The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

GUIDELINES FOR THE DIOCESE ON GENDER:

(Picture with Bishop Malesic includes our new SSS priest from Vietnam, serving as hospital chaplain at Hillcrest, Fr. JK Nguyen.) A lot of media attention occupied the air waves over the last two weeks about the updated and published "Guidelines for Catholic School Students" and the acceptance of the policy around gender identity. **One policy is clear – and will always be followed here at SPB: WE LOVE**



EVERYONE, no matter what their struggles, their joys, their issues and the challenges. Some of us take a lifetime to figure ourselves out, some a bit sooner; some may need different types of therapy, some may need a bit of extra love. Some may be just fine! SPB will continue to be a place of welcome and acceptance.

I have been privileged as pastor, and so has Evamarie Cross, our Youth Minister and Kindergarten teacher, to have worked together in walking with several families about their sexual orientation and identity questions/concerns and desires. Until you walk with another person, compassionately helping them along, we just never know what they are going through in their lives. The Pastoral Staff and I will continue to accompany anyone who wishes to be in discernment, discussion or guidance. I know you too, will be a loving, caring parish. Yes, I am a male-celibate religious, who is ordained a priest, and most of the world does not understand this reality, or even me for that matter! Yet, I am grateful for the love and acceptance of you as you walk with me in faith and companionship. If you have any further questions about this topic, please do not hesitate to ask me or meet with me in person.

QUIRE CLE: Because of the controversy over the diocesan policy, QUIRE CLE was forced to cancel their concerts at the three Catholic churches of Northeast Ohio **THIS WEEK. NO QUIRE CONCERT ON FRIDAY NIGHT HERE at SPB or the other churches.** We are disappointed that there were threats against QUIRE CLE and our three churches. We pray that folks will focus on Jesus Christ's words of loving one another with mercy and kindness.

RALLY FOR LIFE & VOTING SEASON: Due to the worries we have about people being violent and the social media threats, we will not be having anyone on the sidewalks this year with signs for the "Rally for Life." We will instead be praying in church – the Rosary and other prayers from 1:00-2:00 PM. We also will have the police around watching our property more so that we will not experience any vandalism or violence. We are being cautious and safe, not wanting anyone to be physically hurt. **PLEASE NOTE, we will not be posting signs on our property for this very reason; we do not post any signs these days due to the threats we receive.** Thanks for praying that this election season will be kept free from harm. **NOTE: We do not advocate for any postcards on vehicles in the parking lot.** The police will be patrolling during the Mass and arrest anyone who is vandalizing or placing unwanted materials on folks' personal vehicles. Next week, as Respect Human Life Month begins, I'll share more about this topic.

FOCUS GROUPS ON OBH: Our architect firm that we have selected, studioTECHNE, would like to have some focus groups to ensure that they have the message and are clear on the needs for the renovation of Father O'Brien Hall, Eymard Room and Eymard kitchen. From our feedback, they will develop conceptual designs for our fundraising efforts. They have been hearing from me and the Steering Committee. Now, please place on your calendar an opportunity for **YOU** to come to the beginning of two groups that will host them for the first part of their meeting:

PRAYER TO END THE DEATH PENALTY: We have been asked by our bishops to pray for the end of the death penalty in the state of Ohio. There is bi-partisan support in our statehouse as well.

Our Social Action Commission has notes elsewhere in the bulletin about prayer and involvement. Please pay special notice for this on October 9 & 10.

NEW SAFETY PROTECTION ON OUR WINDOWS: Our Safety Committee and Finance Council made a significant decision for the protection of our glass around the property: we bought a special clear adhesive shield tape for our windows to prevent the windows from immediately shattering and allowing easy entrance into our Family Life Center and Catholic school. Due to the warranty and usefulness of this product, **NO FLYERS/ADS/POSTERS MAY BE TAPED TO WINDOWS ANYMORE – EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.** **Other types of tape will remove the safety adhesive.** Thanks for following this policy and keeping our parish family safe. Yes, there is an odd smell to the product which will dissipate in time.

EYMARD SAFETY WALL: Now that the signs are gone from the west windows of the Eymard Room in the Family Life Center, please note: do not place chairs or tables for setup along the wall of the kitchen door, patio exits and fire panel. **WE NEED ACCESS TO PULL THE PANEL** to leave the building through the patio exit. **PLEASE FOLLOW THIS FIRE SAFETY MANDATE from the FIRE MARSHALL.**

ROARING 20's DRESS & THEME – GREEN KNIGHT TO REMEMBER GALA: Our 6th annual Green Knight to Remember Gala this year is called and themed, "The Green and Gold Gatsby Gala," and the benefits go to our Catholic School, specifically, our next big project: updating our security camera system. Yes, it's 10 years old, and we know what happens to 10-year-old technology. Plus, our current system has only 16 cameras, and we have too many areas where we need more coverage. Our new system increases to 50+ viewing areas and adds every entrance where our students are from Saint Ann Shrine and the Oratory of the Blessed Sacrament to the bus entrance.
