When the church is locked, see the pastor for the special parking area and code to enter the church to pray throughout the night in the tradition of nocturnal prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

REFLECTION FROM FR. MIKE ARKINS

What struck me in the readings this weekend was the idea of being chosen by God.

Paul, in the passage of his letter to the Thessalonians, expressed his personal belief that they have been chosen by God. He explains this belief because he sees them as having received the "Good News" as a living source, not just words, or a code of conduct. He saw them as "empowered by the Holy Spirit and full of conviction," trying to live the Good News.

The passage from Isaiah, also, spoke of being "chosen by God." The story brings out that we don't always know it. Cyrus was a pagan king, an enemy of Israel, but God used him to bring "good" out of apparent evil.

In our passage from Matthew's Gospel, we heard a story about the Pharisees and their plotting against Jesus. The Pharisees were the "chosen" spiritual leaders of their day. Yet we heard of their rationalizations interfering with their living out their choosiness. Instead of pointing out Jesus as the Messiah, they attempt to belittle Him in front of their fellow Jews.

We, too, have been chosen by God, even though we probably seldom think about this. We need to remind each other about our "choosiness," and encourage each other to live our lives as works of faith, labor of love, and steadfast of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.






