The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

A LETTER FROM FATHER LANE



26th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: We hear in the first reading today a little bit of lamentation about the LORD's ways not being fair. We can also say that it is sad that not all people see how God's ways for human life are not respected – that people are not fair to the unborn, the weak and vulnerable, the refugee, the elderly and those who are dying. Each October, the American church focuses on respecting human life. This

year, we are asked to focus on two spectrums of the human life debate in our country. In our state, we focus on an amendment to our state constitution enshrining abortion rights. Today, we will pray to end abortion (as we regularly do in this parish) through weekday and weekend Mass petition and prayer services through the year that focus on human dignity. We also have our statehouse working on ending the death penalty. While the death penalty has not been implemented for many years, the amount of money spent on either side of the issue is wasteful to taxpayers. It's unconscionable so much has been spent on the ballot initiatives in August and now through the beginning of November. It's not fair that people are using these funds against God and the Body of Christ, nor do folks see God's ways of life.

It comes up many times in the suggestion box over the years that I should speak out on issues, candidates and other items in the news. As pastor, I took an oath to follow the Gospel and preach the lectionary, the catechism or the Eucharist – that's what a homily is. Having taught liturgy, I practice what I preach—what the rites of the church demand of the clergy and allow us as a community to see how the Gospel is applicable for our times. The education classes and formation meetings we host are the times when we get into formal discussions about our Catholic Social Teaching based on Matthew 25. I have been so pleased that our Social Action Commission (SAC) has been the place for such rich discussions, action and direction for helping us live our Catholic Social Teaching and respecting human life. Each meeting focuses, for example, on ending abortion or the issue of our times (i.e., funding for student lunch programs and supplemental funds for groceries).

Over the years of preaching in politically diverse parishes, I have stuck to these principles while some have felt that I betrayed the best of their beliefs. (I don't like to label people colors, red, blue, purple or left or right.) My belief is that in a civic society, with diverse backgrounds, education and cultural experiences, we who go to church are extremely knowledgeable about what it means to be a Catholic. Sadly, society see us for who we are (against abortion, artificial birth control, don't allow LGBTQ+ (yet this is not true!)). For me to stray from the Gospel message is not my role, and we would be preaching to ourselves to folks who are not childbearing anyway. Our society has its moral compass challenged – but not our parish! I am proud of our SAC and Human Life Committee who work tirelessly with you for this



issue. I see each of you working for life issues and applaud the efforts to continue to bring all to the love of God. Keep up the good work, keep running the race with the Gospel, keep holding to the truth; all life is sacred no matter where people are at, what people have done, and where God is leading each person. Our cross is to live in a society, a civil society, or where there are so many views. Our job is to always shed the light of the Gospel of Life. Our Gospel today reminds us to always choose God's good ways. We are called to be authentic witnesses of God's ways.

WHY THE ALERTS AND CAUTION? During the August election, we had folks placing pro/con yard signs on our property, and there were a few scenes of negative behavior (i.e., yelling, pitching trash on our lawn and pushing the pastor). I am being cautious for our people and property as another election cycle is upon us. I want to avoid any further escalation of conflict around the church's teachings on sexuality and human life as we've had verbal and physical threats (This caused the cancellation of the concert). We would feel horrible if anyone was harmed during this time. Hence, due to the threats shared with me by QUIRE CLE and the worries posted on social media about the escalating tension and harm, we will not be having anyone on the sidewalks this year or with signs for the "Rally for Life Chain." Instead, we will be **praying in church:** Rosary and other prayers from 11:30 AM-12:30 PM.

We are being cautious and safe, not wanting anyone to be physically hurt. **PLEASE NOTE, we will not be posting signs on our property for this very reason. The world knows what Catholics believe! For ill or good, they know or have a perception that we are extremely pro-life.** Thanks for praying that this election season will be kept free from harm. **Please also note: we do not advocate for any postcards on vehicles in the parking lot.** The police will be patrolling for such actions during the Mass and arrest anyone who is vandalizing or placing unwanted materials on folks' personal vehicles. Next week, as Respect Human Life Month begins, I'll share more about this topic.

FOCUS GROUPS ON OBH: The architect firm that we have selected, studioTECHNE, would like to have some focus groups to ensure that they have the message and are clear on the needs for the renovation of Father O'Brien Hall and the Eymard Room and kitchen. From our feedback, they will develop conceptual designs for our fundraising efforts. They have been hearing from me and the Steering Committee. PRAYER TO END THE DEATH PENALTY: We have been asked by our bishops to pray for the end of the death penalty in the state of Ohio. There is bi-partisan support in our statehouse as well. Our Social Action Commission has notes elsewhere in the bulletin about prayer and involvement. NEW SAFETY PROTECTION ON OUR WINDOWS: Our Safety Committee and Finance Council made a significant decision for the protection of our glass around the property; we bought a special clear adhesive shield tape for our windows to prevent the windows from immediately shattering and allowing easy entrance into our Family Life Center and Catholic school. Due to the warranty and usefulness of this product, **NO FLYERS/ADS/POSTERS MAY BE TAPED TO WINDOWS ANYMORE – EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.** Other types of tape will remove the safety adhesive. Thanks for following this policy and keeping our parish family safe. Yes, there is an odd smell to the product that will dissipate over time.

EYMARD SAFETY WALL: Now that the signs are gone from the west windows of the Eymard Room in the Family Life Center, please note: **do not place chairs or tables for set up along the wall of the kitchen door, patio exits and fire panel. WE NEED ACCESS TO PULL THE PANEL** and leave the building through the patio exit. **PLEASE FOLLOW THIS FIRE SAFETY MANDATE from the FIRE MARSHAL.**

The lectors will meet at 9:30 AM, for an hour. Communion Ministers will meet at 11:00 AM for an hour. You may have noticed that we have returned to the reception of the Precious Blood and offer it in the inner rim of the sanctuary or the outer rim in front of the statues of our saints. We would like to have these stations filled at ALL the Masses. Furthermore, one does not have to consume the rest of the Precious Blood; certain ministers support this procedure of consumption and many others. 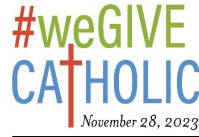

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT ISSUE 1



What is Issue 1?

Issue 1 is a proposed amendment to the Ohio Constitution that would endanger the health and safety of women, threaten parental rights, and allow for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy. Ohioans will vote on November 7, 2023, whether to make this change to the Ohio Constitution.

What would Issue 1 do?

Put women at risk:

- **Health and safety standards in Ohio could be eliminated.** Doctors could no longer need to examine a woman or explain the risks of the abortion procedure ahead of time.

Threaten parental rights:

- **A fifteen-year-old could have an abortion without her parents knowing.** Current Ohio law requires parental notification and consent before a child under 18 can obtain an abortion. These parental right protections could be removed as they directly conflict with the amendment which would allow all individuals, including minors, to make their own reproductive decisions.

Allow for abortions of fully formed babies:

- **Abortion would be legal through all 9 months of pregnancy.** Physicians at an abortion clinic could use a woman's age or emotional well-being as a reason to perform an abortion in the 3rd trimester.

Would abortion be illegal in Ohio if Issue 1 does not pass?

If Issue 1 does not pass, abortion would still be legal in Ohio until a baby's heartbeat can be detected. This standard was challenged in court and placed on hold, allowing for abortions up to 22 weeks as of September 15, 2023. Current laws that protect the safety of women and parental rights would stay in effect.

Doesn't Issue 1 simply restore Ohio back to when Roe v. Wade was in effect?

Issue 1 goes dangerously beyond what was legalized in the Roe v. Wade ruling. It opens the door to remove important health and safety measures that protect women, threatens parental consent and notification of any minor seeking an abortion, and allows for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.

Will miscarriage care or ectopic pregnancy treatment be denied if Issue 1 fails?

The passing or failure of Issue 1 will have no effect on the care a pregnant woman receives when her life is in danger, even if the treatment results in the loss of life of her unborn child. There is a fundamental difference between an elective abortion and the care provided after a miscarriage or for ectopic pregnancies. Women can always receive life-saving treatment, including in Catholic hospitals. No law restricts this care in Ohio or any other state in the country.

How is the Church helping pregnant women in need?

For decades, numerous Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with faith-based and secular organizations, have assisted pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment during pregnancy and after their child is born. Project Rachel helps those struggling post-abortion. Every woman should be able to depend upon a community for support and the Catholic Church remains committed to woman in need.

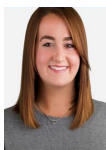
