openness of our SSS to share so much of



themselves to minister and care for us would be missed.

We perhaps take for granted the presence of SSS, its charism and the spirit that guides (and has guided) our parish for 70 years. Many people do not know the difference between a religious parish and a diocesan parish. As a religious (SSS) parish, we collaborate and build our communities into Eucharistic centers. We even have associates (lay people and clerics) who also follow in the footsteps of Saint Peter Julian Eymard. One of my favorite statements in the SSS *Rule of Life* is paragraph 41:

We will make our parishes into authentic communities shaped by the Eucharist, source and center of their life. They shall be: places of proclamation and the living of the gospel, places of prayer, eucharistic adoration and festive celebration, places of sharing and fellowship, places of freedom and human development. United among themselves, our religious engaged in parish ministry shall collaborate in a special way with committed lay people.

Let me know how we can be better at sharing our Eucharistic charism as SSS. As one of our religious once said, "Would they miss us if we were gone? How do we touch their lives?" May we truly be making a difference in your life and let me know how we do!

SPEAKING OF EVANGELIZATION: Each year, we have hoped to have a parish gathering to invite new members to our church (and to the faith in general) and to share the riches of the sacraments, beginning the process of becoming Catholic or complete one's Catholic sacraments. Join George Peko and me as we kick off the process to become Catholic, to "evangelize" and invite people to come back to church, or just simply enjoy one another's company on **SATURDAY, JUNE 17, with the 4:30 PM MASS and 5:30 PM GATHERING in the Eymard Room.** We will have food and drink FOR EVERYONE! So, 4:30 folks, stay too! It's been a while since we were able to gather and enjoy one another's company.

ALSO, IN JUNE – DONUTS & DRINKS RETURN: I am grateful to the Welcoming Committee for wanting to host the first donuts and coffee in a while. Mark the following on your calendar, **SUNDAY, JUNE 25 after the 8:30 AM & 10:30 AM Masses.** Join in spending some time together with one another; hopefully, we will have nice weather and may enjoy one another outside at the specially decorated tables for our enjoyment. Special thanks again to the Welcoming Committee for organizing this for us.

SUMMER MAINTENANCE WORK: Thanks to your "tithing dollars at work," we will be able to do a few major projects this summer. First, because of a special donation and challenge of \$25,000.00 to #weGIVECATHOLIC (and the others who contributed to the tune of over 40K), we are able to paint our school during the month of July. The building will be closed during this time. Another more enormous project is the updating of our fire panel for the school and strobe lights for each classroom. This project will be about 90K and will update the safety in the school building since we have not had this fire security system. (We have been grandfathered for many years, but no longer.)

While these are the big-ticket items this summer, we also hope to finish the special blinds in the classrooms, fix concrete steps in front of O'Brien Hall and other minor things that need completing. Yes, the Family Life Center overhang, damaged by a delivery truck, is also in the process, but we are waiting for the supplies to complete this.

HOLY SPIRIT & THE SYNOD: Last year, our parish and diocese participated in the synod in preparation for the international meeting. Pope Francis is asking us all to pray for the **2023 October Synod on May 31** – as preparation and awareness of the importance of this event in the life of the church. The prayer is available on USCCB.org/synod, and we have been including links on our *Paschal Life* e-newsletter.

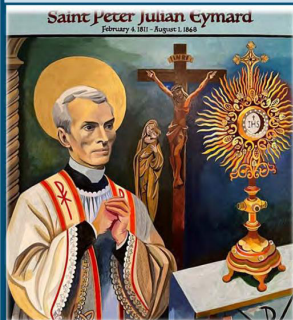
