

A LETTER FROM FATHER LANE

13th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: We continue our focus on the demands of discipleship – both on the instruction and the rewards of discipleship. The demands are quite radical; the rewards are quite remarkable. Jesus offers three examples of the costs of discipleship: two of them reflect the family setting and the third is taken from the context of Roman execution. In all three cases, Jesus insists that if the disciples are not willing or able to measure up to the demands He makes, they are not worthy of becoming His disciples.

The first example challenges the ties of kinship that are marked by natural love or affection. Jesus insists these bonds must take second place to commitment to Him. Such a demand not only causes suffering and a sense of loss, it could also alienate disciples from their loved ones.

Jesus references the carrying of the cross, what He will do for His disciples and what we are to do for the fellow disciples, too. Jesus plays with the idea of finding and losing – to find one's life means to live only on one's own terms and in one's own self-centered framework. This can give only temporary satisfaction; it cannot guarantee a life of ultimate fulfillment – as we know.

Jesus does share the benefits of discipleship, showing us first, the link between the disciples and Jesus. Since Jesus was the agent of God sent into the world to accomplish God's plan, and since the disciples are agents of Jesus sent into the world to continue that mission, those who are open to the disciples are also open to Jesus and to God. It is clear that the disciples are in a privileged position in the society, and one of the rewards of faithfulness to God is being blessed. We see this from the first reading today from the second Book of Kings. The Shunemite woman is blessed with a son – God rewards this woman for her kindness and faithfulness to the prophet. We know all too well how God has blessed us and given us more than we even knew possible because of our faithfulness to God – at many costs to ourselves – but for the glory of God.

The letter to the Romans reminds us of our Baptism and our entering into the paschal mystery of discipleship. At Baptism, we received death and life. Through Baptism, we entered into Christ's death, and we died to life of selfishness and sin. Through our Baptism, we rose with Christ to a new life freed from everything that previously held us down. As glorious as this new life in Christ might be, it means at times dying to our ways and allowing for God's



difficult ways to be realized. It is not easy to put the needs of others before our own, especially when everything around us encourages us to think first of "Number One." However, this is the very cost of discipleship we are asked to reflect on again this Sunday.

OUR COLUMN PICTURES: We remember the fabulous Mass with Bishop Michael Woost on June 11, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ with the picture of the procession. The music was out

of this world, bishop's homily amazing, the participation from our 2nd graders and their families remarkable, and the representation from our various ministries was precious. There was such a great spirit this day – building the Body of Christ! Thank you to all liturgical ministers and parishioners who



participated. Special thanks to George Peko and the evangelization folks for organizing the free pizza party after the 4:30 PM Mass on June 17. We invited everyone to come, and you can see in the picture our friends who did enjoy. Remember, we are all invited to ask others to join in our faith and become Catholic. Who have you asked lately to be a disciple in our church?



SPECIAL THANKS TO THE LEMONADE STAND: We are so grateful to the Verdone family and those who purchased lemonade both in the Highland Woods subdivision and in our own horseshoe parking lot for the parish school. We raised \$580.00 to the cause. The thoughtfulness of our youth for wanting to support their school is so special.

PROJECTS AT WORK: Thanks for the anonymous gift in conjunction with many of your generous gifts to the maintenance fund (that first of the month second collection). We are not only able to pay off our loan, but do some much-needed improvements which you are seeing in and around campus. The original steps to Father O'Brien Hall needed to be replaced for an emergency exit access and the Early Childhood Wing of our Catholic school (also original steps from 1955) were deteriorating and needed replacement and improvement! We are now accessible for this important entrance. Beginning tomorrow, your #weGIVECATHOLIC funds will be used to paint the entire hallways of the school, too. We are also improving the area outside of the Eymard Room for additional usage of space with plans for a patio for outside gatherings. One other project to be completed through the summer, too, is the moving of the preschool playground next to the preschool. Again, thanks for your generous donations to this special line item of capital improvements of our campus (and not the regular operational funds which that first collection supports each week).
