Our Community @ Prayer ministry continues the tradition of keeping vigil until the Lord Jesus Christ returns in glory. Our prayer extends the blessings of the Mass where we share in the Risen Christ's Body and Blood.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament (a liturgical act) occurs Thursdays from 9:30 am until 8:00 pm with special exposition time throughout the year (i.e., Taizé Eucharistic Holy Hours, Saint Ann Triduum, Saint Peter Julian Eymard Triduum, etc.). See inside the bulletin for details.

The church is always open for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle ("adoration"). Please make a visit to pray, as Saint Peter Julian Eymard would say, the "4-ends" of adoration, forgiveness, thanksgiving and petition. When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

## A LETTER FROM FATHER LANE



28th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Parable in today's Gospel is perplexing and provokes so many questions. Do we put enough effort into who God wants us to be? Are you just here for the food? Why didn't the guest put on the garment given when the guest came into the banquet? Why are you pointedly not participating! These are some questions about us (from

then and now) as we know so many do not come to the banquet that God gives us every day in this parish. The message we interpret in the 21st century: Join in the celebration of God's life for you. With so many people not feeling the need to be part of others' lives, events, or occasions, we are in position to see the great opportunity these Scripture readings give us: an insight that just as God hopes for a greater participation in God's life and world, we too can (and must) be prepared to enjoy the blessings – step out of silence and participate in God's life for us. Psalm 137 has the famous line, "Let my tongue be silenced if I ever forget you." Will we stay silent and stay non-participating in the life God offers us? As faithful stewards of God, more is expected – and then more will be given! These are but a few of the lessons offered by this parable.

We appreciate your participation in the Mass and hope you realize that we really do count on you! We are blessed that our attendance remains steady throughout the year now, with no dip during the summer. Thanks for always keeping the Lord's Day holy by being here to worship with us.

SPECIAL DAY OF PRAYER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT - EXPOSITION AFTERNOON: Our diocese chose several parishes to be host sites of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on this day because of the Eucharistic Revival in our entire nation. Please come on Sunday, October 29, after the 10:30 AM Mass until just before the 6:30 PM Sunday Mass. Come for a half hour, or for a full hour. After the 10:30 AM Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be shown, or exposed, in the monstrance for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Follow the Eymardian way of praying, giving 15 minutes to the 4-ends of sacrifice for the Mass such as adoration, forgiveness and mercy, thanksgiving and petition. There will be Benediction at 6:00 PM before the 6:30 PM Mass. Come deepen your prayer time with God. Again, we were chosen as a special Eucharistic site for this special day of the country.



**ELEVATED STATUS OF SAINT ANN SHRINE:** I am happy to share that in the Oratory of the Blessed Sacrament (the special chapel of the Blessed Sacrament Seminary – now Saint Ann's Shrine too), Bishop Edward Malesic elevated our status to that of a diocesan shrine. **MINISTRY FAIR RETURNS IN FEBRUARY:** I have been edified at so many folks wanting to plan for our Ministry Fair. Based on the evaluations of last year's Ministry Fair, we thought to have it before Lent and bring back the Mardi Gras theme. Mark your calendars for **February 10-11** (since Ash Wednesday is February 14).

**AWAY FOR SSS BUSINESS.** I'll be leaving Thursday for a pastoral visit of our three communities in the state of Hawaii. Then I'll continue to Vietnam and our HQ there for the 36th General Chapter which will be from November 5-26. I'll be returning via Seattle to see my nephew and family there, and I'll be back on campus November 29 in time to begin the new liturgical year.


