A LETTER FROM FATHER LANE



23rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Due to the holiday production schedule, this column is written August 27. Today, at the 10:30 AM Mass with Bishop Malesic, we are using special readings for the anniversary of a dedication of a church. We picked readings that are used when we anoint a building that symbolizes the People of God of a particular church or grouping. Building stones, one on top of another from Christ, the keystone! Now, we have been building for 70

years, grateful to God for our many blessings and for the many people who have touched our lives – helping us grow in faith. I've been blessed to know all the pastors of SPB, from the 50 years that my family has been members. We each have also been incredibly blessed to know each other and see the great times, ministry and service that we have accomplished with the grace of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, we are not done yet! God is not finished with us nor SPB. We, in your care and support, will continue to be the vibrant faith community that God wishes for us to be; so, let us continue to be the "lamp that sheds its light for all to see."

COLUMN PICTURES: School is off to a great start. I'm with one of our students and their family on the first day, taking a selfie and with the Youth Group (now with our cluster-mates of Saint Clare) in another photo who were having a scavenger hunt – one photo needed to be with the pastor!

FAREWELL, MATT: It is with deep sadness that I share the resignation of our accompanist Matt Parrotta. He has been a tremendous gift to the parish in his thirty years of service to this ministry and other things such as socials, outdoor Masses, sausage making and the like. He has been a gift to us in his presence and witness of faith. Music is truly instrumental



and inspirational in a parish's life. We are grateful for how he contributed so much, including writing a Mass setting for us – the Mass of Saint Paschal Baylon. We will treasure these thirty years in the parish's life and have fond memories and affection toward him and his family. We have watched his kids grow up with us, and now that they are in high school, he needs to be that super dad for weekend support. This we have known on Saturday nights at 4:30 PM seeing an array of subs. Family always comes first! We look forward to having him sub for us when able in the future.

Next week, **Sunday, September 17**, we will have a special reception for Matt **after the 10:30 AM Mass** thanks to our Welcome Committee. Please join with us to share our gratitude. We also pray for someone to accompany and direct our 4:30 PM and 10:30 AM groups, plus the Triduum and other special liturgies. They will work with Roberta and our great volunteers who share their talents so well, too.

ANNUAL MUSIC PICNIC: Please note that new musicians (singers and instrumentalists) are welcome to join in our potluck picnic in "cross alley" and the parish deck. It's the area between the school and the parish offices, across from the new Cori Preschool Playground. PLEASE JOIN US – and also say THANK YOU TO Matt – for I will grill burgers (both beef and veggie). Members, please bring sides and beverages, but also come hungry in wanting to spend some time getting to know one another and WELCOME NEW MEMBERS!! See you Wednesday, September 13, 6:30 PM on the parish deck!

OUR FINANCE REPORT: Each year, we share with you our stewardship report and the annual financial statement. Every **other** year (or "odd" year), we place this in the bulletin; "even" years, we mail them to your home. In order be transparent – a strong goal of all Catholic churches – we share the report of our fiscal year summary. Since the one-line item of the parish, our Catholic school, is so extensive, it gets a separate page detailing everything. (See the summary at the end of the bulletin).

I would like to highlight the special fundraising line in our financials. Due to a \$100,000.00 anonymous gift toward the renovation of Father O'Brien Hall, and another \$399,000.00 in donations to our maintenance fund, you will notice this line item is over \$600,000.00. Some donors suggested what they wished improved, such as the Cori Preschool Playground near the Early Childhood Wing of the school, and a constructed patio off of the Eymard Room. Another area is our memorial garden on Wilson Mills. We also were able to put in a new stairway and ramp for the Early Childhood entrance/exit. We are grateful for these anonymous ways folks support our parish, recorded in last year's fiscal year, but applicable for the year's. (Funds held in trust are used when applicable in future financial years.)

It is also worth pointing out, because of our donors relationship initiatives this past year, the fundraising was more than usual. Furthermore, your excellent support of Spring Fling 14 (raising over \$45,000.00) and other events were able to increase this line item. Why? Well, on page two you see that the deficit for our Catholic school's line-item budget (a break out section of the total budget for those who always ask, "What do we invest in our school?") you will see why we raise the funds we do and tithe so well - to cover the \$247,887.83 shortfall in this budget. Yes, everything we do as a parish works together for the benefit of all, but especially for our Catholic school. With EdChoice this year, our budget is being totally revamped. However, it is also important to note that many of our fundraising projects, like what we plan to do for the security camera system, goes toward capital improvements. Last year's #weGiveCatholic raised \$45,000.00 to paint the school. (While the funds were received in the last fiscal year, the invoices will be in this fiscal year, making it seem like we have a deficit.) Our hope: with the erasing of the deficit line of the school, currently forecasted one way, we will be able to invest in some parish ministry programs



again that have been sacrificed for the larger good. If you recall, in 2020 we had to reduce our deficit by \$250,000.00 to be able to cover our school. We reduced our staff – with less maintenance personnel, no full-time music director, no advancement office or communications office. We restructured, and most of us on

staff took on many pieces of the large puzzles. We have done this for the past several years. With EdChoice, your Angel Scholarship contribution, tithing to God and our church, as well as your other generous gifts, we will grow our parish in so many ways. THANK YOU IN ADVANCE for your care, commitment and great stewardship. Remembering how we care is helpful especially in this time of our anniversary celebration as a parish. We are all looking forward to another great year together.

LEADERSHIP KNIGHT: Join with the leaders of the parish to plan our future, **Tuesday**, **September 12**, **6:30 PM in the Eymard Room**. **Call the office for your menu selection**. I am opening up our annual Leadership Knight so that we may encourage new members of the parish to join in the mission of the parish and learn where we have been for the last year and grow for the next 70 years! We have 55 leaders, staff and Pastor Paul Moody working on a special Knight for a great year ahead from our pastoral plan. Pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance.

OUR 71st YEAR THEME: Each year, I've invited our Pastoral Staff and faculty to dream for our future year and suggest a theme. This year, in light of the National Eucharistic Renewal/Revival, Roberta Modica suggested "Eucharist is our Light & Life." This coincides with the theme song, "Christ Be Our Light." You will begin to see this focus in our stationary, our music and liturgy planning. Our hope is to encourage more participation in the Eucharistic life of our parish. Bring folks back to Mass with you; enjoy the great music and preaching of the parish and share that with others. Thanks for continuing to sing out like you had when you wore that mask at Mass during the pandemic. You make it so special, and we look forward to reminding one another how the Eucharist is a light that truly brings us life and joy.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR: Thursdays after school in September, rehearsals begin on **September 7 at 3:30-4:30 PM.** We will continue the fine tradition of our youth leading the music at various Masses once a month! We are grateful for SPB's own Michelle Kitko for leading this ministry. Contact Michelle to register and learn the schedule at michelle.kitko@gmail.com.

GREEN KNIGHT TO REMEMBER GALA: We are getting into first gear now for the plans and preparation for our 6th Anniversary Gala that benefits our Catholic School. This year, we are honoring two long-term servants-leaders of our parish community: **Chris Hart and Mary Curtis** (right in the photo). Over the next few months, we will share more about the dedicated service to



our parish that they have done for benefiting our Catholic school. It's a joy to honor them and thank them, so please make plans to be there in person, **Friday, November 10, 2023 – the observation of Veterans' Day at La-Vera Party Center, 6:30 pm.** Next week, you'll see in our financial report how your fundraising dollars erase the deficit in our Catholic school. Without this event, Spring Fling and the many other Ladies Guild and PTO fundraisers, we would have more serious challenges. Everyone works so hard to make SPB great!

NEW INTERIM CATECHETICAL LEADER - BROTHER JAMES OWENS: Our prayers have been answered! For this year, Brother



James Owens, a Norbertine serving outside his abbey in New Mexico, will be leading our catechetical ministries with our regular awesome volunteers. 
